A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state
- 2 flag, seal, and other symbols, so as to provide for placement of a monument to honor Coretta
- 3 Scott King; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
- 4 SECTION 1.
- 5 WHEREAS, Coretta Scott King spent her life as an architect of global social change. She
- 6 devoted herself to advocating peace and opposition to the Vietnam War, recognizing Ghana's
- 7 historic independence from France, strategizing the American Civil Rights Movement,
- 8 working to dismantle Apartheid in South Africa, and serving as a diplomat in United
- 9 States-Russian relations during the Reagan-Gorbachev era; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Coretta Scott King was a daughter of Georgia and dedicated her life to equity
- 11 and opportunity across the state and abroad; and
- 12 WHEREAS, it is only fitting that Coretta Scott King be recognized for her pioneering work.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

14 SECTION 2.

15 Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state flag, seal, and other symbols, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

17 "ARTICLE 8

- 18 50-3-130.
- 19 (a) There shall be placed upon the capitol grounds of the state capitol building or in
- 20 <u>another prominent place a monument in honor of Coretta Scott King, international</u>
- 21 <u>humanitarian, architect of the American Civil Rights Movement, and global peacekeeper,</u>
- subject to the availability of private funds for such purpose.
- 23 (b) Unless public safety concerns warrant postponement, such monument shall be procured
- 24 and placed as soon as practicable."
- 25 SECTION 3.
- 26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
