10 Section 20. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary, is appropriated from the Oil Spill Response Fund

17 amended, is reappropriated from the VW Settlement Environmental
18 Mitigation Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for all
19 costs, including administrative expenses, associated with
20 funding eligible mitigation actions that achieve reductions of
21 emissions in accordance with the Environmental Mitigation Trust
22 Agreement relating to the Partial Consent Decree between U.S.
23 Department of Justice, Volkswagen AG and other settling
24 defendants.
