1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

5 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Section 5. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Working Capital Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Transportation for the purpose of making loans to disadvantaged business enterprises certified by IDOT for participation on IDOT-procured construction and construction-related projects under the provisions of the Disadvantaged Business Revolving Loan Program pursuant to Section 610 of the Department of Transportation Law.

Section 10. The sum of \$37,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for Transportation Enhancement, Congestion Mitigation, Air Quality, High Priority and Scenic By-way Projects not eligible for inclusion in the Highway Improvement Program Appropriation provided expenditures do not exceed funds made available by the federal government.

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- 1 Expenditures for this purpose may be made by the Department of
- 2 Transportation without regard to the fiscal year in which the
- 3 service was rendered or cost incurred.

4 PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS

Section 15. The sum of \$16,660,000, or so much thereof as 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the 6 7 Department of Transportation for Permanent Improvements to 8 Illinois Department of Transportation facilities, including but 9 not limited to the purchase of land, construction, repair, 10 alterations and improvements to maintenance and traffic facilities, district and central headquarters facilities, 11 12 storage facilities, grounds, parking areas and facilities, drainage, 13 underground fencing and including specifications, utilities and fixed equipment installed and all 14 15 costs and charges incident to the completion thereof at various 16 locations.

Section 20. The following named amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for the objects and purposes hereinafter named. Expenditures for these purposes may be made by the Department of Transportation without regard to the

CONSTRUCTION AND LAND ACQUISITION

Section 30. The sum of \$1,191,479,000, or so much thereof 5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the 6 Department of Transportation for preliminary engineering and 7 8 construction engineering and contract costs of construction, 9 including reconstruction, extension and improvement of state 10 highways, arterial highways, roads, access areas, roadside shelters, rest areas, fringe parking facilities and sanitary 11 12 facilities, and such other purposes as provided by the 13 "Illinois Highway Code"; for purposes allowed or required by Title 23 of the U.S. Code; for bikeways as provided by Public 14 15 Act 78-850; for land acquisition and signboard removal and 16 control, junkyard removal and control and preservation of 17 natural beauty; and for capital improvements which directly 18 facilitate an effective vehicle weight enforcement program, 19 such as scales (fixed and portable), scale pits and scale 20 installations and scale houses, in accordance with applicable 21 laws and regulations for the state portion of the Road 22 Improvement Program as approximated below: 23 District 1, Schaumburg273,157,100 District 2, Dixon133,786,200

The sum of \$668,330,100, or so much thereof 12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the 13 Department of Transportation for preliminary engineering and construction engineering and contract costs of construction, 14 15 including reconstruction, extension and improvement of state 16 and local roads and bridges, fringe parking facilities and such 17 other purposes as provided by the "Illinois Highway Code"; for purposes allowed or required by Title 23 of the U.S. Code; for 18 bikeways as provided by Public Act 78-850; for land acquisition 19 20 and signboard removal and control and preservation of natural beauty, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations for 21 22 the local portion of the Road Improvement Program 23 approximated below:

The sum of \$637,468,800, or so much thereof 12 be necessary, is appropriated from the 13 Construction Account Fund to the Department of Transportation for preliminary engineering and construction engineering and 14 15 contract costs of construction, including reconstruction, 16 extension and improvement of State highways, arterial highways, 17 roads, access areas, roadside shelters, rest areas fringe parking facilities and sanitary facilities and such other 18 19 purposes as provided by the "Illinois Highway Code"; for 20 purposes allowed or required by Title 23 of the U.S. Code; for 21 bikeways as provided by Public Act 78-850; for land acquisition and signboard removal and control, junkyard removal and control 22 23 preservation of natural beauty; and for capital 24 improvements which directly facilitate an effective vehicle

15 Section 45. The sum of \$18,000,000, or so much thereof as 16 may be necessary, is appropriated from Road Fund to the 17 Department of Transportation for any costs associated with the procurement of public private partnership agreements. 18

Section 50. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for all costs associated with the procurement of agreements that enable managed lanes to be developed, financed, constructed, managed, or operated in an

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1 entrepreneurial and business-like manner.

2 GRADE CROSSING PROTECTION

Section 55. The sum of \$39,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Grade Crossing Protection Fund to the Department of Transportation for the installation of grade crossing protection or grade separations at places where a public highway crosses a railroad at grade, as ordered by the Illinois Commerce Commission, as provided by law.

10 AERONAUTICS

Section 60. The sum of \$13,484,800, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for such purposes as are described in Sections 31 and 34 of the Illinois Aeronautics Act, as amended and to leverage federal funds for the airport improvement program.

17 Section 65. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof 18 necessary, appropriated from may be is the as 19 Federal/State/Local Airport Fund to the Department 20 Transportation for funding airport improvement projects, 21 including reimbursements and/or refunds, undertaken pursuant 22 to pertinent state or federal laws.

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Section 70. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the South Suburban Airport Improvement Fund to the Department of Transportation for costs associated with the development, financing, and operation of the South Suburban Airport as authorized under the

INTERMODAL PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

Public-Private Agreements for the South Suburban Airport Act.

Section 75. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Downstate Transit Improvement Fund to the Department of Transportation for making competitive capital grants pursuant to Section 2-15 of the Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-15).

Section 80. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Mass Transit Trust Fund to the Department of Transportation for the federal share of capital, operating, consultant services, and technical assistance grants, as well as state administration and interagency agreements, provided such amounts shall not exceed funds to be made available from the Federal Government.

Section 85. The sum of \$1,700,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Rail Freight

- 2 funding the State Rail Freight Loan Repayment Program created
- 3 by Section 49.25g-1 of the Civil Administrative Code of

- 5 Section 90. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may
- 6 be necessary, is appropriated from the Rail Freight Loan
- 7 Repayment Fund to the Department of Transportation for the Rail
- 8 Freight Service Assistance Program, created by Section 49.25a
- 9 through 49.25g-1 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois.
- Section 95. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof as
- 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the
- 12 Department of Transportation for high speed rail track
- 13 maintenance.
- Section 100. The sum of \$114,291,800, or so much thereof
- as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the
- 16 Department of Transportation for capital, operating, consultant
- 17 services, and technical assistance grants, as well as state
- 18 administration and interagency agreements, for the Illinois
- 19 mass transit systems.
- Section 105. The sum of \$2,371,200, or so much thereof as
- 21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the
