## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1 relating to teachers and other school personnel, so as to establish the School Supplies for 2 3 Teachers Program, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and the availability of 4 other funds for such purpose; to provide for a short title; to require the State Board of 5 Education to establish a program for the Department of Education to allocate funds for 6 eligible teachers to purchase school supplies online; to require the State Board of Education 7 to establish policies, rules, and regulations; to provide for the State School Superintendent, 8 in collaboration with the Department of Administrative Services, to identify one or more 9 authorized software services providers to offer and support a user-friendly online ecommerce 10 platform for teachers to purchase school supplies; to require the Department of Education to 11 establish processes for implementation of the program; to provide for teacher eligibility to 12 participate in the program; to provide for local school systems and public schools to certify 13 teacher eligibility; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters; to repeal 14 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

17	Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
18	teachers and other school personnel, is amended by adding a new part to read as follows:

21	This part shall be known and may be cited as the 'School Supplies for Teachers Act.'

23	As used in this part, the term:
24	(1) 'Authorized ecommerce vendor' means an ecommerce vendor that has been approved
25	by the Department of Education in accordance with policies, rules, and regulations
26	established by the State Board of Education.
27	(2) 'Ecommerce' means a commercial transaction, which may include the transmission
28	of funds or data or both, conducted electronically via the internet.
29	(3) 'Eligible teacher' means a teacher employed in good standing at a public school in

45	(a) The School Supplies for Teachers Program is established to provide financial and
46	technical assistance to teachers who purchase school supplies online as provided in this

48	(b) The requirements of this part shall be subject to appropriation of funds by the General

51	(a) The State Board of Education shall:
52	(1) Establish a program for the Department of Education to allocate funds for eligible
