A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

4 Section 20. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary, is appropriated from the Oil Spill Response Fund
6 to the Environmental Protection Agency for use in accordance
7 with Section 25c-1 of the Environmental Protection Act.

8 Section 25. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Environmental
10 Protection Trust Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency
11 for awards and grants as directed by the Environmental
12 Protection Trust Fund Commission.

13 Section 30. The sum of \$23,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Environmental
15 Protection Agency from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund for deposit into
16 the Vehicle Inspection Fund.

 13 education and training for renewable energy and energy

 20 2022 (IRA).

21 Section 155. The sum of \$131,453,000, or so much thereof
 22 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the EPA Energy

1 Projects Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
2 expenses and grants connected with the HEEHRA Rebate Program
3 as authorized by Section 50122 of the Inflation Reduction Act
4 of 2022 (IRA).

5 Section 160. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the EPA Energy Projects
7 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for expenses and
8 grants connected with energy programs, including prior year
9 costs.

10 Section 165. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Energy Fund
12 to the Environmental Protection Agency for expenses and grants
13 connected with the State Energy Program, including prior year
14 costs.

15 Section 170. The sum of \$14,260,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Energy Fund
17 to the Environmental Protection Agency for costs associated
18 with State Energy Programs as authorized by Title I of Division
19 D in Section 40109 of the Infrastructure and Investment and
20 Jobs Act (IIJA).

21 Section 175. The sum of \$15,310,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Energy Fund

3 ARTICLE 2

4 Section 5. The sum of \$80,000,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, and remains unexpended, at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2023, from the appropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 95, section 5, of Public Act 102-0698 as
8 amended, is reappropriated from the VW Settlement Environmental
9 Mitigation Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for all
10 costs, including administrative expenses, associated with
11 funding eligible mitigation actions that achieve reductions of
12 emissions in accordance with the Environmental Mitigation Trust
13 Agreement relating to the Partial Consent Decree between U.S.
14 Department of Justice, Volkswagen AG and other settling
15 defendants.

16 Section 10. The sum of \$1,858,777, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, and remains unexpended, at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2023, from the appropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 95 Section 10, of Public Act 102-0698 as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Energy Efficiency Trust
21 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for grants pursuant
22 to subsection (b) of Section 6-6 of the Renewable Energy, Energy

1 Efficiency, and Coal Resources Development Law of 1997.

2 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
3 2023.
