## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to provide that the agricultural education
- 3 program is based on a three-component model; to provide for a pilot program to develop and
- 4 implement agricultural education in elementary schools; to provide for selection of pilot sites;
- 5 to provide for program requirements; to provide for a program evaluation; to provide for the
- 6 Professional Standards Commission to extend in-field certification for agricultural education
- 7 to include kindergarten through grade five; to provide for related matters; to provide for a
- 8 short title; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

11 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Green Agricultural Education Act."

12 SECTION 2.

- 13 Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 14 "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended by adding new Code sections to Part 3, relating
- 15 to educational programs, to read as follows:
- 16 "<u>20-2-154.2.</u>
- 17 The agricultural education program provided in this state shall be based on the nationally
- 18 recognized three-component model of school based agricultural education: daily instruction
- in an organized classroom and lab environment; hands-on, real-world learning opportunities
- 20 through the supervised agriculture experience (SAE) program; and leadership and learning
- 21 <u>opportunities through participation in the Future Farmers of America. The curriculum for</u>
- 22 the agricultural education program shall include equal portions of each of the three
- 23 components of such model and shall be established by the Department of Education with
- 24 <u>input from agricultural education teachers.</u>

26 (a) The Department of Education, through its Agricultural Education Program, shall be 27 authorized to establish a pilot program, beginning in the 2018-2019 school year, to provide 28 for agricultural education in elementary schools in this state. The purpose of the pilot 29 program shall be to determine whether and how to implement an elementary agricultural 30 education program state wide. 31 (b) The Department of Education, through its Agricultural Education Program, is 32 authorized to select six public elementary schools for participation in the pilot program, with 33 one elementary school in each of the six existing regions established by the agricultural 34 education program of the Department of Education. The local board of education for each 35 elementary school selected to be in the pilot program shall agree to implement an 36 elementary agricultural education program in such school and to continue to provide such 37 elementary agricultural education program after the expiration of the pilot program. The 38 <u>local school system may employ an agricultural education teacher to provide such program</u> 39 for the elementary school. 40 (c) The pilot program shall be based on the nationally recognized three-component model 41 of school based agricultural education: daily instruction in an organized classroom and lab 42 environment; hands-on, real-world learning opportunities through the supervised agriculture 43 experience (SAE) program; and leadership and learning opportunities through participation 44 in the Future Farmers of America. The curriculum for the elementary agricultural education 45 program shall include equal portions of each of the three components of such model. The 46 curriculum for the elementary agricultural education program shall be established by the 47 Department of Education with input from agricultural education teachers. 48 (d) The Department of Education, through its Agricultural Education Program, shall 49 provide for a program evaluation regarding the success and impact of the pilot program 50 upon completion of the third year of the pilot program and shall report the results of such 51 evaluation to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Education and Youth 52 Committee."

**SECTION 3.** 53

54 Said article is further amended in Code Section 20-2-200, relating to regulation of certificated professional personnel by the Professional Standards Commission, by adding a new paragraph 55 56 to subsection (b) to read as follows:

"(6) No later than July 1, 2017, the Professional Standards Commission shall extend 57 58 in-field certification for agricultural education to include kindergarten through grade five."

59 **SECTION 4.**  17 LC 33 6849

60 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law

61 without such approval.

62 SECTION 5.

63 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
