AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state government,
- 2 so as to create the Georgia Commission on African-American History and Culture; to
- 3 provide for duties and objectives; to provide for membership and terms of office; to provide
- 4 for reporting; to provide for funding; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state government, is amended
- 9 by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

10 <u>"CHAPTER 41</u>

- 11 50-41-1.
- 12 (a) There is created the Georgia Commission on African-American History and Culture
- 13 <u>(GCAAHC).</u>
- 14 (b) The GCAAHC shall discover, document, preserve, collect, and promote Georgia's
- 15 African-American heritage with a primary focus on educating the citizens of this state
- about the significance of the African-American experience in Georgia.
- 17 (c)(1) The primary objectives of the GCAAHC shall be to:
- 18 (A) Cultivate, present, interpret, and promote the history and culture of
- 19 <u>African-Americans in the State of Georgia through museum collections, exhibitions,</u>
- 20 <u>commemorations</u>, <u>educational programs</u>, <u>publications</u>, <u>research</u>, <u>and public</u>
- 21 <u>participation;</u>
- 22 (B) Serve as a clearinghouse and authenticator for information and insights about
- 23 <u>African-Americans in Georgia and the nation through collaboration with other public,</u>

24 <u>educational, corporate, and Georgia based institutions on strategies for promoting</u>

- 25 <u>African-American history and culture</u>;
- 26 (C) Discover, preserve, collect, and catalog African-American historical materials and
- 27 <u>artifacts and establish, manage, approve, and coordinate museums and other appropriate</u>
- 28 <u>facilities for the promotion of African-American history and culture; and</u>
- 29 (D) Disseminate and integrate African-American historical and cultural materials into
- 30 the mainstream of Georgia life and education as a method of fostering constructive
- 31 <u>social change through better racial understanding.</u>
- 32 (2) The GCAAHC shall provide technical assistance to institutions and groups with
- 33 <u>similar objectives.</u>
- 34 <u>50-41-2.</u>
- 35 (a) The Georgia Commission on African-American History and Culture shall be composed
- of 20 members.
- 37 (b) Said members shall be appointed as follows:
- 38 <u>(1) On or before August 1, 2020:</u>
- 39 (A) Two members by the Governor, one member by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives, one member by the President of the Senate, and one member by the
- 41 <u>Georgia Legislative Black Caucus shall be appointed to each serve a one-year term;</u>
- 42 (B) Two members by the Governor, one member by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives, one member by the President of the Senate, and one member by the
- 44 Georgia Legislative Black Caucus shall be appointed to each serve a two-year term;
- 45 (C) Two members by the Governor, one member by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives, one member by the President of the Senate, and one member by the
- 47 Georgia Legislative Black Caucus shall be appointed to each serve a three-year term;
- 48 <u>and</u>
- (D) Two members by the Governor, one member by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives, one member by the President of the Senate, and one member by the
- 51 Georgia Legislative Black Caucus shall be appointed to each serve a four-year term.
- 52 (2) Upon the expiration of the individual terms provided for in paragraph (1) of this
- 53 <u>subsection and upon any term expiring thereafter, the respective appointing authorities</u>
- 54 <u>shall appoint successors who shall each serve four-year terms.</u>

- 56 (a) The Governor shall designate one of such appointed members to serve as the
- 57 <u>chairperson of the commission at the Governor's pleasure.</u>

59 (c) A vice chairperson shall be selected by a majority of sitting commission members.

- 60 (d) The commission shall meet on a quarterly basis at different locations within the state,
- 61 particularly in rural areas of this state, interacting with local government officials,
- 62 <u>educational leaders, health care providers, business leaders, civic groups, and all other</u>
- 63 <u>citizens who desire to offer input, so as to enable the commission to exercise fully and</u>
- 64 <u>effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of</u>
- 65 <u>this Code section.</u>
- 66 <u>50-41-4.</u>
- On or before December 31, 2021, the commission shall issue a comprehensive report of
- 68 recommendation for the establishment of the Museum of Georgia African-American
- 69 <u>History and Culture</u>. Such report shall include information on the proposed location of the
- 70 <u>facility and a comprehensive plan for the implementation of fundraising efforts for</u>
- 71 <u>construction and for ongoing support of the facility thereafter.</u>
- 72 <u>50-41-5.</u>
- 73 (a) Legislative members of the commission shall receive the allowances provided for in
- 74 <u>Code Section 28-1-8.</u>
- 75 (b) Each member of the commission who is a state official, other than legislative members,
- shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that specified in
- 377 <u>subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance</u>
- authorized for state employees.
- 79 (c) Citizen members of the commission shall receive a daily expense allowance in an
- amount the same as that specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21, as well as the
- 81 <u>mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state employees.</u>
- 82 (d) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- 83 <u>member of the commission for more than five days during any fiscal year.</u> Funds
- 84 <u>necessary to carry out the provisions of this Code section shall come from appropriated</u>
- 85 <u>funds</u>; provided, however, that funds for the reimbursement of the expenses of state
- 86 <u>officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from funds</u>
- 87 <u>appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies."</u>

88 SECTION 2.

89 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
