# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

# 5 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Section 5. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Working Capital Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Transportation for the purpose of making loans to disadvantaged business enterprises certified by IDOT for participation on IDOT-procured construction and construction-related projects under the provisions of the Disadvantaged Business Revolving Loan Program pursuant to Section 610 of the Department of Transportation Law.

Section 10. The sum of \$37,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for Transportation Enhancement, Congestion Mitigation, Air Quality, High Priority and Scenic By-way Projects not eligible for inclusion in the Highway Improvement Program Appropriation provided expenditures do not

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- 1 exceed funds made available by the federal government.
- 2 Expenditures for this purpose may be made by the Department of
- 3 Transportation without regard to the fiscal year in which the
- 4 service was rendered or cost incurred.

#### 5 PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS

Section 15. The sum of \$16,660,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for Permanent Improvements to Illinois Department of Transportation facilities, including but not limited to the purchase of land, construction, repair, alterations and improvements to maintenance and facilities, district and central headquarters facilities, storage facilities, grounds, parking areas and facilities, fencing and underground drainage, including plans, specifications, utilities and fixed equipment installed and all costs and charges incident to the completion thereof at various locations.

Section 45. The sum of \$18,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for any costs associated with the procurement of public private partnership agreements.

Section 50. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as

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- 1 may be necessary, is appropriated from Road Fund to the
- 2 Department of Transportation for all costs associated with the
- 3 procurement of agreements that enable managed lanes to be
- 4 developed, financed, constructed, managed, or operated in an
- 5 entrepreneurial and business-like manner.

#### 6 GRADE CROSSING PROTECTION

Section 55. The sum of \$39,000,000 or so much thereof as
may be necessary, is appropriated from the Grade Crossing

at places where a public highway crosses a railroad at grade,
