7	2011, p. 3567), is amended by revising Section 2.11 as follows:
8	"SECTION 2.11
9	Terms and qualifications for office.
10	(a) The four members of the city council shall serve for terms of four years and until their
11	respective successors are elected and qualified. The councilmembers who hold Council

elected in 2023; thereafter, councilmembers for Posts 1 and 3 shall serve terms of four years.

Posts 1 and 3 elected in 2020 shall serve for a period of three years until their successors are

16 SECTION 2.

17 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 2.12 as follows:

18 "SECTION 2.12.

- 19 Election of mayor; forfeiture; compensation.
- 20 The mayor shall be elected for and shall serve for a term of four years and until his or her
- 21 successor is elected and qualified. The mayor shall be a qualified elector of this city and

shall have been a resident of the city for one year immediately preceding his or her election.

- 23 The mayor shall continue to reside in this city during the period of his or her service. The
- 24 mayor shall forfeit his or her office on the same grounds and under the same procedure as
- 25 for councilmembers. The compensation of the mayor shall be established in the same
- 26 manner as for councilmembers."

SECTION 3.

28 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 5.11 as follows:

29 "SECTION 5.11.

30 Election of the mayor and city council.

- 31 (a) After the municipal election of 2020, the municipal election shall be held in odd
- 32 numbered years on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November.
- 33 (b) On the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November of 2021 and every four
- years thereafter, the successors to the position of mayor and such two councilmembers who
- 35 hold Council Posts 2 and 4 (the seat currently held by Bob Foreman shall be Post 2; the seat
- 36 currently held by Linda S. Jenkins shall be Post 4) shall be elected and shall serve terms of
- office of four years or until their successors are elected and qualified and shall take office on
- 38 the day of the first meeting in January following their election.
- 39 (c) On the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November of 2020, the successors
- 40 to such two councilmembers who hold Council Posts 1 and 3 (the seat currently held by
- 41 James Gillespie shall be Post 1; the seat currently held by Gene L. Ussery, Jr. shall be Post
- 42 3) shall be elected and shall serve terms of office of three years until their successors are
- elected and qualified in 2023 for a four-year term; thereafter, terms of office shall be for four
- 44 years for Posts 1 and 3, and councilmembers shall take office on the day of the first meeting
- 45 in January following their election."

47 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 5.13 as follows:

48 "SECTION 5.13.

49 Election by majority.

50 The person receiving a majority of the votes cast for any city office shall be elected."

- 52 The mayor and councilmembers in office on the effective date of this Act shall complete the
- 53 terms of office for which they were elected until their respective successors are elected and

54 qualified.

55 **SECTION 6.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
