## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 nurses, so as to revise certain provisions relating to advanced nursing practice; to provide for
- 3 changes to the roles and definitions of advanced nursing practice and advanced practice
- 4 registered nurses; to provide for renewal of licenses; to revise certain criminal background
- 5 check requirements; to provide that a criminal background check is part of the renewal
- 6 process; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to nurses, is
- amended in Code Section 43-26-3, relating to definitions, by revising paragraphs (1) and
- 11 (1.1) as follows:

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- 12 "(1) 'Advanced nursing practice' means practice by a registered professional nurse who
- meets those educational, practice, certification requirements, or any combination of such
- requirements, as specified by the board and includes certified nurse midwives, <u>certified</u>
- nurse practitioners, certified registered nurse anesthetists, <u>clinical nurse specialists and</u>
- 16 clinical nurse specialists in psychiatric/mental health, and others recognized by the board.
- 17 (1.1) 'Advanced practice registered nurse' means a registered professional nurse licensed 18 under this chapter who is recognized by the board as having met the requirements
- established by the board to engage in advanced nursing practice and who holds a master's
- 20 degree or other graduate degree from an approved nursing education program and
- 21 national board certification in his or her area of specialty, or a person who was recognized
- as an advanced practice registered nurse by the board on or before June 30, 2006. This
- 23 paragraph shall not be construed to require a certified registered nurse anesthetist who
- 24 graduated from an approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior to January 1,
- 25 1999, to hold a master's degree or other graduate degree. 'Advanced practice registered
- 26 <u>nurse' means a registered professional nurse licensed under this chapter who is recognized</u>

27 by the board as having met the requirements established by the board to engage in advanced nursing practice within one of the following roles: certified nurse practitioner, 28 29 certified registered nurse anesthetist, certified nurse-midwife, or clinical nurse specialist, 30 and who functions in a population focus or a person who was recognized as an advanced practice registered nurse by the board on or before June 30, 2006. This paragraph shall 31 32 not be construed to require a certified registered nurse anesthetist who graduated from an 33 approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior to January 1, 1999, to hold a 34 master's degree or other graduate degree."

35 SECTION 2.

- 36 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 37 "<u>43-26-7.1.</u>
- 38 (a) Any applicant who meets the requirements of this Code section shall be eligible for
- 39 <u>licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse.</u>
- 40 (b) An applicant for initial licensure to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse
- 41 <u>shall:</u>
- 42 (1) Submit a completed written application and fee;
- 43 (2) Be currently licensed by the board as a registered professional nurse;
- 44 (3) Have completed an accredited graduate or post-graduate level advanced practice
- 45 registered nursing program in one of the four roles and at least one population focus;
- 46 (4) Be currently certified by a national certifying body recognized by the board in the
- 47 <u>advanced practice registered nursing program role and population focuses appropriate to</u>
- 48 <u>educational preparation;</u>
- 49 (5) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the
- 50 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as
- 51 <u>determined by the board. Application for licensure under this Code section shall</u>
- 52 <u>constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform</u>
- 53 <u>a criminal background check</u>. Each applicant who submits an application to the board
- 54 <u>for licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run</u>
- 55 <u>a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of</u>
- 56 <u>fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the</u>
- 57 performance of such criminal background check; and
- 58 (6) Meet such other criteria as established by the board.
- 59 (c) An applicant for reinstatement who has previously held a valid advanced practice
- 60 <u>registered nurse license in Georgia shall:</u>
- 61 (1) Submit a completed written application and fee;
- 62 (2) Meet continuing competency requirements as established by the board;

63 (3) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the

- 64 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as
- determined by the board. Application for licensure under this Code section shall
- 66 constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform
- 67 <u>a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for</u>
- 68 <u>licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a</u>
- 69 <u>criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of fingerprints.</u>
- The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such
- 71 <u>criminal background check; and</u>
- 72 (4) Meet such other criteria as established by the board.
- 73 (d) This Code section shall not be construed to require a certified registered nurse
- 74 <u>anesthetist who graduated from an approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior</u>
- 75 to January 1, 1999, to hold a master's degree or other graduate degree."

## 76 SECTION 3.

- 77 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-9, relating to biennial
- 78 renewal of licenses, voluntary surrender or failure to renew license, and restoration and
- 79 reissuance of license, as follows:
- 80 "43-26-9.
- 81 (a) Licenses issued under this article shall be renewed biennially according to schedules
- and fees approved by the board.
- 83 (b) A renewed license shall be issued to a registered professional nurse or licensed
- undergraduate nurse who remits the required fee and complies with requirements
- established by the board.
- 86 (b.1)(c) Beginning with the 2016 license renewal cycle, an applicant for license renewal
- 87 <u>as a registered professional</u> under this article shall meet one of the following continuing
- 88 competency requirements during the previous licensure period:
- 89 (1) Completion of 30 continuing education hours by a board approved provider;
- 90 (2) Maintenance of certification or recertification by a national certifying body
- 91 recognized by the board;
- 92 (3) Completion of an accredited academic program of study in nursing or a related field,
- as recognized by the board;
- 94 (4) Verification of competency by a health care facility or entity licensed under
- Chapter 7 of Title 31 or by a physician's office that is part of a health system and at
- least 500 hours practiced as evidenced by employer certification on a form approved by
- 97 the board; or

98 (5) Other activities as prescribed and approved by the board that show competency in the 99 nursing field. 100 Failure to meet the minimum continuing competency requirement for renewal of a license shall be grounds for denial of a renewal application. The board may waive or modify the 101 102 requirements contained in this subsection in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under 103 such other circumstances as the board, in its discretion, deems appropriate. An applicant 104 who is renewing a license for the first time shall not be required to meet the requirements of this subsection until the time of the second renewal if the applicant's initial license 105 106 period is six months or less. (d) Advanced practice registered nurse licenses issued under this article shall be issued to 107 an advanced practice registered nurse who remits the required fee and complies with 108 109 requirements established by the board. (e) The board may require that an applicant for renewal of an unexpired license submit to 110 111 the board, in addition to satisfying any other requirements for license renewal, satisfactory 112 results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the Georgia Crime Information 113 Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application 114 for renewal of a license under this Code section shall constitute express consent and 115 authorization for the board or its representative to perform a criminal background check. 116 Each applicant who submits an application to the board for renewal of licensure agrees to 117 provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal background 118 check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be 119 responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such criminal background 120 check. (c)(f) The voluntary surrender of a license or the failure to renew a license by the end of 121 122 an established penalty period shall have the same effect as a revocation of said license, subject to reinstatement at the discretion of the board. The board may restore and reissue 123 a license and, as a condition thereof, may impose any disciplinary sanction provided by 124 Code Section 43-1-19 or 43-26-11." 125

126 **SECTION 4.** 

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-10, relating to practicing as a registered professional nurse without a license prohibited, as follows:

129 "43-26-10.

130 It shall be a misdemeanor for any person, including any corporation, association, or

individual, to:

132 (1) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse <u>or advanced practice registered</u>
133 <u>nurse</u>, without a valid, current license, except as otherwise permitted under Code Section 43-26-12;
134 (2) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse <u>or advanced practice registered</u>
135 <u>nurse</u> under cover of any diploma, license, or record illegally or fraudulently obtained,
136 signed, or issued;

- (3) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse <u>or advanced practice registered</u> <u>nurse</u> during the time the license is suspended, revoked, surrendered, or administratively revoked for failure to renew:
- revoked for failure to renew;

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- (4) Use any words, abbreviations, figures, letters, title, sign, card, or device implying that such person is a registered professional nurse or advanced practice registered nurse unless such person is duly licensed or recognized by the board so to practice under the provisions of this article;
- (5) Fraudulently furnish a license to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse
   or advanced practice registered nurse;
- (6) Knowingly employ any person to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse
   or advanced practice registered nurse who is not a registered professional nurse or
   advanced practice registered nurse;
- (7) Conduct a nursing education program preparing persons to practice nursing as registered professional nurses <u>or advanced practice registered nurses</u> unless the program has been approved by the board; or
- 152 (8) Knowingly aid or abet any person to violate this article."

153 **SECTION 5.** 

Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 43-26-39, relating to renewal of license, voluntary surrender, application for reinstatement, and temporary permit, by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

"(g) The board may require that an applicant for renewal of an unexpired license submit to the board, in addition to satisfying any other requirements for license renewal, satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application for renewal of a license under this Code section shall constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for renewal of licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such criminal background check."

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
