1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1215

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 1215, by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "ARTICLE 1

5 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

6 Section 5. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
8 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
9 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
10 located in Williamson County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
11 generate electricity for rural Southern Illinois communities
12 for the purposes specified in the Illinois Coal and Energy
13 Development Bond Act and Section 8.1 of the Energy
14 Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.

1 Section 10. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
3 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
4 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
5 located in Sangamon County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
6 generate electricity for the purposes specified in the
7 Illinois Coal and Energy and Development Bond Act and Section
8 8.1 of the Energy and Conservation and Coal Development Bond
9 Act.

10 Section 15. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
12 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
13 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
14 located in Washington County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
15 generate electricity for the purposes specified in the
16 Illinois Coal and Energy Development Bond Act and Section 8.1
17 of the Energy and Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.

18 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
19 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
20 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
21 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
22 Governor.

1 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

2 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

3 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
5 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
6 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
7 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
8 boat access areas.

9 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
11 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
12 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
13 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
14 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
15 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
16 areas.

17 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
18 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
19 \$3,175,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
20 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
21 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
22 construction and development of facilities for transient,
23 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such

1 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
2 Grant Program.

3 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
4 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
5 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
6 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
7 Agency's operational expenses.

8 Section 30. The following named sums, new appropriations,
9 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
10 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
11 the Department of Natural Resources:

12 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

13 For multiple use facilities and programs
14 for boating purposes provided by the
15 Department of Natural Resources,
16 Including construction and development,
17 all costs for supplies, materials,
18 labor, land acquisition, services, studies
19 and all other expenses required to comply

21 Payable from State Parks Fund:

22 For multiple use facilities and programs
23 for park and trail purposes provided by

1 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 2 construction and development, all costs
 3 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 4 acquisition, services, studies, and
 5 all other expenses required to comply with
 6 the intent of this appropriation150,000

7 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition
 10 and development, including grants, for the implementation of
 11 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 12 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 13 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

14 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including
 15 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 16 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 17 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 18 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 19 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 20 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 21 the Clean Vessel Act.

22 Section 50. The following named sums, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 2 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 3 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 4 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 5 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 6 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 7 refunds and the purposes stated:

8 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

10 Section 55. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
 12 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,

 14 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public
 15 Act 90-0260.

16 Section 60. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
 17 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 18 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
 19 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
 20 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
 21 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
 22 response.

1 Section 65. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
 2 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 3 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
 4 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
 5 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
 6 or hereafter amended.

7 Section 70. The following named sums, new appropriations,
 8 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
 9 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
 10 the Department of Natural Resources:

18 Section 75. The sum of \$11,000,000, or so much thereof as
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space Lands
 20 Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of Natural
 21 Resources for expenses connected with and to make grants to
 22 local governments and to distressed communities as provided
 23 in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development Act".

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 2 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
 3 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
 4 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress

1 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
 2 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
 3 including administration, enforcement, planning and
 4 implementation of this Act.

5 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 6 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 7 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 8 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 9 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 10 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 11 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 12 refunds and the purposes stated:

17 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 19 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 20 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 21 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 22 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
 23 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

1 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
3 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
4 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
5 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
6 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
7 amended.

8 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
9 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
10 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
11 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
12 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

13 Section 130. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
15 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
16 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
17 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
18 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
19 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the
20 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

21 Section 135. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
3 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
4 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
5 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the
6 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as
7 amended.

8 Section 140. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
10 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
11 for the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
12 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

13 Section 145. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
15 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
16 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
17 development of bike paths.

18 Section 150. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
20 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
21 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths
22 and all other related expenses connected with the

1 acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths.

2 Section 155. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
4 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
5 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses
6 of recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized
7 under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of
8 1991, provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made
9 available for such purposes from state or federal sources.

10 Section 160. The following named sum, new appropriation,
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the object and
12 purpose hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Department
13 of Natural Resources:

18 Section 175. No contract shall be entered into or
 19 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from
 20 appropriations herein made in Sections 100, 175, 180, 195,
 21 200 and 205 of this Article until after the purpose and
 22 amount of such expenditure has been approved in writing by
 23 the Governor.

1 Section 15. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
3 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for a green
4 infrastructure financial assistance program to address water
5 quality issues.

6 Section 20. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
8 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for a small
9 community water supply financial assistance program to
10 address compliance problems.

11 Section 25. No contract shall be entered into or
12 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
13 in Section 1 of this Article until after the purposes and
14 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

2 improvements authorized under Section 2705-305 of the
3 Department of Transportation Law (20 ILCS 2705/2705-305) such
4 as parking lot infrastructure upgrades, pedestrian access
5 improvements, ingress and egress infrastructure and
6 construction of a pedestrian overpass at the Southwestern
7 Illinois College metrolink station.
