SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 102

A JOINT MEMORIAL

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, TO THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION REPRESENTING THE STATE OF IDAHO IN THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, TO THE SECRETARY OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE SECRETARY OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho assembled in the First Regular Session of the Sixty-second Idaho Legislature, do hereby respectfully represent that:

WHEREAS, the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) is administered by the states on behalf of the United States Department of Agriculture, and the states are subject to the rules promulgated by the United States Department of Agriculture and Congress; and

WHEREAS, the health and welfare of the citizens of Idaho can be affected by their consumption of food items purchased with SNAP benefits; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive healthy Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) for Idaho citizens would include Idaho grown and produced products; and

WHEREAS, individuals who participate in healthy eating choices have less chance of developing chronic diseases and therefore, are able to be more productive employees and involved in their families' lives; and

WHEREAS, our children's futures and consequently the future of our nation are directly impacted by the food choices that are made for our children; and

WHEREAS, SNAP recipients should be encouraged to increase consumption of whole grains, fat-free and low-fat milk and fruits and vegetables; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Idaho may at this time purchase items with SNAP benefits that are not beneficial to their health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, taxpayers have a right to expect that their tax dollars will purchase fresh, healthy food that meets nutritional standards that will not contribute to health issues and higher medical costs; and

WHEREAS, unhealthy food items include, but are not limited to, energy drinks defined as a beverage containing at least sixty-five milligrams of caffeine per eight fluid ounces that is advertised as being specifically designed to provide metabolic stimulation or an increase to the consumer's mental or physical energy; a sweetened beverage or "soft drink" defined as any nonalcoholic beverage to which a natural or artificial sweetener is added; packaged cookies, candy, chips and other "junk food" with no nutritional value; and

WHEREAS, it is important that citizens receiving SNAP benefits be encouraged to spread their food dollars throughout the month through the use of coupons and sales and wise shopping habits; and

WHEREAS, numerous community organizations are eager to partner with low-income families and offer skills that could lead to permanent jobs and less dependency on taxpayer funded benefits; and

WHEREAS, Idaho is experiencing increasing medical costs that could be lessened through proper nutrition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the First Regular Session of the Sixty-second Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the Legislature calls upon the President of the United States, the Secretary of Agriculture and Congress to give Idaho the flexibility to prohibit the purchase of unhealthy food items with Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits and to encourage healthy eating and lifestyle choices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Idaho should be given the flexibility to determine the best methods of helping our citizens create a comprehensive state-based approach to promote physical activity, nutritional food selections and healthy lifestyle choices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Memorial to the President of the United States, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of Congress, to the congressional delegation representing the State of Idaho in the Congress of the United States, to the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture and the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
