## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the members of the Georgia Congressional delegation to cosponsor and press for
- 2 passage of the Prevent All Soring Tactics (PAST) Act and to encourage the United States
- 3 Department of Agriculture to finalize its proposed Horse Protection Act rule in the form it
- 4 was announced by the Department and displayed in the Federal Register in January, 2017;
- 5 and for other purposes.
- 6 WHEREAS, the soring of horses is cruel and inhumane; and
- 7 WHEREAS, horses shown or exhibited which are sore, where such soreness improves the
- 8 performance of such horse, compete unfairly with horses which are not sore; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the movement, showing, exhibition, or sale of sore horses in intrastate
- 10 commerce and soring horses for such purposes adversely affects and burdens interstate and
- 11 foreign commerce in many ways, including by creating unfair competition, by deceiving the
- 12 spectating public and horse buyers, and by negatively impacting horse sales and breeding
- 13 fees; and
- 14 WHEREAS, all horses which are subject to regulation under the federal Horse Protection Act
- are either in interstate or foreign commerce or substantially affect such commerce; and
- 16 WHEREAS, regulation under the Horse Protection Act by the United States Secretary of
- 17 Agriculture is appropriate to prevent and eliminate burdens upon commerce and to
- 18 effectively regulate commerce; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the Inspector General of the United States Department of Agriculture has
- 20 determined that the program through which the Secretary inspects horses under the federal
- 21 Horse Protection Act is inadequate for preventing soring; and

22 WHEREAS, historically, Tennessee Walking Horses, Racking Horses, and Spotted Saddle

- 23 Horses have been subjected to soring; and
- 24 WHEREAS, despite federal regulations in effect related to inspection for purposes of
- 25 ensuring that horses are not sore, violations of the Horse Protection Act continue to be
- 26 prevalent in the Tennessee Walking Horse, Racking Horse, and Spotted Saddle Horse breeds.
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body:
- 28 (1) Urge the members of the Georgia Congressional delegation to cosponsor and urge
- 29 the United States House and Senate leadership to bring the Prevent All Soring Tactics
- Act to the floor for a vote by each chamber.
- 31 (2) Urge the members of the Georgia Congressional delegation to encourage the United
- 32 States Department of Agriculture to publish its proposed Horse Protection Act rule as it
- was announced on January 13, 2017, and finalized and displayed in advance public notice
- in the Federal Register on January 19, 2017.
- 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 36 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the members of the
- 37 Georgia Congressional delegation, to the sponsors of the Prevent All Soring Tactics Act, and
- 38 to the United States Secretary of Agriculture.
