

Senate Resolution 534

A RESOLUTION

1 Commemorating the centennial anniversary of the City of Cobbtown, Georgia; and for other
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Cobbtown area was known as Quince, named after the post office in the
4 area; and

5 WHEREAS, in 1905 the General Assembly issued a charter to the Town of Cobbtown; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1919 the charter for the Town of Cobbtown was repealed and a new charter
7 for the City of Cobbtown was issued by the General Assembly; and

8 WHEREAS, transformational events and factors helped shape the prosperity of the city over
9 the past century and established a community known for its spirit of togetherness and for
10 pulling together to accomplish its goals; and

11 WHEREAS, Cobbtown is renowned for its tremendous array of Christmas lights and
12 displays along the entire length of the community, along the old rail right of way and a
13 Christmas parade is held each year in December, the largest Christmas parade in the area;
14 and

15 WHEREAS, the city's first 100 years are remembered and revered, positioning it for its
16 second century of growth, success, and pride.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
18 join the City of Cobbtown in commemorating its centennial anniversary.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
20 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the City of
21 Cobbtown.
