1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2053

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 2053, by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. The amount of \$321,150,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund to the Department of Corrections for ordinary and
8 contingent expenses, statewide hospitalization, permanent
9 improvements, but not including personal services.

10 ARTICLE 2

11 Section 1. The sum of \$75,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Human

1 Services from the General Revenue Fund for operational
2 expenses, but not including personal services.

3 ARTICLE 3

4 Section 1. The amount of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
6 Fund to the Department of Revenue for ordinary and contingent
7 expenses and refunds, but not including personal services.

8 ARTICLE 4

9 Section 1. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
11 Fund to the Department of Agriculture for ordinary and
12 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

13 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the
15 Department of Agriculture for:

3 ARTICLE 5

4 Section 1. The amount of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof
 5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 6 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for ordinary and
 7 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

8 ARTICLE 6

9 Section 1. The amount of \$2,945,000, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 11 Fund to the Department of State Police for ordinary and
 12 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

13 ARTICLE 7

14 Section 1. The amount of \$650,000, or so much thereof as
 15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 16 Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for ordinary and
 17 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

18 ARTICLE 8

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 2 Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for
 3 ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal
 4 services.

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much

13 Section 1. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof

18 Section 1. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity

1 for ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including
2 personal services.

3 ARTICLE 14

4 Section 1. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
6 Fund to the Illinois Arts Council for ordinary and contingent
7 expenses, but not including personal services.

8 ARTICLE 15

9 Section 1. The amount of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
11 Fund to the Governor's Office of Management and Budget for
12 ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal
13 services.

14 Section 5. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
16 Fund to the Governor's Office of Management and Budget for
17 deposit into the Grant Accountability and Transparency Fund.

18 ARTICLE 16

1 Section 1. The amount of \$342,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for ordinary and
4 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

5 ARTICLE 17

6 Section 1. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for ordinary and
9 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

10 ARTICLE 18

11 Section 1. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on December 31, 2016, from appropriations heretofore
14 made for such purpose in Article 191, Section 1 of Public Act
15 99-524, is reappropriated from the Budget Stabilization Fund
16 to the Office of the Secretary State for ordinary and
17 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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19 Section 5. The amount of \$53,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on December 31, 2016, from appropriations heretofore

1 made for such purpose in Article 214, Section 85 of Public
2 Act 99-524, is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund
3 to the Office of the Secretary State for ordinary and
4 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

5 ARTICLE 19

6 Section 1. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Office of the Comptroller for ordinary and
9 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

10 ARTICLE 20

11 Section 1. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Department of Labor for ordinary and contingent
14 expenses, but not including personal services.

15 ARTICLE 21

16 Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
18 Fund to the Illinois Labor Relations Board for ordinary and
19 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 22

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Section 1. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Criminal Justice Information Authority for ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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Section 5. The sum of \$6,071,700 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for administrative costs, awards and grants for the Adult Redeploy and Diversion programs.

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Section 10. The sum of \$443,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on December 31, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General Assembly which reappropriated Article 216, Section 15 of Public Act 99-0524, is reappropriated from the Commitment to Human Services Fund to the Criminal Justice Information Authority for all costs associated with Bullying Prevention.

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Section 15. The sum of \$4,479,400, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on December 31, 2016, from a reappropriation
3 heretofore made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th
4 General Assembly which reappropriated Article 216, Section 10
5 of Public Act 99-0524, is reappropriated from the Commitment
6 to Human Services Fund to the Criminal Justice Information
7 Authority for grants and administrative expenses related to
8 Operation CeaseFire.

9 Section 20. The amount of \$1,053,300, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
11 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority
12 for the Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Council
13 Program.

14 ARTICLE 23

15 Section 1. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Commission for ordinary
18 and contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

15 Section 1. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for ordinary
18 and contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 28

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Section 1. The amount of \$639,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
4 Fund to the Illinois Community College Board for ordinary and
5 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 29

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Section 1. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
9 Fund to the Executive Ethics Commission for ordinary and
10 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 30

10 Section 1. The amount of \$25,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
12 Fund to the Civil Service Commission for ordinary and
13 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

14 ARTICLE 34

15 Section 1. The amount of \$230,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the State Universities Civil Service System for
18 ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal
19 services.

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ARTICLE 35

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Section 1. The amount of \$25,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Independent Tax Tribunal for ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 36

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Section 1. The amount of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for ordinary and contingent expenses and other disbursements, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 37

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Section 1. The amount of \$6,350,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of the Treasurer for ordinary and contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

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ARTICLE 38

1 Section 1. The amount of \$50,000 or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Court of Claims for ordinary and contingent
4 expenses, but not including personal services.

5 ARTICLE 39

6 Section 1. The amount of \$330,000 or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the State Board of Elections for ordinary and
9 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

10 ARTICLE 40

11 Section 1. The amount of \$25,000 or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Procurement Policy Board for ordinary and
14 contingent expenses, but not including personal services.

15 ARTICLE 41

16 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for a grant
19 to Joliet Junior College for costs associated with

1 construction of the City Center campus.

2 Section 10. The sum of \$14,633,402, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for grants
5 and other capital improvements awarded under the Community
6 Health Center Construction Act.

7 Section 15. The following named sums, or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated from the Build
9 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the
11 project hereinafter enumerated:
