1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 0.5

5 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
11 and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed
12 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by
13 the State.

14 ARTICLE 0.8

15 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

16 Section 1. Appropriations to the Department of Natural
17 Resources including those in Article 4 and Articles 13 through
18 15 may be used for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2017.

19 ARTICLE 1

20 SECRETARY OF STATE

21 Section 1. The sum of \$10,110,140, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public
3 libraries for permanent improvements.

4 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
5 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
6 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
7 been approved in writing by the Governor.

8 Total, this Article \$10,110,140

9 ARTICLE 2

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
13 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the Port
15 Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-
16 11.

17 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
19 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a
20 grant to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
21 improvements.

1 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
3 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
4 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

5 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

9 Section 20. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for capital
13 improvements, acquisition and development of land and
14 structures, including previously incurred costs.

15 Section 25. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 a grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

19 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond

1 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
3 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

4 Section 35. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
8 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
9 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
10 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
11 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
12 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

13 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
17 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
18 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, and
19 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
20 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
21 agencies for such purposes.

22 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
4 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
5 purposes.

6 Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
10 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
11 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
12 such purposes.

13 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
17 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
18 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
19 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
20 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
21 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

22 Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
4 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
5 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
6 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
7 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
8 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

9 Section 65. The sum of \$1,195,268, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 a grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts.

13 Section 70. The sum of \$398,974,111, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants awarded under the Urban Weatherization
17 Initiative Act.

18 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
22 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network

1 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
2 distance learning, and public safety.

3 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
5 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
7 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
8 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
9 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
10 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
11 machinery and equipment.

12 Section 85. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
14 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 the requirements necessary to leverage capital-related American
16 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds of equal or greater
17 value in order to make Illinois or Illinois applicants more
18 competitive and/or for costs associated with bondable
19 improvements to match federal, local, private or other funds.

20 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
21 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a

1 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
2 hospital renovation and equipment.

3 Section 95. The sum of \$2,978,788, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
5 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

7 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the
11 projects hereinafter enumerated:

4 Section 105. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
 7 grants for acquisition, construction, renovation and equipping
 8 new charter schools, to a silver certification from the United
 9 States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and
 10 Environmental Design Green Building Rating System as
 11 approximated below:

12 For Instituto Del Progreso Latino9,000,000

13 Section 110. The sum of \$ 2,606,686, or so much thereof
 14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
 15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 16 Opportunity for provide grants, loans, and other investments
 17 to emerging technology enterprises to support and encourage:
 18 (i) commercialization of technology based products and
 19 services; (ii) technology transfer projects involving the
 20 promotion of new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research
 21 and development projects to respond to unique, advanced
 22 technology projects and which foster the development of
 23 Illinois' economy through the advancement of the State's

1 economic, scientific, and technological assets.

2 Section 115. The sum of \$5,938,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 provide grants for land acquisition, infrastructure, equipment
6 and other permissible capital expenditures to businesses that
7 will encourage new investment and the creation or retention of
8 jobs in economically depressed areas of the State.

9 Section 120. The sum of \$3,301,210, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 a grant to the University of Chicago Medical Center for costs
13 associated with Provident Hospital.

14 Section 125. The sum of \$2,084,459, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
16 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 a grant to Community Health and Emergency Services, Inc. for
18 the construction of a hospital wing at the Cairo Megaclinic.

19 Section 130. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 a grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital System for costs
2 associated with medical equipment and capital improvements at
3 Provident Hospital.

4 Section 135. This Article is not subject to limitations
5 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
6 similar limitation.

7 Section 140. No contract shall be entered into or
8 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
9 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
10 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
11 Governor.

12 Total, this Article \$669,775,553

13 ARTICLE 3

14 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

15 Section 1. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
18 grant to Erie Neighborhood House.

19 Section 5. The sum of \$338,579, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
2 grant to Family Guidance Center.

3 Section 10. This Article is not subject to limitations
4 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
5 similar limitation.

6 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
7 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
8 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
9 been approved in writing by the Governor.

10 Total, this Article \$1,088,579

11 ARTICLE 4

12 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

13 Section 1. The sum of \$6,690,383, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
15 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
16 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
17 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
18 boat access areas.

19 Section 5. The sum of \$366,743, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund

1 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
2 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
3 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
4 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
5 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
6 areas.

7 Section 10. To the extent federal funds including
8 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
9 \$4,770,932 is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to
10 the Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
11 construction and development of facilities for transient, non-
12 trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
13 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure Grant
14 Program.

15 Section 15. The following named sum, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, respectively is appropriated to the
17 Department of Natural Resources for the objects and purposes
18 set forth below:

19 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:
20 For multiple use facilities and programs
21 for boating purposes provided by the
22 Department of Natural Resources including
23 construction and development, all costs

1 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 2 acquisition, services, studies and all
 3 other expenses required to comply with

5 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 6 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 7 Natural Resources for the objects and purposes set forth below:

 11 by the Department of Natural Resources,
 12 including construction and development, all
 13 costs for supplies, materials, labor,

17 Section 25. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 18 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of

 7 purposes provided by the
 8 Department of Natural Resources, including
 9 construction and development, all costs
 10 for supplies, materials, labor, land

14 Section 30. To the extent federal funds including
 15 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 16 \$1,251,995, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 17 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department
 18 of Natural Resources for construction and renovation of waste
 19 reception facilities for recreational boaters, including grants
 20 for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act.

21 Section 35. The sum of \$1,808,144, or so much thereof as
 22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
 23 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants to local

1 governments for the acquisition, financing, architectural
2 planning, development, alteration, installation, and
3 construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
4 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
5 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
6 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

7 Section 40. The sum of \$12,785,984, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for planning,
10 design and construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat
11 restoration and associated development in cooperation with the
12 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

13 Section 45. The sum of \$853,104, or so much thereof as may
14 be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund
15 to the Department of Natural Resources for planning, design and
16 construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat restoration
17 and associated development in cooperation with the U.S. Army
18 Corps of Engineers.

19 Section 50. The sum of \$36,712, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund
21 to the Department of Natural Resources for planning, design and
22 construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat restoration

1 and associated development in cooperation with the U.S. Army
2 Corps of Engineers.

3 Section 55. The sum of \$9,719,699, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
5 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the Open Land
6 Trust Program.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$4,501,300, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for upgrades to
10 lodges, camps and campsites, including but not limited to
11 previously incurred costs.

12 Section 65. The sum of \$32,200,673, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
14 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
15 construction and maintenance of State owned, leased, and
16 managed sites.

17 Section 70. The sum of \$22,758,021, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
19 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the Illinois
20 Open Land Trust Program as defined by the Illinois Open Land
21 Trust Act as authorized by subsection (m) of Section 3 of the

1 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
2 such purposes.

3 Section 75. The sum of \$246,149, or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
5 Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the conservation
6 of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the provisions of
7 Section 1.32 of the Wildlife Code, as now or hereafter amended.

8 Section 80. The following named sum, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
10 Natural Resources for the objects and purposes set forth below:
11 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

12 For the acquisition, preservation and
13 stewardship of natural areas,
14 including habitats for endangered and
15 threatened species, high quality natural
16 communities, wetlands and other areas
17 with unique or unusual natural
18 heritage qualities\$24,335,808

19 Section 85. The sum of \$2,545,229, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant Fund
21 to the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of
22 pheasants in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.31 of

1 the Wildlife Code, as now or hereafter amended.

2 Section 90. The sum of \$6,590,486, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
4 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
5 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
6 accordance with the provisions of the Habitat Endowment Act,
7 as now or hereafter amended.

8 Section 95. The sum of \$2,468,401, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
10 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
11 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
12 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor sports
13 in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of Sportsmen
14 Series license plates.

15 Section 100. The sum of \$2,204,971, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway Vehicle
17 Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants
18 to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations,
19 and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-
20 highway vehicle trails and parks as provided for in the
21 Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, including administration,
22 enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act.

1 Section 105. The sum of \$3,142,458, or so much thereof as
 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
 3 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Natural
 4 Resources for the acquisition, planning and development of land
 5 and long-term easements, and cost-shared natural resource
 6 management practices for ecosystem-based management of
 7 Illinois' natural resources, including grants for such
 8 purposes.

9 Section 110. The following named sum, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary, made either independently or in
 11 cooperation with the Federal Government or any agency thereof,
 12 any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the
 13 State, or with any public or private corporation, organization,
 14 or individual, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
 15 Resources for refunds and the purposes stated:

16 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire
 17 Protection Assistance Fund:

18 For Rural Community Fire

19 Protection Program768,042

20 Section 115. The sum of \$322,403, or so much thereof as
 21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 22 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for

1 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
2 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
3 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and areas
4 for the use of snowmobiles.

5 Section 120. The sum of \$3,086,010, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
7 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
8 the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
9 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

10 Section 125. The sum of \$12,324,058, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
12 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
13 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
14 development of bike paths.

15 Section 130. The following named sum, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
17 Natural Resources:

18 Payable from the Park and Conservation Fund:

19 For multiple use facilities and programs
20 for park and trail purposes provided by
21 the Department of Natural Resources, including
22 construction and development, all costs

1 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 2 acquisition, services, studies, and
 3 all other expenses required to comply with
 4 the intent of this appropriation5,767,533

5 Section 135. The sum of \$1,031,707, or so much thereof as
 6 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
 7 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
 8 facilities and programs for conservation purposes provided by
 9 the Department of Natural Resources, including repairing,
 10 maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing fixed
 11 assets, construction and development, marketing and promotions,
 12 all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition and
 13 its related costs, services, studies, and all other expenses
 14 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

15 Section 140. The sum of \$7,076,139, or so much thereof as
 16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
 17 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 18 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths and
 19 all other related expenses connected with the acquisition,
 20 development and maintenance of bike paths.

21 Section 145. The sum of \$509,741, or so much thereof as
 22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and

1 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
2 multiple use facilities and programs for conservation purposes
3 provided by the Department of Natural Resources, including
4 repairing, maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating,
5 replacing fixed assets, construction and development, marketing
6 and promotions, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
7 acquisition and its related costs, services, studies, and all
8 other expenses required to comply with the intent of this
9 appropriation.

10 Section 150. The sum of \$10,778,547, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
12 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
13 the development and maintenance of recreational trails and
14 trail-related projects authorized under the Intermodal Surface
15 Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991, provided such amount
16 shall not exceed funds to be made available for such purposes
17 from state or federal sources.

18 Section 155. The sum of \$634,758, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
