## **HOUSE MOTION**

## MR. SPEAKER:

I move that Engrossed Senate Bill 132 be amended to read as follows:

1 Page 26, between lines 17 and 18, begin a new paragraph and insert: 2 "SECTION 19. IC 25-26-13-31.2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.56-2023, 3 SECTION 239, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS 4 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 31.2. (a) A pharmacist may 5 administer an immunization to an individual under a drug order or 6 prescription. 7 (b) Subject to subsection (c), a pharmacist may administer 8 immunizations for the following to a group of individuals under a drug 9 order, under a prescription, or according to a protocol approved by a 10 physician: 11 (1) Influenza. 12 (2) Shingles (herpes zoster). 13 (3) Pneumonia. 14 (4) Tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (whooping cough). 15 (5) Human papillomavirus (HPV) infection. 16 (6) Meningitis. 17 (7) Measles, mumps, and rubella. 18 (8) Varicella. 19 (9) Hepatitis A. 20 (10) Hepatitis B. 21 (11) Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib).

1	(12) Coronavirus disease.
2	(13) Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) infection.
3	(c) A pharmacist may administer an immunization under subsection
4	(b) if the following requirements are met:
5	(1) The physician specifies in the drug order, prescription, or
6	protocol the group of individuals to whom the immunization may
7	be administered.
8	(2) The physician who writes the drug order, prescription, or
9	protocol is licensed and actively practicing with a medical office
10	in Indiana and not employed by a pharmacy.
11	(3) The pharmacist who administers the immunization is
12	responsible for notifying, not later than fourteen (14) days after
13	the pharmacist administers the immunization, the physician who
14	authorized the immunization and the individual's primary care
15	physician that the individual received the immunization.
16	(4) If the physician uses a protocol, the protocol may apply only
17	to an individual or group of individuals who:
18	(A) except as provided in clause (B), are at least eleven (11)
19	years of age; or
20	(B) for the pneumonia immunization under subsection (b)(3)
21	are at least fifty (50) years of age.
22	(5) Before administering an immunization to an individua
23	according to a protocol approved by a physician, the pharmacis
24	must receive the consent of one (1) of the following:
25	(A) If the individual to whom the immunization is to be
26	administered is at least eleven (11) years of age but less than
27	eighteen (18) years of age, the parent or legal guardian of the
28	individual.
29	(B) If the individual to whom the immunization is to be
30	administered is at least eighteen (18) years of age but has a
31	legal guardian, the legal guardian of the individual.
32	(C) If the individual to whom the immunization is to be
33	administered is at least eighteen (18) years of age but has no
34	legal guardian, the individual.
35	A parent or legal guardian who is required to give consent under
36	this subdivision must be present at the time of immunization.
37	(d) If the Indiana department of health or the department of
38	homeland security determines that an emergency exists, subject to
39	IC 16-41-9-1.7(a)(2), a pharmacist may administer any immunization
40	in accordance with:
41	(1) the requirements of subsection (c)(1) through (c)(3); and
42	(2) any instructions in the emergency determination.
43	(e) A pharmacist or pharmacist's designee shall provide
44	immunization data to the immunization data registry (IC 16-38-5) in a
45	manner prescribed by the Indiana department of health unless:
46	(1) the individual receiving the immunization;

1	(2) the parent of the individual receiving the immunization, if the
2 3	individual receiving the immunization is less than eighteen (18)
	years of age; or
4	(3) the legal guardian of the individual receiving the
5	immunization, if a legal guardian has been appointed;
6	has completed and filed with the pharmacist or pharmacist's designee
7	a written immunization data exemption form, as provided in
8	IC 16-38-5-2.
9	(f) If an immunization is administered under a protocol, then the
10	name, license number, and contact information of the physician who
11	wrote the protocol must be posted in the location where the
12	immunization is administered. A copy of the protocol must be available
13	for inspection by the individual receiving the immunization.
14	(g) A pharmacist may administer an immunization that is provided
15	according to a standing order, prescription, or protocol issued under
16	this section or IC 16-19-4-11 by the state health commissioner or the
17	commissioner's designated public health authority who is a licensed
18	prescriber. If a pharmacist has received a protocol to administer an
19	immunization from a physician and that specific immunization is
20	covered by a standing order, prescription, or protocol issued by the
21	state health commissioner or the commissioner's designated public
22	health authority, the pharmacist must administer the immunization
23	according to the standing order, prescription, or protocol issued by the
24	state health commissioner or the commissioner's designated public
25	health authority.".
