A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending Turner Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church on the
- 2 occasion of its 150th anniversary; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Turner Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church's congregation began with
- 4 no name and had its first religious meeting in 1853, shortly after the settlement of Marietta;
- 5 during this time, a group of 37 African Americans met for prayer and worship in a log cabin
- 6 on Task Street near an abandoned Coca-Cola battery plant and tobacco cigar factory; and
- 7 WHEREAS, in 1839, the Presbyterian Church on the corner of Waddell and Lawrence
- 8 Streets in downtown Marietta vacated its building and offered it to Turner AME Chapel's
- 9 congregation, which was referred to as "Trinity Church for Negroes and Indians" at that time;
- during that time, the church operated under the direction of First United Methodist Church,
- which supplied its pastors until 1865; during the Civil War, it was also used as a hospital for
- 12 the Union soldiers; and
- 13 WHEREAS, upon Henry McNeal Turner's arrival in Marietta in 1865, he saw former slaves
- 14 worshiping without ministerial leadership, so he organized the church under the AME
- 15 Church and became Trinity's first Negro pastor; and
- 16 WHEREAS, on July 6, 1867, the trustees of the First Methodist Church transferred the
- 17 property deed to the trustees of Trinity African Methodist Episcopal Church, and in 1891,
- 18 the church was rebuilt and the name was changed to Turner Chapel in honor of Bishop Henry
- 19 McNeal Turner; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Turner Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church was forced to relocate as
- 21 a result of urban renewal and revitalization efforts in downtown Marietta; the property on
- 22 Lawrence Street was purchased from the City of Marietta on December 6, 1971, and a
- contract to begin work was issued on September 12, 1972; and

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24 WHEREAS, the first services at the new location were held on March 3, 1975, under the

- 25 administration of Reverend H.H. Kenner; and
- 26 WHEREAS, in 1988, a new wing was added to include a pastor's study, choir room,
- 27 classrooms, library/conference room, communion room, and storage space, as the church
- 28 grew to have several new ministries and a membership of more than 400 individuals; and
- 29 WHEREAS, in June, 1988, Reverend Kenneth Marcus became the pastor of Turner Chapel,
- 30 and he and his wife, Reverend Cassandra Marcus, grew the church's staff, resources, and
- 31 membership to 482 people; they also purchased land for the new Turner Chapel site; and
- 32 WHEREAS, in 1993, Pastor Marcus agreed to include a new sanctuary, multipurpose center,
- 33 educational facility, activity center, and childcare facilities; and
- 34 WHEREAS, in January, 1996, the Church Expansion Committee addressed the needs for
- more worship space and began services in Wheeler High School's 450-seat gymnasium; and
- 36 WHEREAS, on July 18, 1999, Turner Chapel opened the new Turner Chapel Recreation
- 37 Center and let it serve as a "temporary home" to more than 4,000 members while a new
- 38 sanctuary was under construction; and
- 39 WHEREAS, on March 20, 2005, members and friends from as far as Port-au-Prince,
- 40 Trinidad, and New York City entered the brand new Cathedral of Turner Chapel African
- 41 Methodist Episcopal Church; and
- 42 WHEREAS, since its 1865 inception, Turner Chapel has had 51 pastors, three of whom were
- 43 elected to Bishopric: Henry McNeal Turner, William A. Fountain, Sr., and Harold I.
- 44 Bearden; and
- 45 WHEREAS, Henry McNeal Turner served as Morris Brown College's First President, and
- 46 Bishop William A. Fountain, Sr., and Reverend William A. Fountain, Jr., both served as
- 47 Presidents of Morris Brown College. In addition, a number of former pastors, including Dr.
- 48 D.W. Wiggs, Dr. J.S. Downs, Dr. J.R. Hurley, Dr. D.S. Saunders, and Dr. A.J. Harris, have
- 49 served as Presiding Elders; and
- 50 WHEREAS, since 1865, Turner Chapel has grown to have more than 6,000 members, 100
- 51 ministries, and 46 parcels of land.

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52 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that members of this body

- 53 recognize March 15, 2015, as the 150th anniversary of Turner Chapel African Methodist
- 54 Episcopal Church and commend its dedicated efforts to its congregation and the community
- of Marietta.
- 56 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 57 to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to Turner Chapel
- 58 African Methodist Episcopal Church.
