ADOPTED

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating certain joint study committees relating to health; and for other purposes.

PART I.

- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia has dedicated emergency departments staffed with extraordinary health
- 4 care professionals and personnel throughout this state; and
- 5 WHEREAS, workplace violence is of grave concern to all citizens; over 80 percent of all
- 6 hospital staff have been assaulted at least once in their career; and
- 7 WHEREAS, emergency department violence is a significant problem and has a direct
- 8 relationship to experiences of negative stress, decreased work productivity, recovery time off
- 9 of the job, decreased quality of patient care, and exacerbation of the shortage of health care
- 10 professionals; and
- 11 WHEREAS, workplace violence results in increased costs and diversion of resources for
- 12 increased hospital security and dedicated police force personnel; and
- WHEREAS, a significant number of the perpetrators are individuals utilizing the hospital
- 14 emergency departments suffering from untreated mental illnesses which are exacerbated by
- 15 their abuse of drugs, the effect of prescription drugs, their failure to take prescribed
- 16 medication, or a combination of such factors; and
- 17 WHEREAS, a study of the causes and the solutions to the ever increasing violence
- 18 committed against emergency department personnel needs to be undertaken.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GEORGIA GENERAL ASSEMBLY
- 20 that there is created the Joint Study Committee on Violence Against Health Care Workers
- 21 to be composed of 11 members: three members of the House of Representatives to be
- 22 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, three members of the Senate to

23 be appointed by the President of the Senate, and five members to be appointed by the 24 The Governor's appointees shall include the following: one emergency 25 department director from a facility with greater than 500 beds, one emergency department 26 director from a facility with less than 100 beds, one hospital security manager, one 27 behavioral health care professional, and one emergency department registered nurse. The 28 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one of the appointees from the 29 House of Representatives as a cochairperson, and the President of the Senate shall designate one of the appointees from the Senate as a cochairperson. The committee shall meet at the 30 31 call of the cochairpersons.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. Legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members of interim legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Nonlegislative members shall receive a daily expense allowance in the amount specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state employees. Any members of the committee who are state officials or employees, other than legislative members, shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees. The funds necessary for the reimbursement of expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available in their respective departments. All other funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this part shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives and the Senate. All agencies of the state are directed to provide the committee with such assistance as the committee shall require to perform its assigned duties. In the event the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 2, 2014. The committee shall stand abolished on December 2, 2014.

55 PART II.

- 56 WHEREAS, clinical research performed over the past decades continues to show benefits
- 57 arising from certain forms of medical cannabis; and
- 58 WHEREAS, presently, there are in excess of one million United States medical cannabis
- 59 patients, and an increasing number of physicians are recommending the therapeutic use of
- 60 cannabis to their patients in accordance with their respective state laws; and
- 61 WHEREAS, new extracts and compounds have been developed demonstrating that
- 62 cannabidiol, one of the most prevalent nonpsychoactive cannabinoids, has significant health
- and wellness benefits as shown by recent publication of the positive treatment of certain
- 64 seizure disorders afflicting children; and
- 65 WHEREAS, the state's purpose in desiring to study this matter is the compassionate,
- 66 potentially life-saving use of medical cannabis, and it is not the state's intent to sanction,
- 67 encourage, or otherwise be construed as a movement in the direction of the legalization of
- 68 the recreational use of cannabis or other controlled substances; and
- 69 WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to the children and families in this state to undertake a
- 70 study of the prescriptive use of medical cannabis for serious medical condition to determine
- 71 whether it would be appropriate to enact legislation making new provisions or changing
- 72 provisions of current state law with regard to such prescriptive use.
- 73 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 74 GEORGIA that there is created the Joint Study Committee on the Prescription of Medical
- 75 Cannabis for Serious Medical Conditions to be composed of ten members as follows: four
- 76 members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 77 Representatives; four members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 78 the chairman of the board or his or her designee of the Medical Association of Georgia; and
- 79 the executive director or his or her designee of the Prosecuting Attorneys' Council of
- 80 Georgia. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one of the appointees
- 81 from the House of Representatives as a cochairperson, and the President of the Senate shall
- designate one of the appointees from the Senate as a cochairperson. The committee shall
- 83 meet at the call of the cochairpersons.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the issues raised herein or related thereto and recommend any action or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members of interim legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than five days unless additional days are authorized. The public members of the committee who are not public employees shall receive from legislative funds a daily expense allowance as provided in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. Any public employees who are members of the committee shall receive no compensation from legislative funds but may be reimbursed for expenses by their employers. The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this part shall come from the funds appropriated to the Senate and the House of Representatives. In the event the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 1, 2014, at which time the committee shall stand abolished.
