25 MUNITY COLLEGES FROM EXPENSE CLASS AND PROGRAM TRANSFER LIMITATIONS;  
26 EXEMPTING THE APPROPRIATION FOR HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS FROM EXPENSE  
27 CLASS TRANSFER LIMITATIONS; PROVIDING REAPPROPRIATION AUTHORITY FOR  
28 HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS; DIRECTING AN ADJUSTMENT FOR STUDENT TUITION  
29 AND FEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 FOR HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS; EXEMPTING  
30 THE APPROPRIATION FROM EXPENSE CLASS TRANSFER LIMITATIONS FOR POSTSEC-  
31 ONDARY PROGRAMS; PROVIDING FOR A CONTINUOUS APPROPRIATION FOR IDAHO  
32 PUBLIC TELEVISION; APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MONEYS FROM THE GEN-  
33 ERAL FUND TO THE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ACCOUNT; REQUIRING AN  
34 ACQUISITIONS REPORT; PROVIDING FOR ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS; AND DECLAR-  
35 ING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

38 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the State Board of Education  
39 and the Board of Regents of the University of Idaho the following amounts to  
40 be expended according to the designated programs and expense classes from

19 SECTION 3. EXEMPTIONS FROM EXPENSE CLASS AND PROGRAM TRANSFER LIMITA-  
 20 TIONS. The State Board of Education and the Board of Regents of the Univer-  
 21 sity of Idaho for College and Universities and the Office of the State Board  
 22 of Education are hereby exempted from the provisions of Section 67-3511(1),  
 23 (2), and (3), Idaho Code, allowing unlimited transfers between expense  
 24 classes and between programs for all moneys appropriated to them for the pe-  
 25 riod July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. Legislative appropriations shall  
 26 not be transferred from one fund to another fund unless expressly approved  
 27 by the Legislature.

28 SECTION 4. SYSTEMWIDE NEEDS. Of the amount appropriated in Section 1,  
 29 Subsection II. E. of this act, the following amounts may be used as follows:  
 30 (1) an amount not to exceed \$902,600 may be used by the Office of the State  
 31 Board of Education for systemwide needs that benefit all of the four-year in-  
 32 stitutions, including but not limited to projects to promote accountabil-  
 33 ity and information transfer throughout the higher education system; and (2)  
 34 an amount of approximately \$1,960,500 may be used for the mission and goals  
 35 of the Higher Education Research Council as outlined in State Board of Ed-  
 36 ucation Policy III.W., which includes awards for infrastructure, matching  
 37 grants, and competitive grants through the Idaho Incubation Fund program.

38 SECTION 5. STUDENT TUITION AND FEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025. Notwith-  
 39 standing the provisions of Section 67-3516(2), Idaho Code, the Division of  
 40 Financial Management may approve the expenditure of dedicated state funds  
 41 pursuant to the noncognizable process for student tuition and fees during  
 42 fiscal year 2025. Each of the institutions' budget requests for fiscal year  
 43 2026 shall reflect all adjustments so approved by the Division of Financial  
 44 Management.

1 SECTION 6. EXEMPTIONS FROM EXPENSE CLASS AND PROGRAM TRANSFER LIM-  
2 TATIONS. The State Board of Education of Education for Community Colleges  
3 is hereby exempted from the provisions of Section 67-3511(1), (2), and (3),  
4 Idaho Code, allowing unlimited transfers between expense classes and be-  
5 tween programs for all moneys appropriated to it for the period July 1, 2024,  
6 through June 30, 2025. Legislative appropriations shall not be transferred  
7 from one fund to another fund unless expressly approved by the Legislature.

8 SECTION 7. EXEMPTIONS FROM EXPENSE CLASS TRANSFER LIMITATIONS. The  
9 State Board of Education and the Board of Regents of the University of Idaho  
10 for Health Education Programs are hereby exempted from the provisions of  
11 Section 67-3511(1) and (3), Idaho Code, allowing unlimited transfers be-  
12 tween expense classes for dedicated fund moneys appropriated for the period  
13 July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. Legislative appropriations shall not be  
14 transferred from one fund to another fund unless expressly approved by the  
15 Legislature.

16 SECTION 8. REAPPROPRIATION AUTHORITY. There is hereby reappropriated  
17 to the State Board of Education and the Board of Regents of the University  
18 of Idaho for Health Education Programs any unexpended and unencumbered bal-  
19 ances appropriated or reappropriated to the State Board of Education and the  
20 Board of Regents of the University of Idaho for Health Education Programs  
21 from dedicated funds for fiscal year 2024 to be used for nonrecurring expen-  
22 ditures for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. The Office of the  
23 State Controller shall confirm the reappropriation amount, by fund, expense  
24 class, and program, with the Legislative Services Office prior to processing  
25 the reappropriation authorized herein.

26 SECTION 9. STUDENT TUITION AND FEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025. Notwith-  
27 standing the provisions of Section 67-3516(2), Idaho Code, the Division  
28 of Financial Management may approve the expenditure of dedicated funds  
29 pursuant to the noncognizable process for student tuition and fees during  
30 fiscal year 2025 for Health Education Programs. Each of the programs' budget  
31 requests for fiscal year 2026 shall reflect all adjustments so approved by  
32 the Division of Financial Management.

33 SECTION 10. EXEMPTIONS FROM EXPENSE CLASS TRANSFER LIMITATIONS. Post-  
34 secondary Programs within the Division of Career Technical Education are  
35 hereby exempted from the provisions of Section 67-3511(1) and (3), Idaho  
36 Code, allowing unlimited transfers between expense classes for all moneys  
37 appropriated to it for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. Leg-  
38 islative appropriations shall not be transferred from one fund to another  
39 fund unless expressly approved by the Legislature.

40 SECTION 11. CONTINUOUS APPROPRIATION. Idaho Public Television is  
41 hereby granted continuous appropriation authority for its Miscellaneous  
42 Revenue Fund for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, for the  
43 purpose of content production and related services from revenue sources  
44 provided by private donations.

1 SECTION 12. OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ACCOUNT. Moneys appropri-  
2 ated from the General Fund to the Scholarships and Grants Program for fiscal  
3 year 2024 that are unexpended and unencumbered on June 30, 2024, are hereby  
4 appropriated and shall be transferred by the Office of the State Controller  
5 to the Opportunity Scholarship Program Account created in Section 33-4303,  
6 Idaho Code.

7 SECTION 13. ACQUISITIONS. Consistent with the provisions of Chapter  
8 92, Title 67, Idaho Code, the State Department of Education is encouraged  
9 to engage in open, competitive acquisition processes. The State Department  
10 of Education shall provide a report to the Joint Finance-Appropriations  
11 Committee by December 1, 2024, on all contracts signed during fiscal year  
12 2024 for property valued at more than \$25,000. The report shall include  
13 for each contract: (a) the amount; (b) the duration; (c) the parties; (d)  
14 the subject; (e) whether the contract was awarded as a result of an open,  
15 competitive acquisition process or a sole source or other noncompetitive  
16 procurement pursuant to Section 67-9221, Idaho Code; and (f) the rationale  
17 for signing any sole source or other noncompetitive procurements.

18 SECTION 14. ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS. Funds specifically identified in  
19 statute or in an appropriation act as intended for a certain purpose may  
20 be used only for that purpose. Funds provided in this act are subject to  
21 accountability reports and management reviews in accordance with Section  
22 67-702, Idaho Code, provided the Legislative Services Office auditor has  
23 sufficient resources to conduct those reports. State agencies that are  
24 authorized to contract for outside audits shall submit those reports to the  
25 Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee when those reports become avail-  
26 able.

27 SECTION 15. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby  
28 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after  
29 July 1, 2024.
