2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 314 by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof with the following:

5 "Section 5. Public Act 95-734, as vetoed, reduced, and
6 restored, is amended by changing Section 10 of Article 7 as
7 follows:

9 Sec. 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board
11 of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
