The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to SB 314:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 nurses, so as to revise certain provisions relating to advanced nursing practice; to provide for
- 3 changes to the roles and definitions of advanced nursing practice and advanced practice
- 4 registered nurses; to provide for licensure and renewal as advanced practice registered
- 5 nurses; to revise certain criminal background check requirements; to provide that it is a
- 6 felony to practice without a license; to provide for related matters; to provide for a contingent
- 7 effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.** 

10 Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to nurses, is

amended in Code Section 43-26-3, relating to definitions, by revising paragraphs (1) and

12 (1.1) as follows:

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"(1) 'Advanced nursing practice' means practice by a registered professional nurse who meets those educational, practice, certification requirements, or any combination of such requirements, as specified by the board and includes certified nurse midwives, certified nurse practitioners, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse specialists and clinical nurse specialists in psychiatric/mental health, and others recognized by the board.

(1.1) 'Advanced practice registered nurse' means a registered professional nurse licensed under this chapter who is recognized by the board as having met the requirements established by the board to engage in advanced nursing practice and who holds a master's degree or other graduate degree from an approved nursing education program and national board certification in his or her area of specialty, or a person who was recognized as an advanced practice registered nurse by the board on or before June 30, 2006. This paragraph shall not be construed to require a certified registered nurse anesthetist who graduated from an approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior to January 1, 1999, to hold a master's degree or other graduate degree: 'Advanced practice registered

nurse' means a registered professional nurse licensed as an advanced practice registered nurse pursuant to Code Section 43-26-7.1 to engage in advanced nursing practice within one of the following roles: certified nurse practitioner, certified registered nurse anesthetist, certified nurse-midwife, or clinical nurse specialist, and who functions in a population focus or a person who was recognized as an advanced practice registered nurse by the board on or before June 30, 2006. This paragraph shall not be construed to require a certified registered nurse anesthetist who graduated from an approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior to January 1, 1999, to hold a master's degree or other graduate degree."

36 SECTION 2.

- 37 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 38 "<u>43-26-7.1.</u>

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- 39 (a) Any applicant who meets the requirements of this Code section shall be eligible for
- 40 <u>licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse.</u>
- 41 (b) An applicant for initial licensure to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse
- 42 shall:
- 43 (1) Submit a completed written application and fee;
- 44 (2) Be currently licensed by the board as a registered professional nurse;
- 45 (3) Have completed an accredited graduate or post-graduate level advanced practice
- 46 registered nursing program in one of the four roles and at least one population focus;

- 54 <u>a criminal background check</u>. Each applicant who submits an application to the board
- for licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run
- 56 <u>a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of</u>
- 57 <u>fingerprints</u>. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the
- 58 performance of such criminal background check; and
- 59 (6) Meet such other criteria as established by the board; provided, however, that the
- board shall provide annual notice to the chairpersons of the House Committee on Health
- and Human Services and the Senate Health and Human Services Committee of any new
- 62 <u>criteria established pursuant to this paragraph and any costs associated with such criteria.</u>

(c) An applicant for reinstatement who has previously held a valid advanced practice
 registered nurse license in Georgia shall:

- (1) Submit a completed written application and fee;
- 66 (2) Meet continuing competency requirements as established by the board;
- 67 (3) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the
- 68 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as
- 69 <u>determined by the board. Application for licensure under this Code section shall</u>
- 70 constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform
- 71 <u>a criminal background check</u>. Each applicant who submits an application to the board
- for licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run
- 73 <u>a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of</u>
- 74 <u>fingerprints</u>. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the
- 75 performance of such criminal background check; and
- 76 (4) Meet such other criteria as established by the board; provided, however, that the
- 577 board shall provide annual notice to the chairpersons of the House Committee on Health
- 78 <u>and Human Services and the Senate Health and Human Services Committee of any new</u>
- 79 <u>criteria established pursuant to this paragraph and any costs associated with such criteria.</u>
- 80 (d) This Code section shall not be construed to require a certified registered nurse
- 81 <u>anesthetist who graduated from an approved nurse anesthetist educational program prior</u>
- 82 to January 1, 1999, to hold a master's degree or other graduate degree."

SECTION 3.

- 84 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-9, relating to biennial
- 85 renewal of licenses, voluntary surrender or failure to renew license, and restoration and
- 86 reissuance of license, as follows:
- 87 "43-26-9.

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- 88 (a) Licenses issued under this article shall be renewed biennially according to schedules
- and fees approved by the board.
- 90 (b) A renewed license shall be issued to a registered professional nurse or licensed
- 91 undergraduate nurse who remits the required fee and complies with requirements
- established by the board.
- 93 (b.1)(c) Beginning with the 2016 license renewal cycle, an applicant for license renewal
- 94 <u>as a registered professional nurse</u> under this article shall meet one of the following
- ontinuing competency requirements during the previous licensure period:
- 96 (1) Completion of 30 continuing education hours by a board approved provider;
- 97 (2) Maintenance of certification or recertification by a national certifying body 98 recognized by the board;

(3) Completion of an accredited academic program of study in nursing or a related field, 99 100 as recognized by the board; 101 (4) Verification of competency by a health care facility or entity licensed under Chapter 7 of Title 31 or by a physician's office that is part of a health system and at 102 least 500 hours practiced as evidenced by employer certification on a form approved by 103 104 the board; or (5) Other activities as prescribed and approved by the board that show competency in the 105 106 nursing field. 107 Failure to meet the minimum continuing competency requirement for renewal of a license shall be grounds for denial of a renewal application. The board may waive or modify the 108 109 requirements contained in this subsection in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under 110 such other circumstances as the board, in its discretion, deems appropriate. An applicant who is renewing a license for the first time shall not be required to meet the requirements 111 of this subsection until the time of the second renewal if the applicant's initial license 112 113 period is six months or less. (d) Advanced practice registered nurse licenses issued under this article shall be issued to 114 an advanced practice registered nurse who remits the required fee and complies with 115 116 requirements established by the board. 117 (e) The board or the division director may require that an applicant for renewal of an 118 unexpired license submit to the board, in addition to satisfying any other requirements for 119 license renewal, satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by 120 the Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as 121 determined by the board. Application for renewal of a license under this Code section shall constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform 122 123 a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for 124 renewal of licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of 125 fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance 126 127 of such criminal background check. (c)(f) The voluntary surrender of a license or the failure to renew a license by the end of 128 an established penalty period shall have the same effect as a revocation of said license, 129 subject to reinstatement at the discretion of the board. The board may restore and reissue 130

a license and, as a condition thereof, may impose any disciplinary sanction provided by

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Code Section 43-1-19 or 43-26-11."

133 **SECTION 4.** 

134 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-10, relating to practicing as

- a registered professional nurse without a license prohibited, as follows:
- 136 "43-26-10.
- 137 It shall be a misdemeanor for any person, including any corporation, association, or
- individual, to:
- (1) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse, without a valid, current license,
- except as otherwise permitted under Code Section 43-26-12;
- 141 (2) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse under cover of any diploma,
- license, or record illegally or fraudulently obtained, signed, or issued;
- 143 (3) Practice nursing as a registered professional nurse during the time the license is
- suspended, revoked, <u>or</u> surrendered<del>, or administratively revoked for failure to renew</del>;
- 145 (4) Use any words, abbreviations, figures, letters, title, sign, card, or device implying that
- such person is a registered professional nurse or advanced practice registered nurse unless
- such person is duly licensed or recognized by the board so to practice under the
- provisions of this article;
- (5) Fraudulently furnish a license to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse;
- 150 (6) Knowingly employ any person to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse
- who is not a registered professional nurse;
- 152 (7) Conduct a nursing education program preparing persons to practice nursing as
- registered professional nurses unless the program has been approved by the board; or
- 154 (8) Knowingly aid or abet any person to violate this article."

155 **SECTION 5.** 

- 156 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 157 "<u>43-26-10.1.</u>
- 158 <u>It shall be a felony for any person, including any corporation, association, or individual, to:</u>
- (1) Practice nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse without a valid, current
- license, except as otherwise permitted under Code Section 43-26-12;
- (2) Practice nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse under cover of any diploma,
- license, or record illegally or fraudulently obtained, signed, or issued;
- 163 (3) Use any words, abbreviations, figures, letters, title, sign, card, or device implying that
- such person is an advanced practice registered nurse unless such person is duly licensed
- or recognized by the board so to practice under the provisions of this article;
- 166 (4) Fraudulently furnish a license to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered
- nurse;

168	(5) Knowingly employ any person to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered
169	nurse who is not an advanced practice registered nurse; or
170	(6) Conduct a nursing education program preparing persons to practice nursing as
171	advanced practice registered nurses unless the program has been approved by the board."
172	SECTION 6.
173	Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 43-26-39, relating to renewal of license,
174	voluntary surrender, application for reinstatement, and temporary permit, by adding a new
175	subsection to read as follows:
176	"(g) The board or the division director may require that an applicant for renewal of an
177	unexpired license submit to the board, in addition to satisfying any other requirements for
178	license renewal, satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by
179	the Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as
180	determined by the board. Application for renewal of a license under this Code section shall
181	constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform
182	a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for
183	renewal of licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to
184	run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of
185	fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance
186	of such criminal background check."
187	SECTION 7.
188	This Act shall become effective only if funds are specifically appropriated for purposes of
189	this Act in an appropriations Act making specific reference to this Act and shall become
190	effective when funds so appropriated become available for expenditure.

191 **SECTION 8.** 

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
