1 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

2 SECTION 1. That Section 49-402C, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 49-402C. SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE PROGRAMS -- STANDARDIZED PLATE COLOR
5 AND DESIGN. (1) It is the intent of the legislature that special license
6 plates issued by the department be readily recognizable as plates from the
7 state of Idaho without losing the uniqueness for which the special plate was
8 designed and purchased. In addition, the legislature finds that the depart-
9 ment can operate in a more efficient, cost-effective manner by conforming
10 special plates to a basic color and design.

11 (2) No special license plates and no special license plate programs in
12 existence on or before June 30, 1998, shall be affected by the provisions of
13 subsections (2) through (5) of this section. On and after July 1, 1998, any
14 new special license plate program authorized or any redesign of an exist-
15 ing special license plate shall use the same red, white and blue background
16 as the standard issue of license plates described in section 49-443, Idaho
17 Code, except that:

18 (a) The identification of county shall be omitted;

19 (b) The word "Idaho" shall appear on every plate;

20 (c) The inscription "Scenic Idaho" may be omitted without legislative
21 consideration and approval; and

22 (d) No slogan shall be used that infringes upon, dilutes or compro-
23 mises, or could be perceived to infringe upon, dilute or compromise, the
24 trademarks of the state of Idaho, including, but not limited to, "Idaho
25 Potatoes®," "Grown in Idaho™," "Famous Idaho Potatoes™" or "Famous
26 Potatoes®."

27 The provisions of this section shall not apply to the plate designs issued
28 pursuant to the provisions of section 49-417, Idaho Code.

29 (3) Any redesign required for a special plate to conform with legisla-
30 tive intent and the provisions of this section may be done in a manner similar
31 to that used to produce the original design.

32 (4) The special plates shall conform in all other respects with the pro-
33 visions of section 49-443, Idaho Code, relating to visibility requirements,
34 display of registration number, time period for validity of plates, and
35 reservation of plate numbers.

36 (5) Unless otherwise specifically provided, no special license plates
37 shall be issued to motor vehicles with a registered maximum gross weight in
38 excess of twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds if registered commercial or
39 sixty thousand (60,000) pounds if registered noncommercial, or any motor
40 vehicle registered under section 49-434(5), Idaho Code, or section 49-435,
41 Idaho Code.

42 (6) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on and
43 after July 1, 2020, no new special license plate or special license plate
44 program shall be established for the benefit of any entity that is not the
45 state of Idaho or an agency of the state of Idaho. With respect to any spe-
46 cial license plate program that is in existence on July 1, 2020, that has a
47 nonprofit agency as a recipient of the proceeds from the sales of such plate,
48 if fewer than one thousand (1,000) plates are issued in the first year of

1 the special plate program's existence, fewer than one thousand five hundred
 2 (1,500) plates are issued in the second year of the special plate program's
 3 existence, or fewer than two thousand (2,000) plates in the third or any sub-
 4 sequent year of such special plate program's existence, the department shall
 5 discontinue that special license plate program.

6 (7) With respect to a special license plate that has been discontinued
 7 prior to July 1, 2020, or is discontinued after that date for any reason, any
 8 existing plates may be renewed upon their expiration until the physical li-
 9 cense plates must be replaced pursuant to section 49-443(2), Idaho Code. No
 10 duplicate or replacement plates will be produced if such plates are lost or
 11 damaged.

12 SECTION 2. That Section 49-403B, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 13 amended to read as follows:

14 49-403B. GOLD STAR -- LICENSE PLATES. (1) In this section:

15 (a) "Qualifying cause of death" means a death of a person while serving
 16 in the armed forces of the United States on active duty as the division
 17 of veterans services may define by rule.

18 (b) "Qualifying family member" means a surviving spouse, parent, step-
 19 parent, child, stepchild, sibling, half-sibling, stepsibling, grand-
 20 parent, or legal guardian:

21 (i) Of a person who died due to a qualifying cause of death; or

22 (ii) Who has been awarded a gold star lapel pin.

23 (2) Qualifying family members are eligible to apply for gold star li-
 24 cense plates. As proof of eligibility, the applicant shall furnish to the
 25 department a statement from the division of veterans services certifying el-
 26 igibility.

27 (3) The division of veterans services shall establish by rule the re-
 28 quirements for receipt of a certificate of eligibility, including proof of
 29 qualifying familial relationship to the deceased service member, the death
 30 of the service member due to a qualifying cause of death, or proof of having
 31 been awarded a gold star lapel pin.

32 (4) No special plate program fee shall be charged in addition to regu-
 33 lar registration or renewal of registration of a motor vehicle owned by the
 34 spouse, parent, or stepparent of a service member who receives gold star li-
 35 cense plates.

36 (5) A qualifying family member who is not the spouse, parent, or step-
 37 parent shall be charged the regular registration fee and plate fee required
 38 in section 49-450, Idaho Code, and an additional fee of thirty-five dollars
 39 (\$35.00) for the initial issuance of plates and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)
 40 upon each succeeding annual registration. Ten dollars (\$10.00) of the ini-
 41 tial fee and ten dollars (\$10.00) of the renewal fee shall be deposited in
 42 the state highway account and shall be used to fund the cost of administra-
 43 tion of this gold star license plate program. Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)
 44 of each initial fee and fifteen dollars (\$15.00) of each renewal fee shall
 45 be deposited in the veterans support fund, section 65-209, Idaho Code, and
 46 shall be used to defray the costs of administration of the eligibility certi-
 47 fication program and to provide programs to support veterans.

48 (6) Gold star license plates shall be used only on a motor vehicle owned
 49 by the qualifying family member.

1 (7) Whenever title or interest in a motor vehicle registered under this
2 section is transferred or assigned, the registration shall expire, but the
3 qualifying family member may transfer the gold star license plates to an-
4 other motor vehicle upon payment of the required transfer fees. The qualify-
5 ing family member may display the gold star license plates only after receipt
6 of new registration from the department.

7 (8) A qualifying family member shall not register more than two (2)
8 motor vehicles under this section. ~~This section shall not apply to any mo-~~
9 ~~tor vehicle with a registered maximum gross weight over twenty-six thousand~~
10 ~~(26,000) pounds, nor to any vehicle registered under section 49-434(5),~~
11 ~~Idaho Code.~~

12 (9) Gold star license plates may be retained and displayed on motor ve-
13 hicles owned by the surviving spouse of a qualifying family member. In ad-
14 dition, the surviving spouse is eligible to reapply for and shall be issued
15 gold star license plates if the deceased qualifying family member died on or
16 after January 1 of the five (5) years preceding the date of reapplication for
17 the gold star license plates. Such plates shall be used only on a motor vehi-
18 cle owned by the surviving spouse of the qualifying family member.

19 (10) The gold star license plates shall be of a color and design ac-
20 ceptable to the veterans affairs commission and approved by the department,
21 utilizing a numbering system as determined by the department. Gold star
22 license plates shall not be subject to discontinuance pursuant to section
23 49-402C(6), Idaho Code.

24 SECTION 3. That Section 49-404, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
25 amended to read as follows:

26 49-404. NATIONAL GUARD MEMBERS -- DISTINCTIVE PLATES. (1) In order to
27 enhance visibility and identification of national guard members during mo-
28 bilizations and emergencies, any active member of the Idaho national guard
29 residing in the state of Idaho may, upon application to the department, reg-
30 ister not more than two (2) motor vehicles and receive for each vehicle dis-
31 tinctive national guard license plates in lieu of regular license plates.
32 ~~The provisions of this section shall not apply to any vehicle with a regis-~~
33 ~~tered maximum gross weight over twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds.~~ The
34 national guard license plates shall be designed, subject to the approval of
35 the department, by the adjutant general. Proof of being an active member in
36 the Idaho national guard must be furnished to the department before plates
37 will be issued.

38 The Idaho national guard shall, prior to an individual's discharge from
39 active duty in the national guard, require that the national guard license
40 plates either be turned in to the department or exchanged for other proper
41 license plates as a condition of discharge.

42 (2) Whenever a member of the Idaho national guard transfers or assigns
43 his title or interest to a vehicle especially registered under the provi-
44 sions of this section, the registration shall expire but the member may hold
45 his national guard license plates which he may have reissued to him upon the
46 payment of the required transfer fees. He may only display the plates after
47 receipt of new registration from the department.

1 (3) In addition to the regular registration fees required in section
2 49-402(1) or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the national guard member shall pay the
3 plate fee specified in section 49-450, Idaho Code.

4 SECTION 4. That Section 49-404A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
5 amended to read as follows:

6 49-404A. MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES RESERVE -- SPECIAL PLATES. (1)
7 Any active member of the armed forces reserves of the United States who is the
8 owner of a vehicle registered under section 49-402(1) or section 49-434(1),
9 Idaho Code, may, upon application to the department, register not more than
10 two (2) motor vehicles and receive for each vehicle special license plates
11 in lieu of regular numbered plates. ~~The provisions of this section shall~~
12 ~~not apply to any vehicle with a registered maximum gross weight over twenty-~~
13 ~~six thousand (26,000) pounds.~~ The special license plates shall be desig-
14 nated by the department with the word "RESERVIST" centered along the bottom
15 edge and be numbered in sets of two (2) with a different number following ap-
16 propriate letters as follows: United States Army Reserve: Army (number);
17 United States Navy Reserve: Navy (number); United States Marine Corps Re-
18 serve: USMC (number); United States Air Force Reserve: USAF (number); and
19 United States Coast Guard Reserve: USCG (number). Proof of being an ac-
20 tive member in the United States armed forces reserves must be furnished to
21 the department before special plates will be issued. Special license plates
22 issued under this section shall be issued under the staggered registration
23 process provided for in section 49-402(1), Idaho Code, or the annual regis-
24 tration in section 49-434(1), Idaho Code.

25 (2) Any branch of the armed forces reserves of the United States shall,
26 prior to an individual's discharge from duty in that branch of the armed
27 forces reserve, require that the special armed forces reserve license plates
28 either be turned back to the department or exchanged for other proper license
29 plates as a condition of discharge.

30 (3) In addition to the regular registration fees required in section
31 49-402(1) or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the applicant shall pay the initial pro-
32 gram fee and the annual program fee specified in section 49-402, Idaho Code.
33 The initial program fee and the annual program fee shall be deposited in the
34 state highway account and shall be used to fund the cost of administration of
35 this special license plate program which is provided to the public as a per-
36 sonal alternative to the standard license plate requirement. When a plate
37 holder transfers or assigns his title or interest in the vehicle registered
38 under this section, the registration shall expire, but the special plates
39 may be transferred to another vehicle upon payment of the required transfer
40 fee. Special plates shall only be displayed after receipt of the new regis-
41 tration.

42 (4) The design and numbering scheme of the military reservist special
43 plate shall be coordinated by the department with representatives of the
44 armed forces reserves. However, the department shall have the final ap-
45 proval of the plate design and numbering scheme to ensure conformity within
46 existing issues of plates and to contain costs within the limit of the fees
47 received from applicants.

1 SECTION 5. That Section 49-405, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 49-405. RADIO AMATEURS -- SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES. (1) In order to en-
4 hance visibility and identification of radio amateurs during times of emer-
5 gency, any radio amateur residing in the state of Idaho may, upon application
6 to the department, register one (1) motor vehicle per radio license issued by
7 the federal government and receive for that vehicle special license plates
8 in lieu of regular license plates. ~~The provisions of this section shall not~~
9 ~~apply to any vehicle with a registered maximum gross weight over twenty-six~~
10 ~~thousand (26,000) pounds.~~ The number on the plates shall be the same combi-
11 nation of figures and letters that make up the radio call sign of the amateur
12 radio operator.

13 (2) The radio amateur license plate shall be of a color and design in
14 accordance with the provisions of section 49-402C, Idaho Code. The distin-
15 guishing features of the license plate shall be:

- 16 (a) A representation of a radio tower emitting radio waves in the form
17 of lightning bolts with the phrase "Amateur Radio" beneath it;
18 (b) The phrase "CQ DE" spelled out in international Morse code; and
19 (c) The phrase "Emergency Communication" at the bottom of the plate and
20 underneath the call sign.

21 (3) The design and any slogan on the plate shall be acceptable to the
22 Idaho section of the American radio relay league. Any future design or re-
23 design of the plate shall also be approved by the Idaho section of the Ameri-
24 can radio relay league. Initial costs of the plate program, including costs
25 of plate design, shall be borne by the department.

26 (4) Proof of holding an amateur license from the federal communications
27 commission must be furnished to the department before the plates will be is-
28 sued. Should the amateur's radio license expire during any given year and
29 not be renewed, the special license plates must be surrendered to the depart-
30 ment and regular license plates obtained.

31 (5) Radio amateurs will notify the department at a time to be set by the
32 department of their intention to procure special license plates under the
33 terms specified in this section. Failure to do so will result in the ama-
34 teur being required to accept regular license plates should the department
35 be unable to procure the special plates. Special plates may still be pro-
36 cured when available, but amateurs will be subject to the usual transfer fee.

37 (6) Whenever an amateur transfers or assigns his title or interest to
38 a vehicle especially registered, the registration shall expire but the ama-
39 teur may hold his special license plates, which he may have reissued to him
40 upon the payment of the required transfer fees. He may display the plates
41 only after receipt of new registration from the department.

42 (7) In addition to the regular registration fees required in section
43 49-402(1) or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the applicant shall pay the plate fee
44 specified in section 49-450, Idaho Code.

45 SECTION 6. That Section 49-407, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
46 amended to read as follows:

47 49-407. YEAR OF MANUFACTURE PLATE. (1) Pursuant to rules of the de-
48 partment, any person who is the owner of a motor vehicle with any model

1 year up to and through 1974 which is registered under section 49-402(1),
2 Idaho Code, or section 49-434(1), Idaho Code, may display on the rear of the
3 vehicle an authentic Idaho plate manufactured with a painted or embossed
4 year matching the model year of the vehicle. ~~The provisions of this section~~
5 ~~shall not apply to any vehicle with a registered maximum gross weight over~~
6 ~~twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds.~~

7 (2) In addition to the regular registration fees required in sections
8 49-402(1), and 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the applicant shall pay the initial
9 program fee and the annual program fee specified in section 49-402, Idaho
10 Code. All revenues from the initial program fee and the annual program fee
11 shall be deposited in the state highway account.

12 SECTION 7. That Section 49-408, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
13 amended to read as follows:

14 49-408. STREET ROD. (1) Any motor vehicle manufactured prior to the
15 year 1949, or designed and manufactured to resemble such a vehicle and which
16 has been certified as a street rod may be registered as a street rod under the
17 provisions of this section. ~~However, the provisions of this section shall~~
18 ~~not apply to any vehicle with a registered maximum gross weight over twenty-~~
19 ~~six thousand (26,000) pounds.~~

20 (2) Any street rod shall have all equipment in operating condition
21 which was specifically required by law as a condition for its first sale
22 after manufacture. No law requiring any particular equipment or specifying
23 any standards to be met by motor vehicles shall apply to street rods unless it
24 so specifically states.

25 (3) Upon receipt of an application on a form prescribed by the depart-
26 ment for a special street rod automobile plate, accompanied by other docu-
27 mentation required in this section, the department shall issue to the ap-
28 plicant a special street rod automobile plate which shall be displayed on
29 the rear of the vehicle. The registration certificate need not specify the
30 weight of the street rod, and the plate issued shall bear no date but shall
31 bear the inscription "Street Rod," "Idaho," a picture of a 1929 highway road-
32 ster, and the registration number issued for the street rod, and the plate
33 shall be valid upon annual renewal under section 49-402 or 49-434(1), Idaho
34 Code, as long as the vehicle is in existence. The plate will be issued for the
35 applicant's use only for the particular vehicle, and in the event of a trans-
36 fer of title, the transferor may hold the plate and transfer it to another
37 qualifying street rod.

38 (4) In addition to the regular registration fees required in section
39 49-402(1) or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the applicant shall pay the initial pro-
40 gram fee and the annual program fee specified in section 49-402, Idaho Code.
41 All revenues from the initial program fee and the annual program fee shall be
42 deposited in the state highway account.

43 (5) The department has the power to revoke any registration issued un-
44 der this section for cause shown for failure of the applicant to comply with
45 the provisions of this section.

46 SECTION 8. That Section 49-408A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
47 amended to read as follows:

1 49-408A. CUSTOM VEHICLE LICENSE PLATES. (1) Any motor vehicle that
2 is a replica vehicle pursuant to section 49-123(2)(n), Idaho Code, and is
3 designed and manufactured to resemble a vehicle or motorcycle that would
4 qualify for Idaho classic license plates pursuant to section 49-406A, Idaho
5 Code, may be registered as a custom vehicle under the provisions of this
6 section. ~~The provisions of this section do not apply to any vehicle with a~~
7 ~~registered maximum gross weight over twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds.~~

8 (2) A vehicle must be in compliance with Idaho law with respect to its
9 equipment and operating condition to qualify for a custom vehicle license
10 plate under this section.

11 (3) Upon receipt of an application on a form prescribed by the depart-
12 ment for a custom vehicle license plate, accompanied by other documentation
13 that may be required to verify that a vehicle qualifies under this section,
14 the department shall issue to the applicant a custom vehicle license plate
15 that shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle. The registration cer-
16 tificate need not specify the weight of the custom vehicle. The license
17 plate issued shall bear no date but shall bear the inscription "Custom Ve-
18 hicle," "Idaho," and the registration number issued for the custom vehicle,
19 and the license plate shall be valid upon annual renewal under section 49-402
20 or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, as long as the vehicle is in existence. The license
21 plate will be issued for the applicant's use only for the particular vehicle,
22 and, in the event of a transfer of title, the transferor may hold the license
23 plate and transfer it to another qualifying custom vehicle.

24 (4) In addition to the regular registration fees required in section
25 49-402(1) or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, the applicant shall pay the initial pro-
26 gram fee and the annual program fee specified in section 49-402, Idaho Code.
27 All revenues from the initial program fee and the annual program fee shall be
28 deposited in the state highway account.

29 (5) The department has the power to revoke any registration issued un-
30 der this section for cause shown for failure of the applicant to comply with
31 the provisions of this section.

32 SECTION 9. That Section 49-409, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
33 amended to read as follows:

34 49-409. PERSONALIZED LICENSE PLATES. (1) Any person who is the owner
35 of a vehicle registered under section 49-402 or 49-434(1), Idaho Code, may
36 apply to the department for personalized license plates in lieu of regular
37 numbered plates ~~except that this provision shall not apply to a vehicle~~
38 ~~registered under section 49-434(1), Idaho Code, with a maximum gross weight~~
