A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to education, so as to 2 allow eligible students participating in the Dual Enrollment program to access HOPE career 3 grant funds for certain CTAE courses irrespective of whether they have reached maximum 4 credit hour caps; to provide for the Georgia Student Finance Commission to collect and 5 report certain data; to require the Georgia Student Finance Commission and the State Board 6 of the Technical College System of Georgia to establish rules and regulations; to require the 7 Technical College System of Georgia to develop new and prioritize implementation of 8 existing programs of study related to high-demand fields; to require the State Board of the 9 Technical College System of Georgia to annually publish the HOPE Career Grant Programs 10 of Study List; to allow certain students working to receive a high school diploma to receive 11 HOPE grant funds; to revise qualifications for HOPE grant funds; to make conforming 12 changes; to provide for an effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting 13 laws; and for other purposes.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 16 Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to education, is amended in Part
- 17 4 of Article 6 of Chapter 2, relating to financing under the "Quality Basic Education Act,"
- 18 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 19 "<u>20-2-161.4.</u>
- 20 (a)(1) Beginning July 1, 2023, each student participating in the Dual Enrollment program
- 21 provided for in Code Section 20-2-161.3 shall be allowed to access HOPE career grant
- 22 <u>funds for eligible CTAE courses, as defined in Code Section 20-2-161.3, which are part</u>
- of the HOPE Career Grant Programs of Study List provided for in subsection (b) of this
- 24 Code section irrespective of whether such student has reached any maximum credit hour
- 25 <u>cap provided for in Code Section 20-2-161.3.</u>
- 26 (2) For three years beginning on July 1, 2023, the Georgia Student Finance Commission
- 27 <u>shall collect and report data on:</u>
- 28 (A) Student enrollment in and completion of programs of study included on the HOPE
- 29 Career Grant Programs of Study List provided for in subsection (b) of this Code
- 30 section;
- 31 (B) Student enrollment in and completion of at least one eligible CTAE course, as
- defined in Code Section 20-2-161.3, as part of the Dual Enrollment program provided
- 33 for in Code Section 20-2-161.3;
- 34 (C) HOPE career grant funding, including, but not limited to, the number of students
- who received such funding and the maximum, mean, median, and mode amounts of
- such funding received by students;
- 37 (D) The number of students who enrolled in a postsecondary degree program after
- completing a program of study included on the HOPE Career Grant Programs of Study
- List provided for in subsection (b) of this Code section; and

40 (E) The number of students employed in a high-demand field after completing a 41 program of study included on the HOPE Career Grant Programs of Study List provided 42 for in subsection (b) of this Code section. 43 No later than January 1 each year, the Georgia Student Finance Commission shall provide 44 an interim report to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the director of the Office of Planning and Budget, and the chairpersons of the House Committee on Education, the 45 46 Senate Education and Youth Committee, the House Committee on Higher Education, and 47 the Senate Higher Education Committee. A final report shall be provided to the same no 48 later than September 1, 2026. 49 (3) The Georgia Student Finance Commission, in consultation with the State Board of 50 Education, the State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia, and the Board 51 of Regents of the University System of Georgia, shall establish rules and regulations to 52 implement the provisions of this subsection. 53 (b)(1) The Technical College System of Georgia shall develop new and prioritize 54 implementation of existing programs of study that qualify students to work in 55 high-demand fields. 56 (2) No later than September 1, 2023, and by January 15 each year thereafter, the State 57 Board of the Technical College System of Georgia shall publish and provide to the State 58 Board of Education and to the Georgia Student Finance Commission a comprehensive 59 list of technical college certificates of credit and technical college diplomas that qualify 60 students to work in high-demand fields. Such list shall be known as the 'HOPE Career 61 Grant Programs of Study List.' 62 (3) The State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia shall establish rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this subsection." 63

SECTION 2.

65 Said title is further amended in Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3, relating to HOPE

- scholarships and grants, by revising subsection (a.1) of Code Section 20-3-519.5, relating to
- 67 eligibility requirements for a HOPE grant and award amount, as follows:
- 68 "(a.1) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this Code section, a student seeking an associate
- degree at a branch unit of the Technical College System of Georgia who has received or
- 70 <u>is working to receive</u> a high school diploma pursuant to Code Section 20-2-149.2 through
- 71 completion of:
- 72 (1) A technical college diploma program and all postsecondary academic education and
- 73 technical education and training prerequisites for any state, national, or industry
- occupational certifications or licenses required to work in the field; or
- 75 (2) At least two technical college certificate of credit programs in one specific career
- pathway and all postsecondary academic education and technical education and training
- prerequisites for any state, national, or industry occupational certifications or licenses
- 78 required to work in the field as determined by the Technical College System of Georgia
- shall be eligible for a HOPE grant as long as he or she meets the residency requirements
- set forth in subsection (a) of Code Section 20-3-519.1 and the requirements of paragraphs
- 81 (1) and paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of this Code section. The HOPE grant shall be used
- 82 to cover the cost of up to 30 degree hours to obtain an associate degree."

83 SECTION 3.

84 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2023.

85 SECTION 4.

86 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
