A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending first responders and recognizing February, 2018, as American Heart Month in
- 2 Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, great advances in heart health have occurred in the State of Georgia, but still
- 4 more work must be done to eliminate heart disease, which causes more than 700,000
- 5 Americans to suffer a heart attack each year; and
- 6 WHEREAS, public awareness of health issues such as health disease should be increased so
- 7 that Georgians may take preventative actions ensuring their longevity; and
- 8 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease affects more than 92 million Americans nation wide, and
- 9 heart disease is the number one cause of death for Americans; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia is ranked eleventh among 50 states for the highest number of heart
- 11 disease related deaths; and
- 12 WHEREAS, less than 50 percent of sudden cardiac arrest victims outside of a hospital
- 13 receive by stander initiated CPR, and approximately 2 percent of victims receive a shock from
- 14 a bystander initiated AED; and
- 15 WHEREAS, outside of a hospital, the survival rate for individuals struck with a cardiac arrest
- 16 is as low as 10 percent; and
- 17 WHEREAS, survival of a cardiac arrest is heavily reliant on the quick action of our state's
- 18 brave first responders; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Carolyn Cosby, on October 18, 2017, at the state capitol was one of the
- 20 unfortunate individuals to have experienced a heart attack; and

21 WHEREAS, despite the odds, Carolyn survived and made a full neurological recovery

- 22 merely days after the incident due to the team at Grady Hospital and her first responders; and
- WHEREAS, these first responders, in addition to the Georgia State Capitol police officers
- 24 who initiated CPR at the first signs of cardiac arrest, gave Carolyn the best chance of
- 25 survival; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the first responders not only gave Carolyn her life back, but gave her family the
- 27 opportunity to love and cherish their precious time together.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 29 commend the first responders who saved the life of Carolyn Cosby and recognize
- 30 February, 2018, as American Heart Month in Georgia to raise public awareness of the risks
- 31 of heart disease.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 33 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 34 press.
