- 3 (Ga. L. 1999, p. 4710), so as to change the compensation of the solicitor-general of the State
- 4 Court of Chattooga County; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to
- 5 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 9 (Ga. L. 1983, p. 4570), as amended, particularly by an Act approved April 16, 1999
- 10 (Ga. L. 1999, p. 4710), is amended by revising subsections (d) and (e) of Section 13 as
- 11 follows:

- 12 "(d) The solicitor-general shall be paid an annual salary equal to 85 percent of the salary
- of the state court judge, not including any local supplements, and shall receive all legally
- required benefits. Such salary shall be payable out of the funds of Chattooga County at the
- same intervals as installments are paid to other county employees.

(e)(1) The solicitor-general shall be authorized to employ a full-time administrative assistant and fix the compensation of such administrative assistant in an amount not less than \$8,400.00 nor more than \$14,000.00 per annum. The compensation of the administrative assistant shall be paid in equal monthly installments from the funds of Chattooga County.

(2) The salary provided in subsection (d) of this section shall be increased by multiplying said salary by the amount which equals 5 percent times the number of completed terms of office served by any state court solicitor-general where such terms have been

completed after December 31, 1985, effective the first day of January following the

completion of each such period of service."
