ARTICLE 2

22 Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender 1 Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board for 2 the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management Board 3 Act including, but not limited to, sex offender evaluation, 4 treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. Funding received 5 from private sources is to be expended in accordance with the 6 terms and conditions placed upon the funding.

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ARTICLE 3

8 Section 1. The sum of \$788,500, or so much thereof as may 9 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Corrections 10 from the General Revenue Fund for a grant to the Illinois 11 Sentencing Policy Advisory Council.
