## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the inaugural of the William Alfred Fountain High School Reunion Breakfast;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, William Alfred Fountain High School, located in Forest Park, Georgia, was the
- 4 product of the consolidation movement in Clayton County and had a unique beginning in that
- 5 it housed grades 1 through 12 with an enrollment of approximately 1,200 students; and
- 6 WHEREAS, realizing the great need for improvement in education, Mr. J.A. Garner,
- 7 chairperson of the Clayton County Board of Education; Mr. Ware C. Callaway,
- 8 superintendent of schools in Clayton County; Mrs. Roberta T. Smith, principal of Jonesboro
- 9 Consolidated High School; and Mrs. Susie Perkins, principal of Forest Chapel Elementary
- 10 School, worked untiringly to survey the county's educational facilities; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the late Bishop William Alfred Fountain of the African Methodist Episcopal
- 12 Church generously sold the tract of land where the new school was built to the Clayton
- 13 County Board of Education, and thus the new school was named the William Alfred
- 14 Fountain High School; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Bishop Fountain was a great educator, statesman, theologian, philanthropist,
- and world leader who served several Episcopal Dioceses from America to Africa with pride,
- 17 distinction, and honor, also delivering one of the first major addresses at the school before
- 18 his death in 1955; and
- 19 WHEREAS, over a period of many successful years of operation, the school progressed,
- 20 enrollment increased, staff increased, the curriculum was made more extensive and varied,
- 21 and the school excelled in sports, drama, and music; and
- WHEREAS, the last high school class graduated in 1969, and today Fountain stands as an
