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The Senate Committee on Science and Technology offered the following substitute to SB 53:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 25 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Georgia Technology Authority, so as to provide such authority with the power and duty to

- 9 Technology Authority, is amended in subsection (a) of Code Section 50-25-4, relating to
- 10 general powers, by revising paragraphs (31) and (32) and adding a new paragraph to read as
- 11 follows:

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- 12 "(31) To coordinate the establishment and administration of one or more programs to
- increase economic, educational, and social opportunities for citizens and businesses
- through the promotion of the deployment of broadband services and other emerging
- 15 communications technologies throughout the state and to exercise any power granted to
- the authority in Chapter 40 of this title; and

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17 (32) To establish and enforce website design, navigation, and accessibility specifications

- and standards that shall apply to all agency websites as provided under Code
- 19 <u>Section 50-25-7.14; and</u>
- 20 (32)(33) To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers conferred by
- 21 this chapter."
- SECTION 2.
- 23 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 24 "50-25-7.14.
- 25 (a) For purposes of this Code section, the term 'agency' means every state agency, board,
- bureau, commission, authority, and department, including such departments headed by
- 27 <u>elected constitutional officers of the state but shall not include any agency within the</u>
- 28 judicial or legislative branch of state government, the Georgia Department of Defense, or
- 29 <u>the University System of Georgia.</u>
- 30 (b) The authority shall coordinate with all agencies to develop website design, navigation,
- and accessibility specifications and standards that shall include, but shall not be limited to:
- 32 (1) Accessibility for individuals with disabilities in accordance with any applicable state
- 33 <u>or federal laws;</u>
- 34 (2) Consistency with applicable state and federal government security protocols;
- 35 (3) Design selections centered around user goals, needs, and behaviors with continual
- data-driven analysis influencing management and development decisions;
- 37 (4) Utilization of technology that creates a more customized digital experience that
- 38 <u>allows users to complete digital transactions in an efficient and accurate manner; and</u>
- 39 (5) Full functionality and usability on common mobile devices."
- 40 **SECTION 3.**
- 41 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
