The Department of the Attorney General (Department) has the following comments on this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to repeal certain non-medical exemptions from immunization requirements for school entrance.

For purposes of clarity and administrability, we recommend replacing the wording "that the requirements are not in accordance with the religious tenets of an established church of which the person is a member or adherent" (page 11, lines 13-15) with "that immunization conflicts with the person's bona fide religious tenets and practices."

Purpose of Bill: Repeals the non-medical exemption from immunization requirements.

Department's Position:

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) respectfully provides comments on HB 1118, which proposes to repeal non-medical exemptions to immunization requirements in Hawaii.

The Department defers to the Department of Health on matters of public health and safety. However, eliminating religious exemptions may inadvertently limit some students' ability to attend school, creating disparities in educational opportunities and hindering the Department's mission to provide inclusive and comprehensive education for all students. Families who object to vaccinations for religious reasons may be unable or unwilling to comply with the new mandate, resulting in their children not accessing public education. This could disproportionately affect certain communities with deeply held religious beliefs, cultural practices, or historical mistrust of the medical community, further exacerbating barriers to education.

The provision on page 4, lines 3-7, which ensures that students qualifying for an Individualized Education Program under federal and state law are not prohibited from accessing special education services, is appreciated. While students with disabilities are entitled to accommodations under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, any exemptions must be applied equitably to avoid disparity between students with and without disabilities who receive education at school. Striving for fairness in this context supports the Department's commitment to providing equal educational opportunities for all students.

The Department remains committed to promoting inclusive policies that ensure all students have access to quality education. We appreciate the opportunity to provide comments and look forward to

continued collaboration to support the diverse needs of students in Hawaii.

- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** Elimination of non-medical exemptions to school entry and attendance
- 2 requirements would serve to improve immunization rates; thereby increasing community-wide
- 3 protection from vaccine-preventable diseases and ultimately reducing costs related to medical
- 4 care and treatment, potential hospitalization, reduced work days or loss of employment due to
- 5 illness or child-care needs, and Departmental outbreak investigation and response activities.
- 6 **Department Position:** The Department strongly supports this measure and offers comments.
- 7 During the 2023-24 school year, Hawaii's overall non-medical exemption rate grew to 5.3% with
- 8 55 of 382 schools reporting non-medical exemption rates exceeding 10% of their student
- 9 populations. Decreasing immunization coverage due to rising rates of exemptions which have
- 10 no medical basis increases the risk for vaccine-preventable disease outbreaks that can be
- 11 potentially fatal to children who attend school. This is especially concerning for students with
- 12 medical conditions who are unable to be immunized and who must rely on their vaccinated
- peers to prevent the introduction of vaccine preventable diseases in their schools. Maintaining
- the highest level of safety for Hawaii's keiki is crucial. Elimination of non-medical exemptions
- 15 would provide a significant level of protection for all keiki attending schools in Hawaii.

SUBJECT: HB1118 Relating to Non-Medical Exemptions to Immunization Requirements

The Hawai'i State Council on Developmental Disabilities SUPPORTS HB1118 which repeals the non-medical exemption from immunization requirements.

This legislation is critical for maintaining high immunization rates and ensuring herd immunity, a vital protective measure for individuals with developmental disabilities who may be medically unable to receive vaccines. Herd immunity is essential for safeguarding those who cannot be vaccinated due to medical conditions such as immunodeficiency disorders, complex health needs, or treatments that weaken the immune system. For individuals with developmental disabilities, many of whom rely on specialized healthcare and support services, exposure to vaccine-preventable diseases can lead to severe, even fatal, health complications. Maintaining a high community vaccination rate is the most effective way to prevent outbreaks and protect our most vulnerable residents.

The increasing trend of non-medical exemptions, as cited in the bill, is eroding this critical layer of protection. In the 2023-2024 school year, non-medical exemptions more than doubled compared to previous years, weakening the herd immunity that individuals with developmental disabilities depend on to safely participate in schools, workplaces, and community settings. Without strong immunization coverage, we risk outbreaks that disproportionately harm those least able to fight infections.

Dear Chair Takayama and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony in OPPOSITION of HB 1118, Relating to Non-Medical Exemptions to Immunization Requirements. My testimony is submitted in my individual capacity as a member of the Kaua'i County Council and the Public Safety & Human Services Committee Chair of the Kaua'i County Council.

HB 1118 is of broad concern to a number of parents in Kaua'i County as it infringes on personal freedoms, parental rights, and religious liberties. Medical decisions, including vaccination, should remain a matter of personal choice, guided by informed consent. Eliminating non-medical exemptions would force individuals to undergo medical procedures against their deeply held religious beliefs or personal convictions. This is a concerning overreach of government authority.

In my personal experience, I had a child admittedly injured by the diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (DTaP) shot, as was evident in the doctor's office. Another child showed symptoms of attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and Dyslexia in early childhood, without necessarily a clear tie-in to his vaccinations obtained up to kindergarten. I chose to homeschool my sons for middle school and sent them to private high school to avoid the vaccine risk. No parent should have to choose between their child's safety and education. My older son fortunately grew out of his ADHD, and my children have been healthy as only having half of their vaccine schedule. Everyone should have this freedom.

HB1118 is a direct violation of our rights found in the U.S. Constitution and the Hawaii State Constitution.

U.S. Constitution

Our first amendment protection of religious liberty cannot be subjugated by state law. Americans have the right to refuse any order, medicine, or procedure that violates their religious beliefs as well as anything that is immoral or unethical according to their well-informed conscience. <u>As a retired health care professional and a consumer of health care</u>, we are entitled to Informed Consent and have the right to refuse any medical intervention including immunizations in any circumstances.

Hawaii State Constitution

Article I. FREEDOM OF RELIGION, SPEECH, PRESS, ASSEMBLY AND PETITION Section 4. **No** law shall be enacted respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech or of the press or the right of the people peaceably to assemble and to petition the government for a redress of grievances

HB1118 proposes:

- 1. to ELIMINATE this section from current HRS Law, SECTION 2. Section 302A-1156, Hawaii Revised Statutes: "If any parent, custodian, guardian, or any other person in loco parentis of a child objects to immunization in writing on the grounds that the immunization conflicts with that person's bona fide religious tenets and practices. Upon showing the appropriate school, official satisfactory evidence of the exemption, no certificate or other evidence of immunization shall be required for entry into school.
- 2. to ADD: The department of health pursuant to chapter 91 may adopt rules that it deems necessary for public health and safety. (This gives the Department of Health authority over parent's medical decisions for their children)
- 3. to ADD: no objection (from parent/guardian) shall be recognized when, in the opinion of the director of health, there is danger of an epidemic from any communicable disease." (This gives all power to the Director of Health)

Please preserve our constitutional right of freedom of religious liberty and our God-given inalienable rights.

May I respectfully remind you that our actions today will impact future generations to come. Please vote NO on HB1118. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

Comments:

I am writing to express my **strong opposition to HB 1118,** which seeks to eliminate non-medical exemptions for vaccinations in Hawaii as a condition for enrollment in school, daycare, or higher education.

No product that has DEATH as a possible side-effect should be indirectly being mandated.

Where there is risk there should be choice!

Passing this bill will not encourage families who don't vaccinate to comply. Instead they will homeschool or leave the state.

This bill aims to achieve "herd immunity" and protect immunocompromised students, but fails to acknowledge that most vaccines do NOT prevent infection or transmission (just like the Covid jabs, does anyone remember?). And in case you *believe* it does protect, why are you afraid of the unvaccinated? How are they a threat?

There are numerous pertussis outbreaks in schools with 100% vaccinated populations. The vaccinated can be asymptomatic carriers and make them MORE dangerous to the immunocompromised than those that are not vaccinated who would show symptoms. And livevirus vaccines can shed, and thus spread the vaccine-derived version of the disease.

Our current exemptions laws already have provisions for the unvaccinated to stay home during an outbreak.

Furthermore, what about all the adults, like teacher, staff, and (grand)parents who have NOT received all those shots students are required to get? I actually had all of the typical childhood diseases and *still* have immunity. But those who received for example an MMR shot as a child, need another one as an adult, because their efficacy wanes. Most adults don't know this and they are then unprotected.

Selected quotes from Physicians for Informed Consent about the immunocompromised:

"The vaccination status of other schoolchildren does not pose a significant risk to immunocompromised schoolchildren for the following reasons:

- Some vaccines cannot prevent the spread of the bacteria or viruses they target.
- Immune globulin (plasma containing antibodies) is available for immunocompromised children exposed to certain infectious diseases.
- Some infectious diseases rarely cause complications in immunocompromised schoolchildren.
- Not all infectious diseases are contagious.
- Some infectious diseases are not spread in schools

Immunocompromised schoolchildren have the option to receive all the vaccines licensed for children in the United States, except for the live virus vaccines (such as vaccines targeting measles, mumps, rubella, or varicella infections).

Although vaccination often results in protective levels of antibodies in immunocompromised children, clinical vaccine safety trials typically exclude immunocompromised subjects.


In addition, vaccines have not been evaluated for their potential to cause cancer, genetic mutations or impaired fertility in the general or immunocompromised population. Due to these limitations, it is not known whether the benefit of vaccinating an immunocompromised child outweighs the risk of vaccine injury to that child."

Aloha Chair Takayama, Vice Chair Keohokapu-Lee Loy, and Committee Members,

The American Academy of Pediatrics, Hawai'i Chapter, which represents over 200 pediatricians in Hawai'i, thanks you for allowing us to share why we believe HB 1118 would benefit the children and families of Hawai'i.

Despite a great deal of disinformation circulating on the internet about the safety and efficacy of vaccines, advances in vaccine science and distribution of vaccines around the world have saved millions of lives, including many right here in Hawai'i. Numerous well-designed and peer-reviewed studies have shown that vaccines are safe and effective and that there is no connection between vaccines and autism. As the graphic below shows, vaccines are a public health triumph responsible for saving over 150 million children's lives across the globe in the past 50 years.



Every pediatrician in our organization has witnessed the devastating shock and grief experienced by parents who truly believed they were doing the best thing for their child by declining vaccines when their child is hospitalized with – or dies from – a vaccine preventable disease. One of us will never forget the previously healthy teenager, the only child of a single mother, who died of the flu despite receiving excellent care in the Pediatric ICU. Others will remember the infant with whooping cough gasping for breath and turning blue, the toddler with complications from measles, or the teenager who suffered preventable lifelong disability from H. flu meningitis that he contracted when he was in preschool.

There are legitimate medical reasons that certain children cannot receive some or all of their immunizations according to schedule. These include certain cancers, having received immune globulin as therapy for Kawasaki Disease, and many others. These children have a right to be

protected, as much as possible, by herd immunity when they themselves cannot be vaccinated or do not have an immune system able to respond properly to the vaccine. However, with the alarming rise in non-medical exemptions that we have observed recently in Hawai'i, vaccine coverage no longer meets the threshold to provide herd immunity across the entire population. Furthermore, there are certain areas in Hawai'i where vaccination coverage is critically low for crucial vaccines like MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella). Measles, in particular, is exceptionally contagious and transmitted by the airborne route. Up to 90% of unvaccinated people exposed to measles will contract the disease, and 1 out of every 300 children hospitalized with measles will not survive. It is essential to repeal the non-medical exemption to vaccination requirements for school entry in order to regain herd immunity against diseases that many of today's parents have never – precisely because vaccines are so effective – seen with their own eyes.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on this important bill. We strongly urge you to support this legislation.

Comments:

I most strongly oppose HB1118.

Parental rights, the welfare of students and faculty, and the Hawaii Department of Education's (HIDOE) ability to retain qualified teachers are all negatively impacted by this bill.

Parents are reconsidering vaccination for themselves and for their child or children as they become more aware of the risks and adverse consequences of vaccines. We must honor the parent's decision to get vaccinated or not. If this bill is enacted, who will take the responsibility when students are physically or mentally harmed by forced immunization? HIDOE administrators will probably find it more difficult to replace highly skilled instructors who have returned to work under the religious exemption as a result of this vaccination requirement.

As a retired government employee of 31 years, I am aware that adults are ultimately in charge of their family's health and care. Furthermore, the disclosure of health information is protected under the HIPA Act. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996(HIPAA) protects individuals from disclosing their health history. It "... aimed to alter the transfer of healthcare information, stipulated the guidelines by which personally identifiable information maintained by the healthcare and healthcare insurance industries should be protected from fraud and theft, and addressed some limitations on health insurance coverage generally prohibits healthcare providers and businesses called covered entities from disclosing protected information to anyone other than a patient and the patient's authorized representatives without their consent. The bill does not restrict patients from receiving information about themselves (with limited exceptions). Furthermore, it does not prohibit patients from voluntarily sharing their health information however they choose, nor does it require confidentiality where a patient discloses medical information to family members, friends or other individuals not employees of a covered entity."

Parents' rights to safeguard their children must be respected, regardless of whether they decide to vaccinate themselves and their family.

Pushing HB1118 will affect not only the students but also faculty. Today, many schools are still experiencing difficulty to find qualified teachers and staff to fill vacancies. If the religious exemption to return to work is no longer honored, this decision will further impact many schools who are already struggling to keep the most competent faculty.

The physical and mental health of our children of this generation and the next generation depend on your decision to do the right thing.

Vote no on HB1118 and any other similar bill.

Written Testimony of Christian Science Committee on Publication for Hawaii

Concerning HB 1118 (RELATING TO NON-MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS TO IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS)

Chair Takayama, Vice Chair Keohokapu-Lee Loy, and members of the House Committee on Health:

As designated representatives of Christian Science, please accept this written testimony concerning HB 1118 relating to the religious exception from vaccination requirements. I first want to express appreciation on behalf of our church's members for the thoughtful and ongoing consideration you have given to Hawaii's vaccination policy, including the acknowledgment of students' religious accommodation from vaccination for the 2024-25 school year. Our members are following this issue with interest in the continuation of a religious accommodation in law, while also deeply caring about public health. We acknowledge that it can be challenging when the religious beliefs and practices of a minority may not be understood or embraced by the majority, or when these beliefs and practices must be balanced with other valued interests of society. Yet, we believe religious freedom in our society is highly important and can be accommodated without endangering public health.

Some religions, like Christian Science, have religious beliefs and practices that do not align with compulsory vaccination laws. While our church itself may not take a formal "for" or "against" policy stance on the vaccination issue because not every individual Christian Scientist approaches the issue in exactly the same way, we can speak to why a Christian Scientist generally appreciates the availability of religious accommodation from

vaccination requirements and offer the following explanation for the House Committee on Health's consideration.

A Christian Scientist's use of the religious exemption

Christian Science is a religious practice, a way of life, and a system of healing that draws upon an understanding of spiritual truths illustrated throughout the Bible and the teachings of Christ Jesus. Its teachings include how one can reliably look to God and spiritual means alone to meet life's needs, including health care needs, as well as the importance of being moral and law-abiding. It is important to note that health care decisions for Christian Scientists, including those relating to contagion and vaccination, are not dictated by the Christian Science church or its theology. Rather, such decisions are motivated by each individual's experience with their practice of Christian Science, and with a deep care for public health, obedience to health laws and regard for the safety of others. When it comes to contagion, this religious practice is both preventative and curative. And while we don't claim to be perfect in our practice, many Christian Scientists have found it to be a very practical and reliable method of addressing contagious disease.

Protection and healing from contagion

To understand why a Christian Scientist would want to claim a religious exemption, one need look no further than periodicals published by the Christian Science church dating back to its inception in the late 1800s through the present day, which include accounts of protection and healing through the practice of Christian Science, many of which involve issues of contagion and have been medically verified. A common thread through these healings is the willingness to work with health authorities and take precautions to ensure they are not endangering others through their practice. The healing experiences of Hawaii citizens are well-represented in these publications, and provide just a representative glimpse of the many more unpublished accounts of prevention and healing that members have experienced in their lives.

For example, a mother testified how the overnight healing of her child from a severe case of measles through prayer alone convinced her husband, who was not a Christian Scientist, of the reliability of this method of care.

Another woman testified about a quick healing from a debilitating sore throat, fatigue, and weakness, which her school infirmary diagnosed as mononucleosis and strep throat. When the school infirmary cleared her to return to school after only a few days, rather than the weeks and possibly months that were predicted, the dean of students called her to the office and asked "How did you do that?"

A man who was diagnosed as having minimal natural bodily resistance to certain types of harmful bacteria and resultant infections, testified of his progressive deterioration of health from youth. Upon contracting meningitis, he was placed under medical care and increasing doses of antibiotic treatment. But he soon developed allergic reactions to the drug treatment and his doctors, running out of medical answers, advised his parents to "prepare for the worst." It was at that lowest moment that a friend shared how they had been healed of a severe condition of asthma through prayer in Christian Science. Willing to try anything, the man turned to Christian Science himself and was soon permanently free from all symptoms of illness and weakness.

For those relying on Christian Science for healing and prevention, the protection, healing and regeneration that comes through the practice of Christian Science has been deeply meaningful and effective. It involves a whole-hearted communion with a loving God, reaching beyond faith, positive thinking, or mind over matter.

Are there ways to prevent misuse of the religious exemption?

Yes! While many who claim a religious exemption based on sincere religious beliefs are doing so legitimately, we recognize that there are those who use the religious exemption to avoid vaccination requirements for non-religious reasons. But we've seen narrowly-tailored ways to address those concerns without completely eliminating the religious exemption, including implementation of consistent and effective procedures to verify the sincerity of one's religious belief, and even restricting availability of the exemption when a particular health threat is declared. It may take more than is currently being done to address the concerns, but there are ways to do so without unnecessarily curtailing the exercise of religious beliefs.

In sum, we hope tailored solutions will be given serious consideration in lieu of simply terminating the religious exemption as proposed in HB 1118. We would be happy to talk

with you further to serve as a resource or answer any questions as the Committee considers the above-referenced legislation.

Removing Religious Exemption for School Vaccine Mandates

The National Vaccine Information Center (NVIC) is a nonprofit charity founded in 1982 to prevent vaccine injuries and deaths through public education. NVIC advocates for protection of the human right to informed consent to medical risk taking and inclusion of flexible medical, religious and conscientious belief vaccine exemptions in U.S. public health policies and laws. **We strongly oppose HB 1118 and urge your opposition as well.**

HB 1118 removes the religious exemption for school vaccine mandates by phasing it out.

A religious exemption is needed for many reasons, but one of the most pressing reasons is because the state <u>Department of Health amended HAR 11-157</u> to drastically expand vaccine mandates for children entering childcare or school beginning July 1, 2020. This action added additional mandates for Hepatitis A Vaccine (2 doses), Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV) (4 doses), Rotavirus Vaccine (3 doses), Human Papillomavirus Vaccine (HPV) (2 doses), Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine (MCV) (2 doses) and Tdap Vaccine (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) (1 dose). This was a mandated expansion of 14 doses of 6 vaccines!

Hawaii should not mandate one-size-fits-all federal recommendations. The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) makes <u>recommendations</u> only. It is only a federal advisory committee, not a lawmaking body.

HB 1118 discriminates against children and families who refuse one or more vaccines based on religious beliefs by prohibiting them from attending school and removing protections in law that prevent them from being forced to take a vaccine that conflicts with their religious beliefs. This bill authorizes state-mandated vaccine status discrimination and is no different from any other form of discrimination that denies access to education or other accommodations based on race or sex. The individual's right to religious liberty is protected by the First Amendment to the United States

Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, Article I, Section 4., "No law shall be enacted respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech or of the press or the right of the people peaceably to assemble and to petition the government for a redress of grievances."

This bill violates the individual's right to freedom of religion and discriminate against individuals based solely on their religious beliefs. Additionally, the bill's exception to grandfather in children with existing religious exemptions would put families who choose not to vaccinate based on religious beliefs in a difficult situation where one or more of their children have the right to attend school while another child may not. The right to a religious exemption should not be dependent on a child's birthdate.

Parents should have the final say in what vaccines their children receive because all vaccines are pharmaceutical products that carry a risk of injury and even death. All individuals deserve the right to informed consent, which includes the right to refuse a vaccine without coercion, harassment, or penalty. As of December 27, 2024, there were 2,652,032 adverse events and 48,856 deaths reported to the federal Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS). As of January 1, 2025, the United States Government has paid out approximately 5.3 billion dollars to vaccine victims through the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (VICP).

The law passed by Congress in 1986 establishing the VICP along with the 2011 Supreme Court Decision <u>BRUESEWITZ ET AL. v. WYETH LLC, FKA WYETH, INC., ET AL</u> shield vaccines manufacturers and the doctors who administer vaccines from liability for vaccine injuries and deaths.

The trend in the United States is to respect informed consent and religious liberty, not force medical treatment like vaccines or remove religious freedom rights. <u>HB 1118</u> is dangerous and anti-American. We urge your no vote on <u>HB 1118</u>.

With this testimony, I would like to ensure that lawmakers are aware of how *incredibly hard* it is to obtain a medical exemption for a vaccine injured children. My daughter was vaccine injured at 2 years old, after having a non-febrile seizure days after recieving three vaccines at once, during her well child visit. Please note that one of the *first* side effects listed on these vaccine safety labels, from the manufacturers themselves, have "**seizures**" listed as a known side effect.

I was shocked when I was met with a cold and defensive attitude from her pediatricians office as I followed up with them, after my daughter was admitted to the emergency room. I ended up ultimately being granted a medical exemption for Veda, which lasted for 10 years, right up until the office implemented a *new policy*. This policy *forced* patients to follow the offices' vaccine schedule or the child would *not* be welcome as a patient any longer. My daughter was then kicked out of the practice, and worst, they conveniently walked back and revoked the medical exemption they provided her for years, saying that they looked the case over again, and no longer felt that the vaccine has cause her seizure. All of this was done so that my daughter would no longer be a patient at this practice, since insurance companies give bonuses to practices who have a high percentages of vaccinated patients. This is horrifiing, and I was deeply hurt. This isn't the kind of treatment you would expect from people who you trust to ensure your childs health and well-being.

Vaccines have become money driven, and political. This is not a one size fits all drug, no drug is. Where there is any kind of risk, a choice is *required* to be afforded. This bill would empower drug companies and pediatrician offices to *continue* to evade any type of responsibility or protections for patients that are adversly affected by vaccines. Further more, after my daughters injury, I researched ingredients used in vaccines, also listed in the manufacturers insert. Blood fractions and other toxins are contained in many vaccines - which is against my religious beliefs. Please ensure that the people of Hawai'i have medical freedom of choice and freedom to practice their religious beliefs.

I can tell you from someone that is part of my community and who talks to many parents, this bill would not force *one* parent to vaccinate their vaccine injured child or their siblings, or go against their religious beliefs. This bill would force these parents to *homeschool* their keiki. Please do not punish our keiki or parents for their religious beliefs or the adverse effects they

have experienced with vaccines. Forcing a medical procedure on to people is a direct violation of our God-given freedom to choose. Please let our keiki attend public school, be part of their community and play sports.

Mahalo for all your painstaking work day in and day out for the people of Hawai'i, and thank you for reading all of these powerful testimonies, I appreciate it immensly.

For example, conservative Christian or Amish communities might withdraw further from mainstream society, homeschooling children or avoiding medical systems. This polarization could hinder broader public health collaboration.

5. **Unintended Public Health Consequences**

Strict mandates might drive non-compliant individuals underground, falsifying exemptions or avoiding healthcare altogether. This could leave pockets of low immunity, risking outbreaks. Additionally, enforcement efforts might overshadow education and outreach, which are more effective for fostering voluntary uptake.

6. **Economic and Educational Barriers**

Without exemptions, families refusing vaccines for religious reasons could face exclusion from schools or employment. This disproportionately affects low-income groups, limiting access to education and economic stability, and deepening inequities.

7. **Historical and Cultural Sensitivities**

Some minority religions have historical trauma tied to state coercion (e.g., Indigenous or Jehovah's Witness communities). Removing exemptions may echo past persecution, intensifying distrust and resistance.

Conclusion

While removing religious exemptions aims to boost vaccination rates, it risks infringing on civil liberties, provoking legal disputes, and fostering societal discord. Policymakers must balance public health goals with respect for religious diversity, ensuring strategies prioritize dialogue and inclusivity to avoid counterproductive outcomes.

On September 24, 2021, a federal court in Kentucky acknowledged in *Beckerich v. St. Elizabeth Medical Center* that exemptions from a hospital's COVID-19 vaccine mandate should be granted for hospital employees who had a sincere religious objection under Title VII.

On October 7, 2021, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit in *Dahl v. Board of Trustees of Western Michigan University* held that student athletes were likely to succeed on their First Amendment claim that a university infringed on their right of free exercise of religion when it enforced a coronavirus vaccine mandate and ignored or denied requests for religious exemptions.

In July 2022, Liberty Counsel settled the nation's first classwide lawsuit for healthcare workers over a COVID vaccine mandate, for more than \$10.3 million. The class action settlement against NorthShore University HealthSystem was on behalf of more than 500 current and former healthcare workers who were unlawfully discriminated against and denied religious exemptions from the mandate.

There are many more recent court decisions throughout the nation that conclude again and again, first amendment rights cannot be revoked. In this particular case, you will find that mama bears like me will fiercely protect our children, minors that we are responsible for, and will not let their bodies be mandated against God's will.

I am a pediatric and adult ICU physician here in Hawaii. I care for patients when they become critically ill, for any reason. In addition, I have a PhD studying the immunology of infectious diseases, making me uniquely well-qualified to speak on the importance of immunizations. My interest in this is purely medical and scientific; I simply want what's best for the people of Hawaii.

At a fundamental level, non-medical exemptions to immunizations put the keiki of Hawaii at risk. As the number of people immunized for vaccine-preventable illnesses decreases, so too does the number of people who contract those infections increase. Our keiki are the most vulnerable... many are too young for immunizations. While an adult can argue "measles isn't so bad. I had chicken pox when I was younger and I turned out fine," our infants cannot make that argument. So if the number of people immunized against measles or chicken pox decreases, the number of people that contract these infections will increase; while they may recover, what happens when they visit their 9 month old niece and inadvertently infect her? Suddenly, she ends up in my ICU with an illness that could have been prevented if only her family members had elected to be immunized. These are patients I have cared for; it breaks the hearts of healthcare workers (doctors, nurses, pharmacists, respiratory therapists, dieticians, etc) to care for people who are sick with vaccine-preventable illnesses because we know that their illness was, in all likelihood, preventable.

The state should strive to limit barriers to immunizations that are not supported by medical and scientific research, in order to assure that as many people as possible receive immunizations. Doing so reflects a commitment to protecting our population (and especially our keiki) from unnecessary suffering.

I respectfully submit this statement of faith for a Constitutionally recognized and protected religious exemption against any mandatory injection/vaccine. Based on my understanding of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act and the First Amendment to the United States Constitution, and other federal and state laws, we choose to exercise our right to demand our right to a religious exemption for our children against any requirements regarding vaccinations. This demand for an exemption is based on my deeply held religious beliefs pursuant to my reliance on teachings in the Holy Bible.

The Bible very clearly states that the body is the Temple of the Holy Spirit. We are commanded to take good care of it, not to defile it, and certainly not introduce something into it that could potentially harm it (1 Corinthians 3:16-17, 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, 2 Corinthians 5:10, and 2 Corinthians 7:1). These vaccines (by the very disclosure of the vaccine manufacturers) contain carcinogens, neurotoxins, animal viruses, animal blood, allergens, and heavy metals. I do not believe it would be right for me to introduce these substances into my body or the body of my children because they have not sufficiently been proven to me to be safe and effective. Rather, I believe they may be harmful to my body.

Additionally, the Constitution grants and protects every American citizen the God-given right to make our own medical decisions. The Declaration of Independence recognizes rights are God-given. First, the Ninth Amendment states, "The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people." The Constitution does not grant the power or authority to the federal government to compel private citizens take medical treatments — especially not as a category. Therefore, I reserve this right.

Second, federal laws protects my choosing to disclose private medical decisions (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act). Numerous legal and financial penalties exist for entities violating this law. Mandating vaccination as a condition of employment and or school acceptance implies I disclose medical information and is a violation of federal law for discrimination.

Taking away our right to a religious exemption is, to me, contrary to Biblical teachings, my faith in Jesus Christ, the specific powers granted the federal government, and existing federal law. It is unlawful to segregate people according to their skin color. It is unlawful to compel Jews to eat pork. It is also unlawful to compel personal medical decisions of citizens. My religious beliefs are sincere. Legally, I cannot be required to prove that a church or religious leader agrees with my sincere religious beliefs, or my interpretation of Scripture, or my instruction from the Holy Spirit. My beliefs are my own, and they are sincerely and deeply held.

As a resident of Hawaii, I am writing to oppose HB1118, a bill looking to get rid of religious exemptions to vaccines.

The **Fourth Amendment**, which protects against unreasonable searches and seizures, has been applied to bodily integrity, meaning that non-consensual medical procedures can be seen as unconstitutional intrusions. Additionally, the **Fourteenth Amendment's Due Process Clause** protects personal liberty and privacy, which courts have interpreted to include the right to make decisions about one's own body and medical care.

Key Supreme Court cases have clarified these constitutional protections. For example, in *Rochin v. California* (1952), the Court ruled that forcibly pumping a suspect's stomach to obtain evidence violated the Due Process Clause. In *Cruzan v. Director, Missouri Department of Health* (1990), the Court recognized a competent person's constitutional right to refuse medical treatment.

Additionally, the idea that the state of Hawaii would trample the religious and individual freedom of parents and children to make medical decisions, like vaccines, is appalling. Vaccine manufactures have immunity from the US government for their vaccine products. Therefore, mandating these products when they have a shield from lawsuits places no restrictions on the pharmacutical companies. When the Covid-19 vaccine was mandated there was a major uptick in adverse events. VAERS receives around **30,000 to 50,000 reports per year** for all vaccines combined. However, with the rollout of COVID-19 vaccines, the system experienced an unprecedented surge, with over **1.7 million reports** related to COVID-19 vaccines by mid-2021. Who is responsible for the injuries these people have received? With the Pharmaceutical companies immune, it has become the role of the Federal government to discern who is really injured. If the government mandates vaccines, tracks vaccines and then does the payouts for injuries it doesn't protect individual liberty regarding medical decisions. The government is then not in the role of protecting vulnerable people (those who become injured) but in silencing those who speak out against possible harm.

One of the adjuvents used in vaccines is aluminum. Aluminum is a heavy metal that when injected can be expelled from the body. However, when injected has the potential to accumulate in the body. When a child is given over 75 vaccines before the age of 5 years old, thats a lot of aluminum that can have detrimental health effects that need to be studied more extensively.

Finally, vaccine science has relied heavily on the use of fetal tissue cells from aborted fetuses. The **fetal fibroblast cells used to grow vaccine viruses** were first obtained from elective termination of two pregnancies in the early 1960s. These same fetal cells obtained from the early 1960s have continued to grow in the laboratory and are used to make vaccines today. Even if fetal cells aren't in the final vaccines given today, they have been used to develop vaccines past and present. Many pro-life Americans do not support this practice and should not be forced to use a medical product that has used aborted material for development. This goes against the consciences of Hawaii residents.

I hope the legislature will sincerely rethink this bill and vote NO on HB1118 to ensure the residents of Hawaii keep their bodily autonomy and freedom intact. Mahalo for your time.

Aloha, my name is Jasmine Jenkins, I am a mother and I strongly oppose HB1118. It is extremely unsettling to hear that a family's ability to make decisions about their children's health in relation to their religious beliefs and values, would be taken away. Additionally, their constitutional rights are being challenged.

The first clause of the First Amendment states: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." . It forbids Congress from both promoting one religion over others and also restricting an individual's religious practices. HB1118 violates religious rights under the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution to require the State to recognize religious exemptions in the same manner that it recognizes secular exceptions. The "free exercise" component of the First Amendment applies to states through the Fourteenth Amendment, rendering "the legislatures of the states as incompetent as Congress to enact such laws."

As in the similar case in Mississippi, Bosarge vs Edney in 2023, where they upheld religious exemptions. They had to determine whether the law to repeal religious exemptions from schools was neutral or generally applicable, "[a] law is not generally applicable if it invites the government to consider the particular reasons for a person's conduct by providing a mechanism for individualized exemptions." *Fulton*, 141 S. Ct. at 1877 (quotation omitted). A law also fails to be generally applicable "if it prohibits religious conduct while permitting secular conduct that undermines the government's asserted interests in a similar way." *Id*. A policy is not neutral if it is "specifically directed at religious practice," meaning that it either "discriminates on its face" or "religious exercise is otherwise its object." *Kennedy*, 142 S. Ct. at 2422 (quotations omitted)." This bill fails the neutrality or general applicability to suffice as proceeding.

The relevant question however, it seems, is not whether the government has a compelling interest in enforcing this bill as a general interest, but whether it has such a general interest in denying religious freedom to a people.

The constitution of our state, states in Section 1: "All political power of this State is inherent in the **people** and the responsibility for the exercise thereof **rests with the people**. All government is founded on this authority." Section 8 states: No citizen shall be **disfranchised**, **or deprived** of any of the rights or privileges secured to other citizens, unless by the law of the land.

It's deeply troubling to hear that our state government founded on these authorities and state constitutional rights, would force diverse communities of religion into choosing between their own religion, their children's health, their education while simultaneously upholding constitutional rights for some, and marginalizing theirs.

A family's right to exercise such decisions for their children's health based on their religious convictions, should be left in their hands and not the governments to decide. My body, my choice, my religion, my health, my child, my rights, my decision. I respectfully submit that our public health needs should be weighed in balance with families' right to their religion.



PURPOSE:

To repeal statutory authorization for nonmedical exemptions to immunization requirements, and preserve exemptions already approved.

MEANS:

Amend sections 302A-1156, 321-11, and 325-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Routine childhood immunizations help protect the health of children and create safer environments for childcare and learning. When ninety-five per cent of individuals in a community are immunized, enough people have immunity to the most infectious vaccine-preventable diseases to prevent an outbreak, which protects those who, for medical reasons, are unable to get vaccinated or develop an immune response to vaccination.

The rate of non-medical immunization exemptions in Hawaii increased from 2.5 percent for the 2015-2016 school year to 5.3 percent for the 2023-2024 school year, more than doubling. The rate of non-medical exemptions varied by school with fifty-five of the 382 schools that reported for 2023-2024 school year having a non-medical immunization exemption rate exceeding ten percent.

This bill is needed to respond to the rising trend of non-medical exemptions from school immunization requirements that is increasing the risk of an outbreak. Due to the morbidity and mortality of vaccine-preventable diseases among children, the State has a compelling interest in repealing exemptions for which there are no objective medical bases and thereby increasing

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protective factors for individual children and the community at large. Maintaining high immunization rates among children is crucial for protecting the safety and health of the children, their families, and the community.

Impact on the public: Removal of non-medical exemptions for immunizations would increase vaccination rates for Hawaii's school-age children.

Elimination of the non-medical immunization exemption will reduce the risk of infections, secondary infections in the families of students, and the spread of communicable diseases in the wider social and occupational community at large, including in care facilities and other congregate centers where close contact can increase the spread of communicable diseases.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Elimination of non-medical exemptions will streamline immunization screening and reporting processes to the Department and improve public health.

The Department of Education will likely experience diminished administrative burden, and campuses will be safer from vaccine-preventable diseases.

I am writing to formally and respectfully address parental rights for religious exemption to the Department of Health in the State of Hawai'i's school health requirements. Hawai'i State Law for childcare facility and school attendance requires all students to meet physical examination, immunizations, and tuberculosis clearance requirements before they may attend a childcare facility, preschool, or public/private school in the State. Parents should be able to base exemption requests on religious grounds. Many people hold sincere and genuine beliefs that forbid them from accepting any and all vaccinations.

Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, an employer must not discriminate against an employee on the basis of that employee's sincerely held religious beliefs. Religious discrimination involves treating a person, in this case a student, unfavorably because of his or her religious beliefs. As you may know, the law protects not only people who belong to traditional, organized religions, such as Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, and Judaism, but also others who have sincerely held religious beliefs.

According to the State of Hawai'i's Department of Health school health requirements, children may be exempt from immunization requirements for medical or religious reasons, if the appropriate documentation is presented to the childcare facility or school.

<u>Haw. Rev. Stat. § 302A-1154, 1156</u>. Hawaii schools should allow for religious exemptions because they must allow for employees under Title VII.

This request for religious exemptions are the thoughts and sentiments not shared in casual conversation and deeply personal to many with their unique understanding of the language of God. The only reason that this is being shared with you is because the law dictates that we do.

The issue with blood that poses vaccination to be a sin is that it is injected into one's bloodstream and that vaccines alter our sacred human blood.

"If you diligently heed the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His Commandments and keep all His statues, I will none of the diseases on you which I brought on the Egyptians. For I am the Lord who heals you." (Exodus 15:26)

Unfortunately, many people have been previously vaccinated of all childhood immunization but the decision to be vaccinated was not theirs, but their parents. Now as adults, we make our own medical decisions. However, some of their children may have received a few of the childhood vaccinations because they didn't hold the personal understanding of God's message to them back then, as they do now.

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own. That God is in you. That he is our healer." (Corinthians 6:19)

I do recognize a clear difference between helping a body in crisis and addressing a healthy body with medical help or intervention. Generally speaking, if my body were in a state of emergency, I would consider all the options and discuss what to do with my trusted physician. I would also consult with the Bible, pray to my God for help and guidance and rely on the healing power of God to aid me.

"So that your faith might not rest on human wisdom but on the power of God." (1 Corinthians, 2:5)

Whatever God sends my way, I will seek His help for solutions and guidance and my decisions will adhere to my personal belief in God.

"No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. (Luke 16:13)

Understand that I do not turn my back on all "modern" medicine and its practices and philosophies. There is a significant difference between a body in crisis needing help and a body that is healthy accepting a medical procedure. Many people, like myself, believe God would accept the former, He would not accept the latter.

Jesus said: "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do." (Matthew 9:12)

Jesus again repeated the same: "When Jesus heard it, he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of the physician..." (Mark 2:17)

The medical establishment as well as most family and friends apply pressure and guilt to others in society to participate in the vaccination process. Modern society tells us that we can hurt

ourselves and other people if we do not accept vaccines into our bodies. Society tells us we jeopardize babies, elderly people and everyone in between, if we do not vaccinate. Without a medical background or specific scientific knowledge, it is difficult to comment on the truth to that assertion. But the point is controversial because I am certain of this; God has communicated to me that to address my immaculate, healthy, God-given body with the procedure of vaccinations would be a sin against my conscience.

Please take into consideration of my justification of my sincerely held personal religious beliefs, as there are many people like me. I hope I have defined them sufficiently. Again, these thoughts are the Holy message I receive from my God. I don't ask that you, or anyone else, agree with these thoughts and personal translations. But under the law, I respectfully request that they be honored as truthful and legally permissible. Based on what I have shared, I ask this religious exemption be allowed.

Parents should be allowed to opt out of school vaccines for personal reasons. This bill would be taking away parental choice and religious freedom. The government shouldn't decide if kids must be vaccinated, even if it goes against a family's beliefs.

Vaccine mandates infringe upon constitutionally protected religious freedoms.

The First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution states, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."

In the unanimous 1939 ruling for Cantwell v. Connecticut, the US Supreme Court held that state and local governments' infringement upon religious freedom is also unconstitutional.

Several religions oppose vaccines and mandatory vaccinations. Some Christian Scientists consider vaccinations against their religion because founder Mary Baker Eddy stated that the "calm, Christian state of mind is a better preventative of contagion than a drug, or than any other possible sanative method... the 'perfect Love' that 'casteth out fear' is a sure defense."

Amish communities do not view all vaccinations as "necessary" and some believe that vaccinations weaken the immune system.

The Church of Illumination states that "the teachings of the Church unequivocally affirm that injections of vaccines and inoculations are a violation of these biblical teachings... Immunizations and vaccinations are a form of blood pollution because they have devastating effects on the regeneration of the soul that each Church member seeks to attain."

The Universal Family Church believes that parents should decide whether their children should be vaccinated and that "God intends the health decisions of individuals should... be honored by all authorities."

The government shouldn't intervene in personal medical choices.

Medical decisions for children should be left to parents or caregivers. Barbara Loe Fisher, Co-founder of National Vaccine Information Center, stated, "If the State can tag, track down and force citizens against their will to be injected with biological products... there will be no limit on which individual freedoms the State can take away in the name of the greater good tomorrow."

Ron Paul, former US Representative (R-TX), stated, "intimately personal medical decisions should not be made by government.... Freedom over one's physical person is the most basic freedom of all, and people in a free society should be sovereign over their own bodies. When we give government the power to make medical decisions for us, we in essence accept that the state owns our bodies."

Further, some vaccines contain ingredients some parents consider immoral or otherwise objectionable; mandates infringe on those sincerely held beliefs. For example, some DTaP/IPV/Hib combination, Hep A/Hep B combination, HepA, MMR, and chickenpox vaccines are cultivated in cells from two fetuses aborted in the 1960s (listed as MRC-5 and WI-38 on package inserts). The Catholic Church, in a report about using vaccines made using cells from aborted fetuses, indicated that "there is a grave responsibility to use alternative vaccines" to avoid the "evil" of actively or passively participating in anything that involves abortion.

And some vaccines for DTaP, Hep A, RV, Hib, HPV, IPV, flu, MMR, and chickenpox are made using animal products like chicken eggs, bovine casein, insect cells, Cocker Spaniel cells, pig gelatin, and cells from African Green monkeys, making those vaccines conflict with some vegetarian and vegan philosophies. Others consider it problematic that some vaccines are produced using human albumin, a blood plasma protein.

My name is Dr. Casandra Simonson. I'm a pediatrician in Maui, where I have worked with the underserved and Native Hawaiian keiki for over 10 years. I'm speaking today on my own behalf and not representing anyone else, in strong support of HB1118. I love babies, I love their first smiles. I love helping parents find those little moments of joy in between the stress and the worry about whether or not their baby is doing well. As a parent to 3 keiki myself, I know parents never want their babies to feel pain or suffer. Your worst fear is that they could die.

I want to take this opportunity to do something that I should have already done, but was too afraid to do it. I want to apologize to my patients and families who are hesitant to immunize. I have often avoided talking much about immunizations with you out of fear. I didn't want to push you away. I didn't want you to reject me. Recently, I heard from a mother who had lost her daughter to meningitis. She said outright "my pediatrician never told me this could happen. If they would've warned me, I would've given my daughter the immunization that would have saved her life." It dawned on me that in my attempt to be friendly and approachable, that I was doing your child and you a disservice by not clearly telling you what it is like to watch a child to die from meningitis. Every time a family signs a refusal form, I see her. My memory flashes back to that hospital room and to the moans and wails of her mother and her father screaming her name. He screams and chokes out the words "I am so sorry I missed your birthday party." I see her pupils, fixed and staring, from the pressure of pus in her brain. My hand holding my stethoscope to her chest, hearing her heartbeats come further and further apart until they stop. I look up, still with my hand to her chest, and nod an acknowledgement to the family and nurse that she is gone. "Time of death." May you never hear those words. May I never speak them again. Every time you sign a immunization refusal, I relive this. And yet I haven't told you that story. I am a coward and I am sorry. I am here today to promise I will do better. I owe you an apology for the brief conversations about immunizations and for not better helping you process your feelings, your fears, the rumors that you've heard. I should've given you my time, my

energy, my patience because each of your keiki are worth it. Every keiki deserves protection. This bill will help protect us all.

Furthermore, the bill disregards the Fourteenth Amendment's Due Process Clause, which protects individuals from state-imposed medical procedures without consent. The Supreme Court in Washington v. Harper, 494 U.S. 210 (1990) ruled that "forcible injection of medication into a nonconsenting person's body represents a substantial interference with that person's liberty."

Additionally, the **Ninth Amendment** ensures that rights not explicitly listed in the Constitution are still retained by the people, which includes medical autonomy.

2. Precedents Against Mandatory Vaccination Policies

While the government has a legitimate interest in public health, its powers are not absolute. In Cruzan v. Director, Missouri Department of Health, 497 U.S. 261 (1990), the Court affirmed

2. HB1118 Violates Religious Freedom and Parental Rights

The First Amendment guarantees the right to freely exercise religion, and for many families, medical decisions—including vaccinations—are deeply intertwined with their faith. Forcing families to choose between their faith and their child's education is not pono.

3. The Bill Ignores the Lack of a Public Health Crisis

- Where is the data? HB1118 cites a rise in non-medical exemptions but does not demonstrate a corresponding rise in vaccine-preventable diseases.

My testimony in opposition to HB1118

My religious beliefs are very personal to me. I am guided in everything I do by my faith. To be able to practice my religion without judgment or question is simple human decency, and I find it very offensive for our Governor and Legislature to invade the spiritual realm of my life. In order to explain why vaccines conflict with my religious beliefs, I'm going to start by telling you a bit about my own personal background. I've been spiritual my whole life. As a child, I felt God's omnipresence at a young age. My spirituality has been shaped by my interpretation of the Bible as well as several other sources to include the Urantia book which is one of the primary religious texts I grew up with. My parents read it extensively and so I was very familiar with the truths contained in this book which was a shaping force in my life and my identity. It guided me thru difficult times and helped me appreciate and value the best times. For anyone not familiar with the Urantia Book, it is very much about God, the life and teachings of Christ Jesus, the order of the universe, and truth. It is not in itself a religion and it embraces no specific practices other than personal prayer conducted in your own individual way. It's not an exclusive belief system and is compatible with other openminded religious beliefs or faiths. It provides ways to see, believe, act, and live in order to become a better human and find happiness, meaning, and fulfillment, and describes 'religion' as a purely personal and spiritual experience. "Religion is ever and always rooted and grounded in personal experience." The Urantia Book (102:8.7) "...True religion is a meaningful way of living dynamically face to face with the commonplace realities of everyday life." The Urantia Book, (99:4.3) "Religion is destined to become the reality of the spiritual unification of all that is good, beautiful, and true in human experience." The Urantia Book, (5:4.7)

As with any relationship, my relationship with God has evolved throughout the years. It was during my time as a young adult that I got caught up in my sense of self, human ego, and materialistic desires. I became preoccupied with more of the physical sense of life and existence which left me regularly ignoring my built-in spiritual sense. Looking back, I had lost touch with my faith. During those years I would rarely feel a oneness with God or His infinite love. Good would often seem fragmented or temporary and I often felt burden on my shoulders and fear in my heart. I held onto a mortal sense of myself during this period where my identity was locked into a physical existence bound by material birth and extinguished by physical death, and this would act like an anchor on my life dragging on all of my thoughts and all of my actions. It was during this time that I was driven mostly by money and made decisions based primarily on material comforts and material discomforts and financial gain. It was during this period of my adult life that I did choose to vaccinate and would exclusively seek medical and pharmaceutical treatment options for illness and pain. In retrospect, all of those things made me weak and stole away at the unlimited spiritual being that I am. My wife and I eventually found ourselves locked into very costly litigation over an investment property that we owned in Florida. But it wasn't until my Dad died during his battle with gall bladder cancer that made me realize that there was something missing in my faith.

My Dad was only 55 years old when he passed on. He had always been a very strong and powerful man. I had put my faith into his doctors and the chemo and radiation they were administering. They explained it was working and causing his tumor to shrink. But all I could see was his physical body slowly weaken and whittle away and die. Right before his death he told us

that he was dying. It wasn't because of the tumor he explained, it was the chemo that was killing him. To me, it was like using dynamite for a rat problem in the basement of your house. Yeah the rat infestation would no longer exist. But neither would your house. For my Dad, the chemo and radiation attacked both the cancer cells and the good cells in his body. It shrunk the tumor but killed his immune system. After his death, I was plunged into a deep dark period of grief, I was angry. I was furious at his doctors, I was petrified of cancer, and I was angry at God. It wasn't that I began to question God's existence. I had far too much experience in my life so I knew that God existed. But I did begin to question God's all-goodness and His care and love for me.

What I needed was a deeper understanding of God. So I pulled out my bible and spent many months reading with one goal in mind, to find God and to gain a clearer understanding of His divine love that Christ Jesus knew so well. By doing this, I began to realize the infiniteness of God, of God as the eternal life, as our creator and the One that maintains each one of us at the point of health and safety in life. And Jesus's life on earth proved that this relationship we all have with God makes a huge difference in our daily lives. I began to realize, with respect to my fear of cancer, that fear is darkness. Fear is our perception of the absence of God's infinite good, and the second we perceive a little bit more, our relationship with God to that degree, fear begins to go away. Jesus taught us to challenge fear and to not get caught up in all the material sense of life. And so the way I found my freedom from all this anger and fear and financial stress and the loss of my dad was to open the light in my thoughts, to open the light to God, which is infinite light, and find the light within that disperses the darkness. Which is what I worked towards.

It wasn't until my wife and I decided to have children when I felt my faith fully transform me. I felt so loved by the allness of this infinite divine good that I turned even more to God and found the spiritual path that is right for me and my family. It was at this point where I truly began to believe in the healing message of God's great love as found in the Bible and the Urantia Book, and how to improve health and overcome disease through natural, holistic, and spiritual healing methods. This is when my family and I stopped ALL vaccination. My kids (currently age 12, 11, and 9) are the most vibrant and healthiest children I have ever seen and they have NEVER been vaccinated. My wife and I have filed religious waivers for vaccinations for all our children every year with the Hawaii State School System for their school, sports teams and extra-curricular activities. All three of our children were born at home naturally without any drugs or medication. This natural way is our way of life. It includes how we care for our entire health and well-being of the body, mind and soul through natural means supported by scripture. It is what I have found to be the most effective way for me to deal with medical needs.

It is my belief from Christ Jesus teachings and practice and prayer and my own personal relationship with Him, that I view God as divine good, as only good that never punishes, never causes sickness or pain or viruses or death but shows rather how to overcome them. I believe Christ Jesus showed the world the nature of God as love that enabled Him to heal through divine love. Jesus taught that there is an intersection between our spirituality and our daily experience. Scripture is very clear that health comes from God (Job 5:17-27; Hos. 6:1). Throughout almost all of the bible, medicine and physicians are seldom mentioned and reliance

on them is sometimes considered wrong or useless (Mark 5:26): "And who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse" (2 chron 16:12-13) "In the thirty-ninth year of his reign Asa was afflicted with a disease in his feet. Though his disease was severe, even in his illness he did not seek help from the Lord, but only from the physicians. Then in the forty-first year of his reign Asa died." (e.g. also see Luke 8:43-48; Mathew 7:13-14), while health and healing is attributed to God (for example, Exod. 15:26; 1 Kings 17:17-24; 2 Kings 5:1-14; Mark 6:7-13; Acts 3:1-10; Acts 9:32-35; James 5:14-15).

Based upon my experience and scripture, God has already provided the medicines we need to heal and maintain our health. It is not for us to use drugs and vaccines for medical care. I believe God created an abundance of natural healing remedies, and that it is in our best interest to tune in to his wisdom and educate ourselves in how to restore and/or maintain our health and wellness by the use of what he created for us. Among these incredible gifts are the oils and herbs of plants. God created them and gave us the intellect to discover and learn how to use them. Essential oils are the true essence of a plant and each plant has its own set of benefits that is different from any other plant. They provided people of ancient times with the tools needed to tend to the sick and keep themselves free of pain and disease. The bible has countless passages about healings and health. Mark 6:13, "...and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them." In fact essential oils from plants are mentioned almost two hundred times in the bible, and many of them are still in common use today. And there are numerous examples and scientific studies that show the many ways these plants can safely and effectively be put to use.

By learning how plants were used in the Bible, I have become more in touch with my faith, and feel closer to God and Christ Jesus as I use them in my everyday life. "With my holy oil have I anointed him" (Psalm 89:20); see also, Matthew 2:11. God spoke these words, and this simple act of anointment—in this case, directly from God—and shielded him from every adversary and illness for the rest of his life. By the time David became king, healing oils had been a pillar of health and spirituality for 1000s of years.

My family and I use many of these natural oils as medicine to protect against infection and treat illness and injuries. If we have a cold, or headache, or a respiratory issue, we have found that essential oils can be just as effective, or more so, as many over-the-counter medications—without all the side effects that come from a pill. Some essential oils also provide antiviral benefits, arguably going beyond what a pharmaceutical decongestant can accomplish. I personally rely on dragons blood (sap from dracaena cinnabari tree) for cuts and scrapes; oregano oil as my antibiotic; lavender and tea tree oils to calm any anxiety; frankincense for insect bites; kukui nut oil to heal sunburn, white willow bark for pain relief; eucalyptus for congestion, just to name a few.

When I was infected with COVID-19 during the pandemic, I never wavered in my faith, and my family didn't either. I took no medications nor received any medical care. I chose instead, as our family always does, to treat the illness solely with natural herbs and oils and prayer—and was able to get through it with relative ease. Another example, last year I had a surfing accident where my surfboard hit the bottom of my foot so hard that 3 of my toes folded backwards leaving 1 toe fully dislocated at the knuckle and hanging off to the side. I didn't go to

the emergency room; instead, my wife helped me get my toe back into place and, through prayer and the constant massaging of the injured area and white willow oil to ease the pain, I was able to find freedom and healing from that injury without any sort of medical intervention. Another example of how we incorporate natural healing into our spiritual journey, my wife has had numerous cases of skin cancer throughout her life with scars from multiple surgeries. Through prayer, my wife found God-inspired wisdom of the natural power of a combination of larrea, graviola, oleander and sanguinaria plant root extracts that has worked wonders on treating spots of skin cancer she has had over the past 10+ years. It has been an amazing thing to witness her apply it to spots of squamous and basel cell skin cancer and watch only the bad skin cells scab up while the good skin remains unaffected, and—a few days later—the skin cancer just falls out and her skin heals without any scarring. It's amazing. To rely upon your belief in spiritual power you will be strengthened inwardly by God's omnipotent power. Isaiah 40:29-31: "He gives power to the weak, and to those who have no might He increases strength..." The power of the Holy Spirit is the same power that "God raised Christ from the dead" Ephesians 1:19-20, and is the power that me and my family long have relied upon instead of medical interventions, pain killers, or vaccinations. I am one with God and seek wellness in the Holy Spirit, Romans 15:13: "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit". The power of God protects my family from disease for God can even raise the dead. Luke 7:14-15, God said, "Young man, I say to you, get up!" The dead man sat up and Jesus gave him back to his mother.

I could go on-and-on with examples but to keep from going too long I'll provide one last description of how my family and I use prayer and God's natural medicines to combat disease and remain healthy. After what happened to my own Dad when he died from his chemo and radiation treatment, it was no question, to my wife and I, how powerful and incredible of an immune system God created in us. This truth was further revealed this past year when my wife's 76-year old father (who lives with us) was diagnosed with stage-4 esophageal cancer and given a terminal diagnosis and less than 10 months to live. Based on the size and location of the tumor that was bleeding internally, his doctors at Kaiser said there wasn't anything they could do for him, but they wanted to put him on an aggressive dose/regime of chemo and radiation that could possibly help further the study and understanding of how this type of cancer reacts. After much praying, my wife immediately got him out of the hospital and got him on a natural cancer regimen based on nutritional and spiritual treatments which have literally transformed his life and turned him into a brand new person. Within months he was off of all his medications. All of his long standing pre-existing health conditions disappeared. He's no longer diabetic. His high blood pressure and high cholesterol are now perfect. He has lost over 70 pounds; he looks 20 years younger; feels strong, healthy, and happier; and is in the best shape he's been in for the past 30+ years. Even his gray hair has started to turn dark.

Another amazing aspect to this story is that a few months ago he had 3-straight days of a healing experience quite similar to those gospel accounts of healing when people came in contact with Christ Jesus and experience a sudden life-changing healing through prayer. It was incredible to see the tears of joy streaming down his face as he described being "visited" with heavenly energy in the location of his tumor: the first day it was warm energy that seemed to be working in and around his tumor for over 30 minutes. The next day he described this incredible

energy checking in and around that same location; and the third and final day, he described it as a "party" as if the energy was celebrating that he had been healed. This was such a momentous experience for our whole family that we recorded him on video as he described what had happened so we could document his experience. And I need to add that my father-in-law is a very scientific man, with 3 engineering degrees, so this entire experience has literally rocked his world. Every indication and test so far shows that his tumor is gone. And if you ask my father-in-law, he will straight-up tell you that he has been completely cured. This experience has been one of the most amazing things I have ever witnessed and just another amazing testimony to how we can all put God's word into practice and incorporate the tools that he has given us. My father-in-law had terminal cancer and given 10 months to live and he is now 10 months past his diagnosis and is fully of energy, vitality and is more vibrant than ever.

It is through prayer and scripture that guides me in all decisions I make in life. I believe in healing myself with prayer, nutrition, and the oils and herbs of God's plants and natural remedies instead of drugs, vaccines and surgery. I believe vaccination is an act of being unfaithful to God because I believe God enables immunity and keeps me and my family healthy. These religious beliefs are all I need for God to take care of me and my health. James 5:14-16, "Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." I believe that God wants us to gather in prayer to heal and use nature's oils and nature's remedies to heal. It is my religion to do the above and to strictly rely on the wisdom of God for my family's health needs without interference from any drugs or vaccine or medical intervention. It is with deep conviction that I do not vaccinate because of my religious beliefs.

I appreciate you taking the time to understand my deeply held personal religious beliefs regarding vaccinations and medical interventions. Please don't repeal the religious exemption from immunization requirements! Wishing you peace, happiness and health.

HB No. 1118 Proposes to repeal the religious exemption of immunizations for school children. I write in Strong Opposition to HB1118, the removal of religious exemptions to vaccination requirements.

- 1. Hawaii's proposed legislation, is a national outlier, as public opinion on exemptions has become more favorable in recent years:
 - Since COVID the percentage of those who "strongly support" school-related vaccination requirements has fallen sharply, from nearly half (47%) of U.S. adults in 2019 to barely a quarter (24%) in January 2025 (According to a survey published last week by the Annenberg Public Policy Center at the University of Pennsylvania).
 - Last month, West Virginia Gov. Patrick Morrisey issued an executive order allowing for religious exemptions from mandatory school vaccinations, ending one of the most restrictive vaccination policies in the country. West Virginia legislators are expected to introduce a bill to codify that executive order into law.
- Mississippi also began allowing religious exemptions in July 2023, Under a federal court order.
- 2. The bill intro claims we must sustain a 95% vaccination rate to obtain "herd immunity" and protect the immunocompromised who supposedly cannot receive vaccines (tho many do). This theory has been proven false over and over. Most vaccines on the CDC schedule are not sterilizing (i.e. Covid & Pertussis), only provide personal protection, or in fact actually create infectious shedding from the vaccine recipient. This is a known fact amongst live viral vaccines such as MMR, chickenpox, and Hepatitis A where recipients are advised to AVOID immunocompromised people after vaccination.

Aloha Chair, Vice Chair, and Committee Members,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to HB1118, which seeks to remove non-medical exemptions for vaccinations in order to attend school. While I understand the intention of this bill is to address concerns about rising non-medical exemptions, I believe it fails to consider important factors that affect both public health and parental rights.

1. Concerns About Vaccine Risks: One of the key concerns for many parents, including myself, revolves around the potential risks associated with vaccinations. For instance, the FDA Fact Sheet for the DAPTACEL vaccine (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis) includes a warning regarding Guillain-Barré Syndrome and Brachial Neuritis, two serious conditions that have been linked to the vaccine. The FDA states, "A review by the Institute of Medicine found evidence for a causal relation between tetanus toxoid and both brachial neuritis and Guillain-Barré syndrome." This means that after receiving the DAPTACEL vaccine, a child may be at increased risk for these serious conditions.

Furthermore, it's important to note that vaccine manufacturers are **not held liable** for adverse reactions that may occur after vaccination. This is a critical factor for parents when considering whether to vaccinate their children, as they cannot seek compensation for injuries that result from these vaccines. Given this, many parents feel it is vital to have the option to choose non-medical exemptions based on their personal beliefs and concerns.

- **2. The Right to Parental Autonomy:** Another significant concern with this bill is that it infringes upon parental rights. Every child is different, and what may be appropriate for one child may not be for another. This bill undermines parental autonomy and does not adequately address the concerns of parents who are worried about the risks associated with vaccination.

The U.S. Constitution identifies several constitutional provisions and legal precedents which protect individuals from unwanted medical procedures. The following are some of the most relevant sources:

1. The Fourteenth Amendment - Due Process Clause

- The **Substantive Due Process** doctrine under the **Fourteenth Amendment** protects individuals' bodily autonomy and personal liberty.
- The Supreme Court has ruled that individuals have a **constitutional right to refuse medical treatment** (e.g., *Cruzan v. Director, Missouri Department of Health*, 1990).

2. The Fourth Amendment – Protection Against Unreasonable Searches and Seizures

- The Fourth Amendment protects individuals from **unwarranted government intrusion** into their bodies.
- Courts have ruled that forced medical procedures, such as mandatory blood tests or vaccinations, constitute a search and require justification (Missouri v. McNeely, 2013).

3. The First Amendment – Religious Freedom

- The **Free Exercise Clause** protects individuals who refuse medical treatments based on religious beliefs.
- However, the government can override religious objections in cases where public health
 is at risk (Jacobson v. Massachusetts, 1905, upheld mandatory smallpox vaccinations).
- Yet, in this case, as a blanket Bill over the state of Hawaii public school system, with no probable cause or due process, the State cannot legally mandate vaccinations for all, nor unfairly target individuals with religious practices as it would negate the Constitutional rights of said individuals (*Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo (2020*).

4. The Eighth Amendment – Protection Against Cruel and Unusual Punishment

• In the prison context, **forced medical treatment** may violate the Eighth Amendment if it constitutes **cruel and unusual punishment** (*Washington v. Harper*, 1990, ruled that forced medication of prisoners is only allowed under specific legal standards).

5. Legal Precedents & Right to Privacy

• The Supreme Court has recognized a **right to bodily integrity** in cases such as *Washington v. Glucksberg* (1997), which upheld a patient's right to refuse life-sustaining treatment.

• Rochin v. California (1952) ruled that forced stomach pumping violated **due process**, reinforcing the right against non-consensual medical procedures.

It is evident that the Governor, along with his colleagues, is seeking to minimize the number of **non-medical exemptions** from immunization that are accepted for enrollment in Hawaii's public and charter schools.

According to HB No. 1118, during the 2023-2024 school year, **296 students** received medical exemptions due to illnesses that could increase their risk of fatality in the event of a **disease outbreak**. The total student enrollment in Hawaii for that school year was **167,649**. This means that the **296 medically high-risk students** accounted for only **0.176%** of the total student population across **258 public schools** and **37 charter schools**. This percentage represents an extremely low level of risk, making it highly questionable as a justification for the **disapproval and elimination** of non-medical or religious exemptions to immunization requirements within the HIDOE.

It is also clear that, due to the **increase in non-medical immunization exemptions** noted in HB No. 1118 for the 2023-2024 school year, the Governor is placing greater emphasis on protecting the **0.176% (296 medically vulnerable students)** who, according to the bill, rely on **herd immunity**, rather than considering the **89.98%** of students who comply with immunization requirements and the approximately **10%** who exercise their **First and Fourteenth Amendment rights** to exemption. The reasoning behind HB No. 1118 is **unjustifiable** and attempts to **disregard** the unalienable rights of Hawaii's citizens—particularly parents, guardians, and students—and their right to education.

Furthermore, if the state of Hawaii and the HIDOE require, enforce, or mandate vaccinations for all students—excluding only those with medical exemptions—will the state be willing to sign a legal contract ensuring that, in the event a student suffers adverse reactions, injuries, or even death due to any mandated immunizations under state regulations, the state will assume full responsibility for such outcomes?

Lastly, according to the VAERS database—which is no longer accessible online—reports of adverse reactions, injuries, and deaths resulting from vaccinations have significantly increased since 2021. Parents and guardians are becoming more informed and aware of such cases, leading to a rise in non-medical and religious exemptions for student enrollment—and rightfully so. It is the right and duty of parents and guardians to prioritize the highest level of well-being for their children and as a result parents are turning to natural health over traditional pharmaceuticals and experiencing greater success.

I am a parent of an almost 19-year-old who has never been vaccinated or taken antibiotics or medication of any kind—and he is very healthy. He has never had an ear infection, unlike many children who experience chronic issues, nor has he had any serious medical conditions. He has rarely required medical care, aside from routine vision and dental check-ups. Therefore, he serves as a strong testament to the unnecessary emphasis placed on vaccination requirements and the fear they generate.

Dear Members of the Comimittee,

I am writing to oppose HB1118, which proposes to remove religious exepmptions for school immunizations in Hawaii.

This bill proposes factors that are unconstitutional and contradictory to Hawaii's public education laws.

Foremost, everyone should have the right to his or her own medical decisions. How would you like it if you had no choice regarding a medical procedure but felt coerced to do so because it was a law? Do you have children? What if you were unsure of potential immunization risks for your child but was told that your child couldn't attend public education unless all immunizations were recieved. How would that make you feel?

As a parent, this bill scares me. It scares me because it proposes taking away my rights as a caregiver; the person solely responsible for my child. As a parent, I want my child to have access to public education just as children with disabilities have access to it. FAPE is the right of all students with disabilities to receive an education that meets their needs. There should not be a difference when it comes to religious beliefs and religious exemptions. A religious belief should not be discriminated and should be acknowledged; therefore allowing access to public education for those who have different religious beliefs.

HB1118 contradicts Hawaii's Public Education Laws: Adoption of Chapter 8-89 (a), "The department is committed to making all schools safe, inclusive, respectful, and supportive of all students by eliminating all discrimination, harassment, and bullying and providing a non-discriminatory learning environment that provides equal access to public education for all students and embraces the values of dignity and respect for one another".

If HB1118 is approved, it would be unlawful and contradict the law stated above.

One of the reasons for HB1118 is due to immunization rates declining. What does that data even present? Does that mean illnesses and have increasingly doubled? There is no data that supports that declining immunization rates in schools caused a significant increase in illnesses or immunization-preventable illnesses. The reason of immunization rates declining does not provide substantial rationale to propose a bill like HBIII8.

Another reason for HB1118 states that high immunization rates help protect kids who can't get vaccinated for medical reasons by creating herd immunity. There is reasearch that states not all immunizations are 100% effective with preventing and/or spreading disease/illnesses. So if we know this, then we know herd immunity is not guarenteed. For instance, we know the COVID-19 vaccination does not provide 100% immunity and we know individuals who received that vaccine can still get COVID-19 illness as well as spread it! So why propose a law when knowing that all immunizations will not protect other nor provide herd immunity? If those individuals with medical exemptions can't receive a vaccine, then this point proves that there is no substantial rationale for HB1118.

Another important reason why I oppose this bill is because not all individuals have the same reaction to immunizations and there have been presentable data-based studies on if and how immunizations propose a risk for cancer. For reference, on of the pamphlet for the vaccine ActHIB states, under NON-CLINICAL TOXICOLOGY 13.1, "ActHIB vaccine has not been evaluated for its carcinogenic or mutagenic potential or impairment of male fertility". Also under ADVERSE REACTIONS 6.1 Clinical Trials Experience, "More than 7,000 infants and young children have received at least on dose of ActHIB vaccine during US clinical trials. Of these, 1,064 subjects who received ActHIB vaccine alone reported no serious or life threatening adverse reactions". So does that mean that 75% of those other childred had serious and/or life threatening adverse reactions? If my religious beliefs include not subjecting my child to harm or potential substances that have not been studied for carcinogen effects, than that is my belief and it should be acknowledged in regards to access to public education.

My point is that there is a lack of safety and efficacy with immunizations. If bill HB1118 is approved, it would not increase vaccination rates in public schools. It would only significantly decrease the rates of enrollment in the public education system because it would be discriminating against religious beliefs.

Please continue to allow for religious exemptions in public schools.

Aloha,

I first want to thank each of you for how you serve our community, thank you. Secondly, I wanted to share with you why I believe it is so important that this bill is opposed. I have been living with injuries that seem to have a direct connection to a vaccine I received on May 19, 2021. Prior to receiving this vaccine, I had never questioned the importance or safety of vaccines. This experience has helped me to understand the importance of choice when it comes to vaccinations. This choice should be protected from a medical as well as a religious standpoint.

I have always been extremely athletic and active and was a former competitive swimmer. Since the vaccine I have been battling extensive side effects that boil down to symptoms of Mast Cell Activation Syndrome (meaning I have lost the ability to eat a host of foods that I never seemed to have a problem with prior to the vaccine including: citrus, dairy, soy, wheat, sugar, spinach, tofu, anything cooked slowly, many spices, walnuts, most nuts, papaya, avocado, coffee, most teas, and more), Postural Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS), and a nervous system injury. I was left with symptoms that include or have included extreme (and I do mean extreme cellular fatigue) fatigue, vertigo with the inability at first and now remaining difficulty: laying down, bending over, looking up or down, turning my head to the right or left, watching anything that spins, anything with bright lights particularly if they blink, looking at screens (this means I can typically no longer watch television or movies without pain or disorientation). I still struggle with tolerating the motion of planes, boats, escalators, elevators and the like. I also have and often still experience extreme eye pain, feelings of brain swelling and heat. I cannot even watch my children play basketball or people's facial expressions without those things often bringing on eye pain and or nausea. I have endured migraines and what seems to be a radically more intense procession feminine hormonal shifts and pain through the month which can include symptoms like: heart palpations, chills, body aches, muscle pain, wrestles leg syndrome and now some neuropathy.

Along this journey I have met and heard about many others who are battling very similar side effects. Nothing medically has seemed simple, and I am a fairly young woman still and had spent most of my life swimming, running, jumping, climbing, hiking, surfing – and most of these things were stripped from me. I will continue to work at healing, and I am so thankful for the doctors I have had on my journey thus far. I have had to battle to regain every inch of health that I can and while I have received and a great amount of healing over the past few years, I still

battle limitations I could never have expected to have to endure. This kind of unexpected hardship I would not wish upon anyone. With these kinds of medical difficulties potentially resulting how can anyone remove the right from a parent to shield their child from ever enduring this kind of challenge and pain. While vaccines do indeed help protect some, they may also be harming others – others who do not necessarily have a specific medical condition that can be easily identified – other than a potential for a genetic similarity to a parent who has had an adverse reaction. Parents must maintain the right to evaluate the risk for their loved ones based on their family medical history. And I'd venture to say that anyone who has walked through a crisis as I have, would then have a very real religious and moral objection to their loved one having to risk a similar medical emergency to be allowed the right to participate in a school environment.

This Bill removes 'non-medical exemptions' from vaccine requirements. Let's start by calling these exemptions by their proper name – religious exemptions. This Bill is not removing philosophical exemptions, which we do not currently have in the State of Hawaii. This Bill is removing the right to opt out of vaccinations, based on a family's religious beliefs. This is a constitutionally protected right and this Bill is a clear and direct infringement of mine and my family's constitutional right to practice our religious beliefs.

In addition to the Bill being clearly unconstitutional, it's foundation and purported purpose factually rests on extremely shaky ground.

The Bill's apparent concern is to protect children from 'an increasing trend in non-medical immunization exemptions.' Yet despite the rate of non-medical exemptions nearly doubling there has **not** been an increase 'in vaccine preventable diseases', but in many cases there has in fact been a decrease in disease. Here are a few examples:

- Pertussis: In 2014, Hawaii reported a total of 28 pertussis (whooping cough) cases. In 2024, the Hawaii Department of Health reported 27 pertussis cases statewide. Notably, 13 (48%) of these cases occurred in individuals who were up to date on their pertussis vaccinations.
- Measles: In 2014, Hawaii reported a total of 15 measles cases. In 2024, there were 0 measles cases

(Source: Hawaii Department of Health, Disease Outbreak Control Division)

In addition, the current religious exemption, which the Bill seeks to remove, is practiced by parents by submitting a form to the school entitled 'REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATION ON RELIGIOUS GROUNDS'. This form is provided by the Hawaii State Department of Health and has a clause in in that states the following

'I understand that if at any time there is, in the opinion of the Department of Health, danger of an outbreak or epidemic from any communicable disease for which immunization is required, this exemption from immunization shall not be recognized and my child will be excluded from school or his/her child care facility until the threat of an epidemic is over or he/she receives the proper immunization.'

This clause provides strong powers to the Department of Health to squash a parent's religious right in the event of what the Department deems a danger and gives full authority to the Department to make that determination.

In balancing the public interest with an individual's right to freely practice their religion and to bodily autonomy, I humbly ask that you consider the fact that (i) disease rates have not increased (but actually decreased), despite an increase in exemptions **and** (ii) we already have this clause available for the Department of Health to invoke if necessary, should the disease rates suddenly increase.

The Bill also seeks to protect 'medically fragile children' (at line 14) from exposure to vaccine preventable diseases.

There is however science that shows the opposite – that those who get vaccinated can actually be more of a potential threat to these medically fragile children. Why?

Most of these vaccinations are very effective at reducing symptoms, but a lot less effective at reducing transmission and the spread of the disease. For example in a JAMA 2016 study , first author is Phadke and colleagues, looked at all the US pertussis outbreaks after January of 2000, so in the modern era and found that 65 to 76% of everybody who got pertussis in the United States was fully or partially vaccinated against pertussis. A study by FDA scientists entitled 'Acellular pertussis vaccines protect against disease but fail to prevent infection and transmission in nonhuman primate model' was pivotal in showing that the pertussis bacteria still circulates despite vaccination and that those vaccinated were actually contagious for longer than those that weren't.

So, because the vaccinations are so effective at reducing symptoms, children that get the vaccination, and still get the disease won't feel as sick and will return to school much quicker, spreading the disease while still contagious. Versus an unvaccinated child who due to symptoms being much more pronounced will need to stay at home, meaning they will be less likely to spread the disease.

Another example, is this CDC study:

"Diphtheria toxoid helps prevent symptomatic disease, but does **not** prevent the carrier state nor stop the spread of infection ... [T]he known importance of carrier in the spread of diphtheria, and the demonstrated failure of toxoid to prevent the carrier state lead us to conclude that the concept of herd immunity is not applicable in the prevention of diphtheria.'

https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/5026197

So, for diphtheria disease it's the same as with pertussis—less symptoms when vaccinated, yet can still spread the infection.

For Tetanus, The CDC's website states that: 'Tetanus doesn't spread from person to person' https://www.cdc.gov/tetanus/causes/index.html

The CDC also says 'IPV protects people against all three types of poliovirus. IPV does not contain live virus and cannot cause disease. It protects people from polio disease but does not stop transmission of the virus.'

In addition, some vaccines such as Varivax (chickenpox) actually say in their insert to avoid contact with vulnerable individuals for 6 weeks after vaccinations. Do we exclude these vaccinated children from school?

I understand that it is generally accepted by the public that these childhood vaccines stop the spread of infection and that it is in the public interest to be up to date with these vaccines. But, in fact the CDC and FDA's own studies and websites indicate that although these vaccines stop the symptomatic disease, they do not stop the spread. For that reason, the choice to get vaccines is for that of personal protection and not in fact public.

In conclusion, not only does this Bill rest on shaky factual grounds, it rests on very shaky legal grounds, since it aims to remove a constitutionally protected right.

It is my deeply held belief that my body is the temple of my spirit. And that to force the injection of foreign materials, which include cells from aborted fetuses, is a complete violation of bodily autonomy and my personaly held belief that God has given me the choice of what enters my body. My name is Danielle De Lima, and I am a concerned citizen born and raised on the west side, a homesteader in Kapolei, a mother and most of all a believer and follower of Jesus. At the time we lived in California, and SB277 had passed removing vaccine exemptions. As we enter a new era of MRNA where vaccines such as the new Covid-19 vaccine are designed to modify human biology itself, having freedom of choice is more important than ever. The Hawai'i Legislature should not have the freedom to force any kind of medical product into a child, or remove a child's right to attend school. I will not even let my children eat a genetically modified apple. Why would I ever allow a product intended to genetically modify their own biology be injected into their bloodstream?

Please reject this authoritarian, heavy handed bill and continue to allow children to attend school exactly the way that God created them.

HB1118 is blatantly discriminatory against people who hold sincere religious beliefs or personal conviction against vaccinating their children.
