A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 8 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 employment and training of peace officers, so as to prohibit the issuance and renewal of drug
- 3 recognition expert certifications by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training
- 4 Council; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 8 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to employment and
- 8 training of peace officers, is amended in Code Section 35-8-7, relating to the powers and
- 9 duties of the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council, by revising
- 10 paragraph (21) as follows:
- 11 "(21) To develop, adopt, and issue advanced or professional peace officer certificates
- based upon the attainment of specified education, advanced or specialized training, and
- experience as the council may determine, provided that issuance of such certificates is not
- 14 prohibited by this chapter;"
- SECTION 2.
- 16 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 17 "35-8-28.

- (a) For purposes of this Code section, the term 'drug recognition expert certification' means
- 19 <u>accreditation of a peace officer through training and testing in the area of identifying a</u>
- 20 person's impairment due to use of alcohol, marijuana, or one or more controlled substances.
- 21 (b) On and after July 1, 2018, no drug recognition expert certification or similar
- 22 <u>accreditation shall be issued or renewed by the council.</u> Any certification as a drug
- 23 recognition expert issued prior to July 1, 2018, shall be valid until the expiration of such
- 24 certification."
