(1) Every elective civil office shall be vacant upon the happening of either any of the following events at any time before the expiration of the term of such office, as follows: 1.(a) The resignation of the incumbent. 2.(b) His The death of the incumbent. 3.(c) His rRemoval of the incumbent from office by lawful procedure. 4.(d) The decision of a competent tribunal declaring his an elective
15 16 17	office vacant due to apparent abandonment or prolonged incapacity or absence, or other basis as determined by the tribunal, provided such apparent abandonment, prolonged incapacity, absence or other basis is

20 21	or county in which the duties of his office are to be exercised, or for which he may have been elected.
22 23	$\frac{6\cdot(f)}{f}$ A failure to elect <u>someone</u> at the proper election, there being no incumbent to continue in office until his a successor is elected and
24 25 26	qualified, nor other <u>lawful</u> provisions relating thereto for filling an <u>elective office</u> . $7.(g)$ A forfeiture of elective office as provided by any law of the
27 28	state. 8.(h) Conviction of an incumbent officeholder of any infamous crime

31 32	9-(i) The acceptance of a commission to any military office, either in the militia of this state, or in the service of the United States, which
33	requires the incumbent in the civil office to exercise his military du-

ties out of the state for a period of not less than sixty (60) days.
