A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Joint Study Committee on Minority Business Participation in State Contracts;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this state to provide minority business owners equal
- 4 opportunity to participate in all aspects of the state's contracting and purchasing programs,
- 5 including but not limited to participation in procurement contracts for materials, supplies,
- 6 services, equipment, and construction; and
- 7 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this state, its boards, departments, commissions, authorities,
- 8 and other agencies, with the assistance of minority groups and agencies, to actively
- 9 encourage qualified minority business enterprises and to offer them the opportunity to
- 10 participate in the state's contracting and purchasing programs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, a study is needed to research and evaluate the procurement and contracting
- 12 policies, practices, and goals of state departments, boards, commissions, authorities, and
- other agencies with regard to minority business participation in state issued contracts; and
- 14 WHEREAS, a study is needed to evaluate whether state departments, boards, commissions,
- authorities, and other agencies are acting cooperatively and in good faith to do all things
- 16 legal, proper, and reasonable to encourage and achieve maximum minority business
- 17 participation in the state procurement system.
- 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 GEORGIA:
- 20 (1) **Creation of joint study committee.** There is created the Joint Study Committee on
- 21 Minority Business Participation in State Contracts.
- 22 (2) Members and officers.
- 23 (A) The committee shall be composed of 12 members.

(B) The President of the Senate shall appoint six members of the Senate as members of the committee, at least two of which shall be members of the minority caucus, and shall designate one of such members as cochairperson.

- (C) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint six members of the House of Representatives as members of the committee, at least two of which shall be members of the minority caucus, and shall designate one of such members as cochairperson.
- 31 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 34 (4) **Meetings.** The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

(5) Allowances and funding.

- (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
 - (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the Senate and House of Representatives.

- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 53 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 54 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the cochairpersons of the committee and filed with the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 57 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the cochairpersons may file with the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives copies of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
 - (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2017.
