

SENATE MOTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I move that Engrossed House Bill 1418 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 13, between lines 27 and 28, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2	"SECTION 4. IC 5-28-4-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.237-2017,
3	SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 2. (a) The board is composed of the following
5	members, none of whom may be members of the general assembly:
6	(1) The governor.
7	(2) Eleven (11) individuals appointed by the governor, one (1) of
8	whom must be the owner of a small business with fifty (50) or
9	fewer employees.
10	(3) The members (if any) appointed by the governor under
11	subsection (c).
12	The individuals appointed under subdivision (2) and the individuals
13	appointed under subsection (c) must be employed in or retired from the
14	private or nonprofit sector or academia.
15	(b) When making appointments under subsection (a)(2), the
16	governor shall appoint the following:
17	(1) At least five (5) members belonging to the same political party
18	as the governor.
19	(2) At least three (3) members who belong to a major political
20	party (as defined in IC 3-5-2-30) other than the party of which the
21	governor is a member.
22	(c) In addition to the members appointed under subsection (a)(2),
23	the governor may appoint not more than three (3) additional members
24	to the board. If the governor appoints more than one (1) additional
25	member to the board under this subsection, at least one (1) of the
26	additional members must belong to a major political party (as defined

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in IC 3-5-2-30) other than the party of which the governor is a member.".

Page 16, delete lines 26 through 42, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 6. IC 5-28-17-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.130-2018, SECTION 17, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 6. (a) The corporation shall designate an employee to be a small business executive as the small business ombudsman.

- (b) The small business ombudsman reports directly to the secretary of commerce.
- **(c)** The small business ombudsman shall carry out the following duties:
 - (1) Build relationships with regional and local economic development directors.
 - (2) Build relationships with local elected officials throughout the state.
 - (3) Champion small business development throughout the state by assisting small businesses in connecting with the corporation's small business start up programs.
 - (4) Operate as a liaison for regional and local economic directors, local elected officials, and corporation small business programs.
 - (1) (5) Work with state agencies to permit increased enforcement flexibility and the ability to grant common sense exemptions for first time offenders of state rules and policies, including, notwithstanding any other law, policies for the compromise of interest and penalties related to a listed tax (as defined in IC 6-8.1-1-1) and other taxes and fees collected or administered by a state agency.
 - (2) (6) Work with state agencies to seek ways to consolidate forms and eliminate the duplication of paperwork, harmonize data, and coordinate due dates.
 - (3) (7) Coordinate with OMB (as defined in IC 4-3-22-3) to perform cost benefit analyses.
 - (4) (8) Work with state agencies to monitor any outdated, ineffective, or overly burdensome information requests from state agencies to small businesses.
 - (5) (9) Carry out the duties specified under IC 4-22-2-28 and IC 4-22-2.1 to review proposed rules and participate in rulemaking actions that affect small businesses.
 - (6) (10) Coordinate with the ombudsman designated under IC 13-28-3-2 and the office of voluntary compliance established by IC 13-28-1-1 to coordinate the provision of services required under IC 4-22-2-28.1 and IC 13-28-3.
- 46 (7) (11) Prepare written and electronic information for periodic

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1	distribution to small businesses describing the small business
2	services provided by coordinators (as defined in
3	IC 4-22-2-28.1(b)) and work with the office of technology
4	established by IC 4-13.1-2-1 to place information concerning the
5	availability of these services on state Internet web sites that the
6	small business ombudsman or a state agency determines are most
7	likely to be visited by small business owners and managers.
8	(8) (12) Assist in training agency coordinators who will be
9	assigned to rules under IC 4-22-2-28.1(e).
10	(9) (13) Investigate and attempt to resolve any matter regarding
11	compliance by a small business with a law, rule, or policy
12	administered by a state agency, either as a party to a proceeding
13	or as a mediator.
14	State agencies shall cooperate with the small business ombudsman to
15	carry out the purpose of this section. The department of state revenue
16	and the department of workforce development shall establish a program
17	to distribute the information described in subdivision (7) to small
18	businesses that are required to file returns or information with these
19	state agencies.".
20	Page 17, delete lines 1 through 30.
21	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
