1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2378

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 2378, by
3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 5. The amount of \$30,843,200, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to meet its
9 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,
10 2013.

11 Section 10. In addition to other amounts appropriated,
12 the amount of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as may be
13 necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to

1 the Office of the Attorney General for operational expenses,
 2 awards, grants, and permanent improvements for the fiscal
 3 year ending June 30, 2013.

4 Section 15. The sum of \$1,300,000, or so much thereof as
 5 is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated
 6 to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law
 7 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

8 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 9 as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated from the
 10 Asbestos Abatement Fund to the Attorney General to meet the
 11 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Environmental
 12 Enforcement-Asbestos Litigation Division:

1 Section 25. The amount of \$7,750,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
3 General Court Ordered and Voluntary Compliance Payment
4 Projects Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for use,
5 subject to pertinent court order or agreement, in the
6 performance of any function pertaining to the exercise of the
7 duties of the Attorney General, including State law
8 enforcement and public education.

9 Section 30. The amount of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois
11 Charity Bureau Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to
12 enforce the provisions of the Solicitation for Charity Act
13 and to gather and disseminate information about charitable
14 trustees and organizations to the public.

15 Section 35. The amount of \$8,700,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
17 General Whistleblower Reward and Protection Fund to the
18 Office of the Attorney General for ordinary and contingent
19 expenses, including State law enforcement purposes.

20 Section 40. The amount of \$8,350,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney

1 General's State Projects and Court Ordered Distribution Fund
 2 to the Attorney General for payment of interagency
 3 agreements, for court-ordered distributions to third parties,
 4 and, subject to pertinent court order, for performance of any
 5 function pertaining to the exercise of the duties of the
 6 Attorney General, including State law enforcement and public
 7 education.

8 Section 45. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as
 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General's
 10 Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to be
 11 expended in accordance with the terms and conditions upon
 12 which those funds were received.

13 Section 50. The following named amounts, or so much
 14 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
 15 and purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the

13 Section 60. The amount of \$2,750,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
15 General Federal Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney
16 General for funding for federal grants.

17 Section 65. The amount of \$50,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Statewide Grand
19 Jury Prosecution Fund to the Office of the Attorney General
20 for expenses incurred in criminal prosecutions arising under
21 the Statewide Grand Jury Act.

1 Section 70. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the
3 Attorney General from the Domestic Violence Fund pursuant to
4 Public Act 95-711 for grants to public or private nonprofit
5 agencies for the purposes of facilitating or providing free
6 domestic violence legal advocacy, assistance, or services to
7 victims of domestic violence who are married or formerly
8 married or parties or former parties to a civil union related
9 to order of protection proceedings, or other proceedings for
10 civil remedies for domestic violence.

11 Section 75. The amount of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney
13 General Tobacco Fund to the Office of the Attorney General
14 for the oversight, enforcement, and implementation of the
15 Master Settlement Agreement entered in the case of People of
16 the State of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court
17 of Cook County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and
18 enforcement of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act,
19 for the handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other
20 law enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

21 Section 80. The amount of \$50,000, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General
23 Sex Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the

1 Office of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT
 2 program and to alert and educate the public, victims, and
 3 witnesses of their rights under various victim notification
 4 laws and for training law enforcement agencies, State's
 5 Attorneys, and medical providers regarding their legal duties
 6 concerning the prosecution and investigation of sex offenses.

21 ARTICLE 7

22 Section 5. The amount of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the

1 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
2 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section
3 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of
4 their respective houses throughout the year in connection
5 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in
6 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.
7 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of
8 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated
9 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

10 Section 10. Payments from the amounts appropriated in
11 Section 5 hereof shall be made only upon the delivery of a
12 voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller. The
13 voucher shall also be approved by the President of the Senate
14 or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the case
15 may be.

16 Section 15. The amount of \$20,603,400, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to
18 meet the ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate
19 legislative leadership and legislative staff assistants and
20 the House Majority and Minority leadership staff, general
21 staff and office operations. Of this amount, 25.7% is
22 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such
23 expenditures, 25.7% is appropriated to the Senate Minority

1 Leader for such expenditures and 24.8% is appropriated to the
2 Speaker of the House for such expenditures, and 23.8% is
3 appropriated to the House Minority Leader for such
4 expenditures.

5 Section 20. The amount of \$9,882,100, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
7 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
8 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of
9 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem
10 employees, special and standing committees, expenses incurred
11 in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this amount,
12 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for
13 such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the Speaker
14 of the House for such expenditures.

15 Section 25. The amount of \$309,200, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
17 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
18 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses,
19 also including the purchasing on contract as required by law
20 of printing, binding, printing paper, stationery and office
21 supplies. For the House, no part of which shall be expended
22 for expenses of purchasing, handling or distributing such
23 supplies and against which no indebtedness shall be incurred

1 without the written approval of the Speaker of the House of
2 Representatives. Of this amount, 69.277% is appropriated to
3 the President of the Senate for such expenditures and 30.723%
4 is appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such
5 expenditures.

6 Section 30. The amount of \$6,483,050, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
8 President of the Senate for the use of standing committees
9 for expert witnesses, technical services, consulting
10 assistance and other research assistance associated with
11 special studies and long range research projects which may be
12 requested by the standing committees and the Speaker of the
13 House of Representatives for Standing House Committees

11 grants to the Illinois Masonic Foundation for the Prevention
12 of Drug and Alcohol Abuse Among Children, Inc., a not-for-
13 profit corporation, for the purpose of providing Model
14 Student Assistance Programs in public and private schools in
15 Illinois.

16 Section 100. The amount of \$75,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
18 from the Illinois Pan Hellenic Trust Fund to provide grants
19 for charitable purposes sponsored by African-American
20 fraternities and sororities.

21 Section 105. The amount of \$35,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
2 from the Park District Youth Program Fund to provide grants
3 for the Illinois Association of Park Districts: After School
4 Programming.

5 Section 110. The amount of \$130,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of
7 State from the Illinois Route 66 Heritage Project Fund to
8 provide grants for the development of tourism, education,
9 preservation and promotion of Route 66.

10 Section 115. The sum of \$200,000, or so much of this
11 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Police
12 Memorial Committee Fund to the Office of the Secretary of
13 State for grants to the Police Memorial Committee for
14 maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial
15 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children of police
16 officers killed in the line of duty.

17 Section 120. The sum of \$140,000, or so much of this
18 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
19 Mammogram Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for
20 grants to the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer
21 research, education, screening, and treatment.

1 Section 125. The following amounts, or so much of these
 2 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
 3 to the Office of the Secretary of State for such purposes in
 4 Section 3-646 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5), for
 5 grants to the Regional Organ Bank of Illinois and to Mid-
 6 America Transplant Services for the purpose of promotion of
 7 organ and tissue donation awareness. These amounts are in
 8 addition to any amounts otherwise appropriated to the Office
 9 of the Secretary of State:

10 From Organ Donor Awareness Fund225,000

11 Section 130. The amount of \$10,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
 13 from the Chicago Police Memorial Foundation Fund for grants
 14 to the Chicago Police Memorial Foundation for maintenance of
 15 a memorial and park, holding an annual memorial
 16 commemoration, giving scholarships to children of police
 17 officers killed or catastrophically injured in the line of
 18 duty, providing financial assistance to police officers and
 19 their families when a police officer is killed or injured in
 20 the line of duty, and paying the insurance premiums for
 21 police officers who are terminally ill.

22 Section 135. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
 23 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of

1 State from the U.S. Marine Corps Scholarship Fund to provide
2 grants for scholarships for Higher Education.

3 Section 140. The amount of \$700,000, or so much of this
4 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SOS
5 Federal Projects Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State
6 for the payment of any operational expenses relating to the
7 cost incident to augmenting the Illinois Commercial Motor
8 Vehicle safety program by assuring and verifying the identity
9 of drivers prior to licensure, including CDL operators; for
10 improved security for Drivers Licenses and Personal
11 Identification Cards; and any other related program deemed
12 appropriate by the Office of the Secretary of State.

13 Section 145. The amount of \$1,291,100, or so much of this
14 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
15 the Secretary of State from the Securities Investors
16 Education Fund for any expenses used to promote public
17 awareness of the dangers of securities fraud.

18 Section 150. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this
19 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
20 the Secretary of State from the Secretary of State Evidence
21 Fund for the purchase of evidence, for the employment of
22 persons to obtain evidence, and for the payment for any goods

1 or services related to obtaining evidence.

2 Section 155. The amount of \$225,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Alternate Fuels
4 Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for the cost of
5 administering the Alternate Fuels Act.

6 Section 160. The amount of \$17,124,000, or so much of
7 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
8 Secretary of State Special Services Fund to the Office of the
9 Secretary of State for office automation and technology.

10 Section 165. The amount of \$15,561,600, or so much of
11 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
12 Motor Vehicle License Plate Fund to the Office of the
13 Secretary of State for the cost incident to providing new or
14 replacement plates for motor vehicles.

15 Section 170. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much of this
16 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
17 Secretary of State DUI Administration Fund to the Office of
18 Secretary of State for operation of the Department of
19 Administrative Hearings of the Office of Secretary of State
20 and for no other purpose.

1 Section 175. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Secretary of State
3 Police DUI Fund to the Secretary of State for the payments of
4 goods and services that will assist in the prevention of
5 alcohol-related criminal violence throughout the State.

6 Section 180. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
8 Secretary of State Police Services Fund to the Secretary of
9 State for purposes as indicated by the grantor or contractor
10 or, in the case of money bequeathed or granted for no
11 specific purpose, for any purpose as deemed appropriate by
12 the Director of Police, Secretary of State in administering
13 the responsibilities of the Secretary of State Department of
14 Police.

15 Section 185. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of this
16 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Office
17 of the Secretary of State Grant Fund to the Office of the
18 Secretary of State to be expended in accordance with the
19 terms and conditions upon which such funds were received.

20 Section 190. The amount of \$24,300, or so much of this
21 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
22 the Secretary of State from the State Library Fund to

1 increase the collection of books, records, and holdings; to
 2 hold public forums; to purchase equipment and resource
 3 materials for the State Library; and for the upkeep, repair,
 4 and maintenance of the State Library building and grounds.

5 Section 195. The following amount, or so much of this
 6 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
 7 the Secretary of State for any operations, alterations,
 8 rehabilitations, new construction, and maintenance of the
 9 interior and exterior of the various buildings and facilities
 10 under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of State to enhance
 11 security measures in the Capitol Complex:

12 From General Revenue Fund3,200,000

13 Section 200. The amount of \$8,800,000, or so much of
 14 that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
 15 Secretary of State Identification Security and Theft
 16 Prevention Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for all
 17 costs related to implementing identification security and
 18 theft prevention measures.

19 Section 205. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much of
 20 that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
 21 General Revenue Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for
 22 all costs related to implementing the printing of

1 constitutional amendments.

2 Section 210. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of this
3 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
4 Monitoring Device Driving Permit Administration Fee Fund to
5 the Office of the Secretary of State for all Secretary of
6 State costs associated with administering Monitoring Device
7 Driving Permits per Public Act 95-0400.

8 Section 215. The sum of \$500,000, or so much of this
9 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Indigent
10 BAIID Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State to
11 reimburse ignition interlock device providers per Public Act
12 95-0400.

13 Section 220. The amount of \$50,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
15 from the Illinois Professional Golfers Association Junior
16 Golf Fund for grants to the Illinois Professional Golfers
17 Association Foundation to help Association members expose
18 Illinois youngsters to the game of golf.

19 Section 225. The amount of \$70,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
21 from the Agriculture in the Classroom Fund for grants to

1 support Agriculture in the Classroom programming for public
2 and private schools within Illinois.

3 Section 230. The amount of \$20,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of
5 State from the Boy Scout and Girl Scout Fund for grants to
6 the Illinois divisions of the Boy Scouts of America and the
7 Girl Scouts of the U.S.A.

8 Section 235. The amount of \$15,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of
10 State from the Support Our Troops Fund for grants to Illinois
11 Support Our Troops, Inc. for charitable assistance to the
12 troops and their families in accordance with its Articles of
13 Incorporation.

14 Section 240. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
16 from the Illinois EMS Memorial Scholarship and Training Fund
17 for grants to the EMS Memorial Scholarship and Training
18 Council for providing scholarships for graduate study,
19 undergraduate study, or both, to children and spouses of
20 emergency medical services (EMS) personnel killed in the
21 course of their employment and for grants for the training of
22 EMS personnel.

1 Section 245. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this
2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
3 the Secretary of State from the Rotary Club Fund for grants
4 for charitable purposes sponsored by the Rotary Club.

5 Section 250. The amount of \$10,000, or so much of this
6 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
7 the Secretary of State from the Ovarian Cancer Awareness Fund
8 for grants to the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, Inc. for
9 ovarian cancer research, education, screening, and treatment.

10 Section 255. The amount of \$3,000, or so much of this
11 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
12 the Secretary of State from the Sheet Metal Workers
13 International Association of Illinois Fund for grants for
14 charitable purposes sponsored by Illinois chapters of the
15 Sheet Metal Workers International Association.

16 Section 260. The amount of \$40,000, or so much of this
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
18 the Secretary of State from the Illinois Police Association
19 Fund for providing death benefits for the families of police
20 officers killed in the line of duty, and for providing
21 scholarships, for graduate study, undergraduate study, or

1 both, to children and spouses of police officers killed in
2 the line of duty.

3 Section 265. The amount of \$3,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
5 from the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Fund for
6 grants to the Teamsters Joint Council 25 Charitable Trust for
7 religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational
8 purposes.

9 Section 270. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
11 from the Octave Chanute Aerospace Heritage Fund for grants to
12 the Octave Chanute Aerospace Heritage Foundation of Illinois
13 for operational and program expenses of the Chanute Air
14 Museum.

15 Section 275. The amount of \$10,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
17 from the Autism Awareness Fund for grants to the Illinois
18 Department of Human Services for the purpose of grants for
19 research, education, and awareness regarding autism and
20 autism spectrum disorders.

21 Section 280. The amount of \$20,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
2 from the Share the Road Fund for grants to the League of
3 Illinois Bicyclists, a not for profit corporation, for
4 educational programs instructing bicyclists and motorists how
5 to legally and more safely share the roadways.

6 Section 285. The sum of \$700,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary is appropriated from the Professional Sports
8 Teams Education Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for
9 transfers to the Common School Fund.

10 Section 290. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of
12 State from the Family Responsibility Fund for all costs
13 associated with enforcement of the Family Financial
14 Responsibility Law.

15 ARTICLE 11

16 Section 5. In addition to other amounts appropriated,
17 the amount of \$233,947,100, or so much thereof as may be
18 necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
19 the Supreme Court for operational expenses, awards, grants,
20 and permanent improvements for the fiscal year ending June
21 30, 2013.

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Supreme Court
2 Historic Preservation Fund to the Supreme Court Historic
3 Preservation Commission for historic preservation purposes.

4 ARTICLE 13

5 Section 5. The amount of \$8,249,300, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund to the Office of the State Treasurer to meet its
8 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,
9 2013.

10 Section 10. The amount of \$145,700, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Treasurer
12 from the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of making
13 refunds of accrued interest on protested tax cases.

14 Section 15. The amount of \$9,343,930, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pensions
16 Fund to the Office of the State Treasurer to meet its
17 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,
18 2013.

19 Section 20. The amount of \$8,100,000, or so much of that
20 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State

1 Treasurer from the Bank Services Trust Fund for the purpose
2 of making payments to financial institutions for banking
3 services pursuant to the State Treasurer's Bank Services
4 Trust Fund Act.

5 Section 25. The amount of \$0, or so much of that amount
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Treasurer
7 from the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of making
8 refunds of overpayments of estate tax and accrued interest on
9 those overpayments, if any, and payment of certain statutory
10 costs of assessment.

11 Section 30. The amount of \$27,000,000, or so much of
12 that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State
13 Treasurer from the Transfer Tax Collection Distributive Fund
14 for the purpose of making payments to counties pursuant to
15 Section 13b of the Illinois Estate and Generation-Skipping
16 Transfer Tax Act.

17 Section 35. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of that
18 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State
19 Treasurer from the Matured Bond and Coupon Fund for payment
20 of matured bonds and interest coupons pursuant to Section 6u
21 of the State Finance Act.
