A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
7 hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the ordinary and
8 contingent expenses of the Illinois Criminal Justice
9 Information Authority:

6 Section 35. The amount of \$16,342,700, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
9 administrative costs, awards and grants for Community-Based
10 Violence Prevention Programs, including prior years' costs.

11 Section 40. The amount of \$6,694,300, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
14 grants and administrative expenses related to Metropolitan
15 Family Services' support of street intervention programming.

16 Section 45. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
18 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
19 a grant to the Safer Foundation for violence prevention
20 services and any associated administrative expenses.

21 Section 50. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
2 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
3 grants to local law enforcement agencies, other first
4 responders, and co-responders for training and other allowable
5 costs pursuant to the Community Partnership for Deflection and
6 Addiction Treatment Act and any associated administrative
7 expenses.

8 Section 55. The amount of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
10 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
11 costs associated with implementation of the Pretrial Fairness
12 Act.

13 Section 60. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
15 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
16 grants and administrative expenses associated with statewide
17 deferred prosecution funding programs.

18 Section 65. The amount of \$350,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
20 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
21 grants and administrative expenses associated with the Ad Hoc
22 Statewide Domestic Violence Fatality Review Committee.

1 Section 70. The amount of \$545,100, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
3 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
4 grants and administrative expenses associated with the
5 Institute 2 Innovate.

6 Section 75. The amount of \$3,176,200, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
9 grants and administrative expenses related to trauma recovery
10 centers.

11 Section 80. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
14 grants to local law enforcement agencies related to less lethal
15 devices, less lethal device training, and other allowable costs
16 associated with less lethal weapon alternatives, and any
17 associated administrative expenses.

18 Section 83. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
20 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
21 grants to local law enforcement agencies, other first

1 responders, and co-responders for the co-responder pilot
2 program, and any associated administrative expenses.

3 Section 85. The amount of \$18,500,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
5 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for
6 administrative costs and grants to the following named
7 entities. The combined cost of grants and administrative
8 expenses associated with each grant shall equal the approximate
9 amounts below.

 16 and all related costs.

17 Section 95. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue fund
 19 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for a
 20 grant to the Center for Housing and Health to be used for
 21 investment in the Flexible Housing Pool associated with
 22 transitional and permanent supportive housing for returning
 23 residents and any associated administrative expenses.

1 Section 100. The sum of \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as
 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
 3 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for cost
 4 associated with the InfoNet System.

5 ARTICLE 2
