13 14 15	<ul><li>(b) Participation in the immunization registry is voluntary;</li><li>(c) The parent or guardian is entitled to an accurate explanation of the complications known to follow such immunization.</li></ul>
16 17	(2) At the time information is initially collected regarding any child for entry into the registry created pursuant to this chapter, the parent or
18 19 20	guardian shall be notified that:  (a) They have the right under Idaho law to submit a statement pursuant to the provisions of sections 39-1118 and 39-4802, Idaho Code, which ex-
