## **ADOPTED**

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging Congress to grow the United States economy by increasing the number of visas
- 2 designed to permit Korean citizens possessing skills in a specialty occupation to work in the
- 3 United States; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, the entry into force of the U.S.-Korea Free Trade Agreement on March 15,
- 5 2012, means countless new opportunities for U.S. exporters to sell more U.S. goods, services,
- 6 and agricultural products to Korean customers and to support more well-paying jobs in the
- 7 United States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, according to the Office of the United States Trade Representative, the
- 9 agreement is the United States' most commercially significant free trade agreement in almost
- 10 two decades, and the U.S. International Trade Commission estimates that the reduction of
- 11 Korean tariffs and tariff-rate quotas on goods alone will add \$10 billion to \$12 billion to
- 12 annual U.S. Gross Domestic Product and around \$10 billion to annual merchandise exports
- 13 to Korea; and
- 14 WHEREAS, while an unlimited number of highly skilled U.S. professionals are now
- 15 permitted to work in Korea, Korean professionals may only enter the United States under
- 16 general visa categories, which greatly restricts the number of persons admitted and
- 17 discourages Korean investment in the United States; and
- 18 WHEREAS, legislation providing temporary entry for an increased number of Korean
- 19 professionals to work in the United States would permit this country to receive the full
- 20 benefits of the U.S.-Korea Free Trade Agreement; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Korea is the United States' seventh largest trading partner, with \$100 billion in
- 22 annual bilateral trade; Korean businesses have heavily invested in the United States and the
- 23 State of Georgia, operating 51 facilities in this state and creating 50,000 jobs for Georgians
- 24 of all ethnic origins; and

25 WHEREAS, increasing the number of visas will further encourage Korean investment in the

- 26 United States and the State of Georgia.
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 28 GEORGIA that the members of this body urge Congress to enact legislation creating a new
- 29 class of visa designed to permit Korean citizens possessing skills in a specialty occupation
- 30 to work in the United States.
- 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 32 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Congressional Delegation.
