## **HOUSE MOTION**

## MR. SPEAKER:

I move that House Bill 1072 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 5, between lines 29 and 30, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2	"SECTION 5. IC 20-24-13-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.244-2017,
3	SECTION 30, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 3. (a) Subject to section 7 of this chapter, an
5	annual grant program is established to provide funding to a school for
6	the following:
7	(1) Capital improvements for the school, including the renovation
8	or expansion of a facility, or for debt or lease payments owed on
9	a facility, including advances from the common school fund under
10	IC 20-49-9.
11	(2) The purposes for which the school corporation's operations
12	fund may be used by a school corporation under IC 20-40-18.
13	(3) The purposes for which a technology grant from the Senator
14	David C. Ford educational technology fund may be used by a
15	school corporation under IC 20-20-13-6.
16	(b) The program shall be administered by the state board.
17	(c) The state board shall establish a written application and
18	procedure for providing grants under this chapter to a school described
19	in section 5 of this chapter.
20	SECTION 6. IC 20-24-13-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

2	1, 2022]: Sec. 7. (a) This section does not apply to an innovation
3	network school that receives a grant under this chapter.
4	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a charter school that
5	receives a grant under this chapter for a state fiscal year shall
6	distribute an amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the
7	grant to the school corporation within whose attendance area the
8	charter school is located.
9	(c) The distribution under subsection (b) is not required if the
10	percentage of the school corporation's students enrolled in a
l 1	special education program described in IC 20-43-7 is less than the
12	percentage of the charter school's students enrolled in a special
13	education program described in IC 20-43-7.".
