A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Judge L. Gale Buckner upon the occasion of her retirement from state
- 2 government; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Judge L. Gale Buckner, appointed Commissioner of the Department of
- 4 Juvenile Justice (DJJ) by Governor Nathan Deal and confirmed by the Board of Juvenile
- 5 Justice, is a native Georgian; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Judge Buckner graduated from Georgia State University with her Bachelor of
- 7 Science in Urban Life in 1981, and she received her Master of Public Administration from
- 8 Brenau University in 1987; and
- 9 WHEREAS, she is a 1992 graduate of the FBI National Academy's 169th Session and was
- 10 a delegate to Israel in 2003 for the Georgia International Law Enforcement Exchange
- 11 program; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Judge Buckner was appointed as Commissioner of the DJJ in November, 2011,
- where she oversaw the day-to-day operations of the multifaceted agency that serves this
- state's youthful offenders up to the age of 21; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Judge Buckner was appointed Executive Director of the Governor's Criminal
- 16 Justice Coordinating Council by former Governor Roy Barnes in July, 2000, and she served
- in this position until her appointment to the State Board of Pardons and Paroles in January,
- 18 2005; and
- 19 WHEREAS, she had a lengthy career with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation starting in
- 20 1981, in which she served as Assistant Special Agent-in-Charge of the Atlanta field office
- 21 for multiple criminal activities, Director of Personnel, and Director of Legislative and
- 22 Intergovernmental Affairs, where she served as liaison to the General Assembly of Georgia

- 25 WHEREAS, Judge Buckner retired from DJJ in November, 2012, to assume the post of
- 26 Chief Magistrate Judge in Murray County in the part of the state where she began her law
- 27 enforcement career at the Chatsworth Police Department in 1978; and
- 28 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the innumerable hours that this dedicated
- 29 individual has spent serving the citizens of this state through state government be recognized.
- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 31 commend Judge L. Gale Buckner for the incredible legacy of service and progress that she
- 32 leaves behind upon the grand occasion of her retirement from state government and wish her
- 33 health and happiness in the future.
