A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing March 2023 as National Credit Education Month and commend those
2 organizations that focus on financial literacy education such as The Urban League of Greater

5 WHEREAS, annually, National Credit Education Month promotes education about financial
6 literacy topics such as credit and the significance of good credit management; and

7 WHEREAS, National Credit Education Month encourages pioneers in credit restoration and
8 education as well as banks, businesses, and groups to provide opportunities for people to
9 enhance their financial skills and the information and tools needed to obtain a high credit
10 score; and

11 WHEREAS, during the month, groups that provide educational resources offer services
12 including workshops, webinars, and seminars to help consumers learn about budgeting,
13 saving, debt management, credit scores, and credit reports; and

14 WHEREAS, National Credit Education Month reminds consumers to examine their credit
15 reports for errors or inaccuracies and helps individuals have access to higher loan acceptance
16 and qualifications; and

17 WHEREAS, during this month, individuals are encouraged to take steps to learn more about
18 handling credit and creating good financial habits that will ensure an excellent credit report.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
20 recognize March 2023 as National Credit Education Month and commend the many
