A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the festival of Navroz as well as the Shia Ismaili Muslim community residing
 in and contributing to the State of Georgia; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, March 21, 2023, marks the festival of Navroz, which is the beginning of a new
year and the first day of spring and is celebrated by diverse cultures and communities in
Georgia and around the world, including Shia Ismaili Muslims; and

6 WHEREAS, tracing its origins to ancient Persia, this festival of Navroz signifies a time of
7 spiritual renewal and physical rejuvenation as well as a spirit of gratitude for blessings and
8 an outlook of hope and optimism; and

9 WHEREAS, Ismaili Muslims make up a culturally diverse and global community of
10 approximately 15 million individuals who adhere to a 1,400-year tradition of Shia Ismaili
11 Muslim values led by His Highness the Aga Khan, the living Imam or spiritual leader; and

WHEREAS, the Ismaili community has been deeply engaged with the Aga Khan Development Network over the last 60 years, working to alleviate poverty, improve living conditions, and create opportunities for people around the world and at home in Georgia through the fields of health, education, art, culture, rural development, and the promotion of

WHEREAS, under the Aga Khan Development Network, the Aga Khan Award for Architecture recently completed its 45th anniversary as an international triennial award recognizing architecture, planning practices, historic preservation, and landscape projects that set new standards of excellence with an emphasis on local communities, culture, and the environment, thereby successfully addressing the needs and aspirations of societies across the world in which Muslims have a significant presence; and

WHEREAS, the Ismaili community contributes to Georgia's success through knowledge
 sharing, commercial activity, civic engagement, environmental stewardship, and voluntary
 service; and

WHEREAS, Ismaili CIVIC is the voluntary service organization for the Ismaili community, exemplifying Islam's core values of service, peace, compassion, and care for the vulnerable with service through memorandums of understanding and partnerships with local organizations, including The American Red Cross of Georgia, the Atlanta Community Food Bank, and Hands on Atlanta, as well as interfaith groups including Interfaith Atlanta and Georgia Interfaith Power & Light.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that members of its body
recognize and commend the Shia Ismaili Muslim community for their contributions to the
State of Georgia and celebrate Navroz on March 21, 2023.
