

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

SB 215 # 2

DIGEST

Medicare supplement insurance. Deletes a provision under which an issuer would have been prohibited from denying, conditioning the issuance or effectiveness of, or discriminating in the pricing of a Medicare supplement policy or certificate because of the health status, claims experience, receipt of health care, or medical condition of an applicant under 65 years of age who was eligible for Medicare because of having a disability or end stage renal disease if: (1) the applicant applied for the policy or certificate not more than 60 days after the applicant's birthday; (2) the applicant already had a policy or certificate issued by a different issuer; and (3) the policy or certificate that the applicant was applying for was assigned the same plan letter as the policy or certificate that the applicant already had. Changes two dates in the conditions that an individual who is under 65 years of age and eligible for Medicare because of having a disability or end stage renal disease must meet to be protected against: (1) the denial of or the conditioning of the issuance or effectiveness of a Medicare supplement policy or certificate; (2) being charged more for a Medicare supplement policy or certificate than an individual 65 years of age is charged for the same Medicare supplement policy or certificate; and (3) the inclusion in a Medicare supplement policy or certificate of a waiting period or a preexisting condition limitation or exclusion.
