## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Artificial Intelligence; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, artificial intelligence ("AI"), the development of computer systems to perform
- 3 tasks that normally require human intelligence, such as learning and decision-making, has
- 4 the potential to spur innovation and transform industry and government; and
- 5 WHEREAS, as the science and technology of AI continue to develop, more products and
- 6 services are utilizing AI in fields such as healthcare, financial services, education, housing,
- 7 and transportation. Such utilization may ultimately displace certain jobs and fields of
- 8 employment; and
- 9 WHEREAS, there are valid concerns about potential misuse or unintended consequences of
- AI, especially without the development and implementation of ethical standards that seek to
- 11 preserve the dignity, autonomy, and self-determination of individuals; and
- WHEREAS, in the 2023 legislative session, at least 25 states, Puerto Rico, and the District
- 13 of Columbia introduced AI bills, and 18 states and Puerto Rico adopted resolutions or
- 14 enacted legislation in this area; and

15 WHEREAS, it is important that this state establish policies and procedures concerning the

- development, procurement, implementation, utilization, and ongoing assessment of systems
- 17 that employ AI and are in use by state agencies; and
- 18 WHEREAS, promoting responsible innovation, competition, and collaboration in public and
- 19 private sectors will allow Georgia to be a leader in ensuring that such technology will
- 20 advance in a way that enforces the existing consumer protection laws and principles for its
- 21 citizens, while enacting any additional appropriate safeguards against, fraud, unintended bias,
- 22 discrimination, infringements on privacy, and other potential harms from AI; and
- 23 WHEREAS, it is in best interest of this state and its citizens to examine AI technologies and
- 24 their current and future use in this state.
- 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
- 26 (1) Creation of Senate study committee. There is created the Senate Study Committee
- on Artificial Intelligence.
- 28 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of seven members to be
- appointed by the President of the Senate as follows:
- 30 (A) Four members of the Senate;
- 31 (B) An instructor at an institution of higher education who has expert knowledge of and
- 32 experience with AI technology;
- 33 (C) An attorney with expert knowledge of and experience with federal and state laws
- 34 concerning AI; and
- 35 (D) A business professional with expert knowledge of and experience with AI
- technologies and products.
- 37 The President of the Senate shall designate a legislative member of the committee as
- 38 chairperson of the committee.

39 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,

- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- 41 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 42 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
  - (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.
- 47 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided 48 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 49 (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
- (B) Members of the committee who are state officially, other than regionality members,

or who are state employees shall receive no compensation for their service on the

- 51 committee, but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the
- 52 performance of their duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they
- are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.
- 54 (C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state
- employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that
- specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state
- 58 employees.

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- 59 (D) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than 12 days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the Senate; except that funds for the reimbursement of expenses of state
- officials, other than legislative members, and for the reimbursement of expenses of state
- employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their
- respective agencies.

- 66 (6) **Report.**
- 67 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 71 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of
- this paragraph.
- 74 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 77 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 78 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary of
- 79 the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 80 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
