A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 21-2-540 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 conduct of special primaries and special elections generally, so as to revise provisions 3 relating to dates for certain special elections related to sales and use taxes; to provide for 4 related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 5 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7	SECTION 1.
8	Code Section 21-2-540 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to conduct of
9	special primaries and special elections generally, is amended by revising subsection (c) as
10	follows:
11	"(c)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a special primary or
12	special election to fill a vacancy in a county or municipal office shall be held only on one
13	of the following dates which is at least 29 days after the date of the call for the special
14	election:
15	(A) In odd-numbered years, any such special primary or special election shall only be
16	held on:

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- 17 (i) The third Tuesday in March;
- 18 (ii) The third Tuesday in June;
- 19 (iii) The third Tuesday in September; or
- 20 (iv) The Tuesday after the first Monday in November; and
- (B) In even-numbered years, any such special primary or special election shall only beheld on:
- (i) The third Tuesday in March; provided, however, that in the event that a special
 primary or special election is to be held under this provision in a year in which a
 presidential preference primary is to be held, then any such special primary or special
 election shall be held on the date of and in conjunction with the presidential
 preference primary;
- 28 (ii) The date of the general primary; or
- 29 (iii) The Tuesday after the first Monday in November;
- 30 provided, however, that, in the event that a special primary or special election to fill a 31 federal or state office on a date other than the dates provided in this paragraph has been 32 scheduled and it is possible to hold a special primary or special election to fill a vacancy 33 in a county, municipal, or school board office in conjunction with such special primary 34 or special election to fill a federal or state office, the special primary or special election 35 to fill such county, municipal, or school board office may be held on the date of and in 36 conjunction with such special primary or special election to fill such federal or state 37 office, provided all other provisions of law regarding such primaries and elections are 38 met.
- 39 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a special election to
 40 present a question to the voters shall be held only on one of the following dates which is
 41 at least 29 days after the date of the call for the special election:
- 42 (A) In odd-numbered years, any such special election shall only be held on the third
 43 Tuesday in March or on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November; and

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- 44 (B) In even-numbered years, any such special election shall only be held on:
- 45 (i) The date of and in conjunction with the presidential preference primary if one is46 held that year;
- 47 (ii) The third Tuesday in March; provided, however, that such special election shall
 48 occur prior to July 1, 2024, and present a question to the voters on sales and use taxes
- 49 authorized by Articles 5, 5A, and 5B of Chapter 8 of Title 48;
- 50 (iii)(ii) The date of the general primary; or
- 51 (iv)(iii) The Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
- 52 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no special election shall
- 53 present a question to the voters on sales and use taxes authorized by Articles 2, 2A, 3, 4,
- 54 <u>5, 5A, and 5B of Chapter 8 of Title 48, except on the Tuesday after the first Monday in</u>
- 55 <u>November in even numbered years.</u>
- 56 (3)(4) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to:
- 57 (A) Special elections held pursuant to Chapter 4 of this title, the 'Recall Act of 1989,'
- to recall a public officer or to fill a vacancy in a public office caused by a recallelection; and
- 60 (B) Special primaries or special elections to fill vacancies in federal or state public
 61 offices."
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SECTION 2.

- 63 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024.
- 64 SECTION 3.
- 65 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
