A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1 of Article 5 of Chapter 9 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to Georgia State Indemnification Fund, so as to provide that death by
- 3 suicide of a public safety officer in certain instances be considered a death in the line of duty
- 4 for purposes of indemnification; to provide clarification for instances of indemnification for
- 5 heart attack, stroke, or vascular rupture; to revise and provide for a definition; to provide for
- 6 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Part 1 of Article 5 of Chapter 9 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 10 relating to Georgia State Indemnification Fund, is amended by revising Code
- 11 Section 45-9-85, relating to payment of indemnification for death or disability, procedure for
- 12 making payments, and appeal, as follows:
- 13 "45-9-85.

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- 14 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 15 (1) 'Nonroutine stressful or strenuous physical activity' means actions that are not
- 16 clerical, administrative, or nonmanual in nature.

17 (2) 'Public safety officer' means a law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency

- medical technician, emergency management rescue specialist, state highway employee,
- or prison guard authorized to indemnification pursuant to Article III, Section VI,
- 20 Paragraph VI, subparagraphs (d), (e), and (g) of the Georgia Constitution.
- 21 (3) 'Work related activity' means, while in the line of on duty:
- 22 (A) Engaging in a situation involving nonroutine stressful or strenuous physical
- activity related to law enforcement, fire suppression, rescue, hazardous material
- response, emergency medical services, prison or jail security, disaster relief, or any
- other emergency response as classified by the commission; or
- 26 (B) Participating in a training exercise involving nonroutine stressful or strenuous
- 27 physical activity.
- 28 (b) Indemnification shall be paid under this article part as follows:
- 29 (1) In the case of a partial permanent disability suffered in the line of duty by a public
- 30 safety officer while in the line of duty, the eligible disabled person may elect to receive
- a payment of \$35,000.00 paid in equal monthly installments for five years or a lump sum
- of such amount reduced to its present value upon the basis of interest calculated at the
- rate of 6 percent per annum;
- 34 (2) In the case of a total permanent disability suffered in the line of duty by a public
- safety officer while in the line of duty, the injured eligible disabled person may elect to
- receive a payment of \$75,000.00 paid in equal monthly installments for five years or a
- 37 lump sum of such amount reduced to its present value upon the basis of interest
- calculated at the rate of 6 percent per annum;
- 39 (3)(A) In the case of death suffered in the line of duty by a public safety officer while
- in the line of duty, payment shall be made to:
- 41 (i) The surviving unremarried spouse;

42 (ii) The surviving children who are under the age of 19 or, if a student enrolled in an institution of postsecondary education at the time of such death, under the age of 24; or

- (iii) Individuals not otherwise provided for under this subparagraph who are the dependents of the spouse or deceased person as shown in the spouse's or deceased person's most recent tax return.
- (B) In the case of organic brain damage suffered in the line of duty by a law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, emergency management specialist, state highway employee, or prison guard by a public safety officer while in the line of duty, payment shall be made to the legal guardian of the organically brain damaged person.
 - (C) The surviving unremarried spouse, dependents, or the legal guardian <u>qualified for indemnification payment pursuant to this paragraph</u> may elect to receive <u>a payment in a lump sum payment</u> of \$150,000.00 paid in equal monthly installments for five years or a lump sum of such amount reduced to its present value upon the basis of interest calculated at the rate of 6 percent per annum; <u>or.</u>
- (c)(1) After the department, or the commission upon review of a denial by the department, determines that a public safety officer has suffered a total permanent disability, a partial permanent disability, organic brain damage, or death in the line of duty, the department shall be authorized to make the appropriate payments as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section.
- 63 (4)(2) The department shall consider a A heart attack, stroke, or vascular rupture suffered 64 by a public safety officer shall be presumed to qualify such public safety officer under 65 this subsection to have occurred while in the line of duty if the heart attack, stroke, or 66 vascular rupture:
- 67 (A) Commenced:

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(i) While such public safety officer was performing work related activity;

69 (ii) While such public safety officer was on duty after performing work related 70 activity; or

- (iii) Not later than 24 hours after performing work related activity; and
- 72 (B) Directly or proximately resulted in the death or partial or permanent disability of 73 the public safety officer, unless competent medical evidence established that the heart 74 attack, stroke, or vascular rupture was not related to the work related activity or was 75 directly or proximately caused by something other than the mere presence of
- 76 cardiovascular disease risk factors.
- 77 (3) The department shall consider the death of a public safety officer caused by suicide
- to have occurred while in the line of duty if the death occurred within 30 days of his or
- her last day on duty.
- 80 (c) After the department, or the commission upon review of a denial by the department,
- 81 determines that a public safety officer has suffered a total permanent disability, a partial
- 82 permanent disability, organic brain damage, or death in the line of duty, the department
- 83 shall be authorized to make the appropriate payments as provided in subsection (b) of this
- 84 Code section.

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- 85 (d) If the department denies a claim, any person seeking benefits pursuant to this part may
- 86 appeal the department's decision to the commission. Any such appeal shall be filed with
- 87 the commission within 60 days of receipt of the department's decision and shall identify
- 88 the errors in the department's decision. Appeals shall be considered by the commission at
- 89 the commission's semiannual meeting as provided in Code Section 45-9-84."

90 **SECTION 2.**

- 91 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 45-9-88, relating to indemnification
- 92 not to be awarded when penal violation, suicide, intentionally self-inflicted injuries, natural
- 93 causes, or performance of certain routine duties caused or contributed to death or disability,
- 94 as follows:

- 95 "45-9-88.
- 96 (a) No indemnification shall be awarded to any person otherwise entitled thereto who
- 97 violates a penal law of this state which violation caused or contributed to the death or
- 98 disability of the officer.
- 99 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article part, no payment shall be authorized
- if death, organic brain damage, total permanent disability, or partial permanent disability
- occurs from suicide, intentionally self-inflicted injuries, natural causes, or the performance
- of routine duties which would not be considered strenuous or dangerous by a reasonable
- person, except as provided for in subsection (b) (c) of Code Section 45-9-85."

SECTION 3.

105 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
