The House Committee on Ways and Means offers the following substitute to SR 214:

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Joint Study Committee on Service Delivery Strategy; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, the service delivery strategy (SDS) is an important local government service

3 allocation mechanism for counties and cities; and

4 WHEREAS, SDS agreements require periodic renegotiations; and

5 WHEREAS, these renegotiations are often contentious and pit counties and cities against one
6 another, which is harmful to their residents; and

WHEREAS, these difficulties are frequently documented in the media, providing evidenceof the disagreement between counties and cities; and

9 WHEREAS, dozens of counties and cities went to mediation during the 2022 renegotiations
10 in an effort to resolve their differences; and

WHEREAS, revisions are needed to address SDS and those funding options intrinsically
associated with SDS which require negotiations between local governments to help resolve
these issues when counties and cities are at an impasse; and

- 15 provide additional guidance to local governments on how to resolve SDS disputes in the

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF18 GEORGIA:

(1) Creation of joint study committee. There is created the Joint Study Committee onService Delivery Strategy.

- 21 (2) Members and officers.
- 22 (A) The committee shall be composed of ten members.
- 23 (B) The President of the Senate shall appoint:
- (i) Three members of the Senate, which shall include the chairperson of the Senate
 State and Local Governmental Operations Committee, and shall designate one such
 member as cochairperson of the committee;
- 27 (ii) A serving county commissioner from a county currently levying a local option
 28 sales tax (LOST); and
- 29 (iii) A mayor of a city within a county currently levying a LOST.

30 (C) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:

- (i) Three members of the House of Representatives, which shall include the
 chairperson of the House Committee on Governmental Affairs, and shall designate one
 such member as cochairperson of the committee;
- 34 (ii) A serving county commissioner from a county currently levying a LOST; and
- 35 (iii) A mayor of a city within a county currently levying a LOST.

36 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,

- 37 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- 38 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

39 (4) Meetings. The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee. The
40 committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem
41 necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform
42 its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

(5) Committee assistance. Officials and staff of the Association County Commissioners
of Georgia and the Georgia Municipal Association, as well as affected local government
officials and staff, are requested and encouraged to assist the committee in performing its
duties and accomplishing the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

47 (6) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

(A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for
in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
or state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee, but
they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties
as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in
their capacities as state officials or employees.

(C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state employees
shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that specified in
subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, as
well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state employees.

(D) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the Senate and the House of Representatives; except that funds for the reimbursement of the expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

66 (7) **Report.**

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file a report of the
same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
 proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
 of this paragraph.
- 74 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of75 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the cochairpersons of the committee and filed
 with the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 78 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the cochairpersons may file with the Secretary
- of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives copies of the minutes of themeetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 81 (8) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
