SENATE MOTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I move that Senate Bill 303 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 1, delete lines 1 through 17, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2	"SECTION 1. IC 16-44-2-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 3	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 8. (a) The inspections
4	and tests made by the state department under this chapter shall be
5	conducted in accordance with the methods outlined by the American
6	Society for Testing and Materials.
7	(b) The inspections and tests as to gasoline, gasohol, and kerosene
8	must reflect the following minimum specifications necessary for the
9	approval of the product:
10	(1) Gasoline or gasohol:
11	(A) Corrosion Test – Method ASTM D-130. A clean copper
12	strip may not show more than extremely slight discoloration
13	when submerged in the gasoline for three (3) hours at one
14	hundred twenty-two (122) degrees Fahrenheit.
15	(B) Distillation Range – Method ASTM D-86. When the
16	thermometer reads one hundred sixty-seven (167) degrees
17	Fahrenheit, not less than ten percent (10%) may be evaporated.
18	When the thermometer reads two hundred eighty-four (284)
19	degrees Fahrenheit, not less than fifty percent (50%) may be
20	evaporated. When the thermometer reads three hundred
21	ninety-two (392) degrees Fahrenheit, not less than ninety
22	percent (90%) may be evaporated. The residue may not exceed
23	two percent (2%). Percent evaporated is found by adding the
24	distillation loss to the amount collected in the receiver at each
25	specification temperature.
26	(C) Sulphur – Method ASTM D-1266 or D-2622. Sulphur may
27	not exceed twenty-five hundredths of one percent (0.25%) .

1	(D) Vapor Pressure – Method ASTM D-4953, ASTM D-5191,
2	or any other ASTM method to determine vapor pressure
3	approved by the United States Environmental Protection
4	Agency apply to this clause and clauses (E) through (G).
5	For gasoline, the Reid vapor pressure at one hundred (100)
6	degrees Fahrenheit may not exceed: the following:
7	(i) fifteen (15) pounds per square inch at the normal
8	barometric pressure at the point of delivery during
9	November, December, January, February, and March;
10	(ii) Fourteen (14) thirteen and five-tenths (13.5) pounds
11	per square inch during April, and October, and November ;
12	(iii) eleven and five-tenths (11.5) pounds per square inch
12	during September 16 through September 30; and
13	(iii) (iv) Twelve (12) nine (9) pounds per square inch during
15	May, June, July, August, and September 1 through
16	September 15;
10	as regulated by the United States Environmental
18	Protection Agency.
18	(E) Except as provided in clauses (F) and (G), for gasohol (a

20	blend of gasoline and alcohol), permitted under federal tax
21 22	requirements), (also known as gasoline-ethanol blend)
22	containing ethanol in a concentration of at least one $parametric (10/2)$ by values and not more than fifther parametric

38	(13) nine (9) pounds per square inch:
39	(i) during May 1 June, July, August, and through September
40	15 if measured at the terminal; and
41	(ii) during June 1 through September 15 if measured at
42	retail;
43	as regulated by the United States Environmental
44	Protection Agency.
45	(G) For gasohol (also known as gasoline-ethanol blend)
46	containing ethanol in a concentration of at least nine

1	percent (9%) by volume and not more than fifteen percent
2	(15%) by volume, the vapor pressure may not exceed ten
3	(10) pounds per square inch:
4	(i) during May 1 through September 15 if measured at
5	the terminal; and
6	(ii) during June 1 through September 15 if measured at
7	retail;
8	as regulated by the United States Environmental
9	Protection Agency.
10	(F) (H) After July 23, 2004, gasoline may not contain more
11	than one-half percent (0.5%) of MTBE by volume.
12	(2) Kerosene:
13	(A) Flash Test – Method ASTM D-56. Flash point may not be
14	lower than one hundred (100) degrees Fahrenheit.
15	(B) For the purpose of this chapter, any petroleum product
16	designated by name or reference as "kerosene" must meet the
17	federal specifications for kerosene VV-K-211d in effect on
18	March 1, 1977.
19	(c) Gasoline, gasohol, and kerosene products that do not comply
20	with the minimum specifications described in subsection (b) may not
21	be sold, offered for sale, or used in Indiana.
22	(d) Petroleum products other than gasoline, gasohol, or kerosene
23	shall be inspected and tested by the methods as are necessary to
24	determine the contents and characteristics of the product.
25	(e) Compliant conventional gasoline to which 326 IAC 13-3
26	applies is subject to vapor pressure requirements more stringent
27	than those set forth in subsection (b)(1)(D).
28	(f) Compliant conventional gasoline to which 326 IAC 13-3
29	applies and federal reformulated gasoline are subject to vapor
30	pressure requirements more stringent than those set forth in
31	subsection (b)(1)(E) through (b)(1)(G).".

33	Page 3, delete lines 1 through 16.
34	Page 3, line 20, delete "alcohol." and insert "ethanol that includes,
35	by volume, more than ten percent (10%) and not more than fifteen
36	percent (15%) ethanol.".
37	Page 3, line 22, delete "gasohol that" and insert "gasohol,".
38	Page 3, line 23, delete "contains more than ten percent (10%)
39	alcohol by volume,".
40	Page 3, line 24, delete "place on the fuel dispenser where the fuel
41	selection is made," and insert "fuel grade selection button,".
42	Page 3, line 26, delete "a" and insert "this".
43	Page 3, line 27, delete "setting forth the following text".
44	Page 3, line 28, delete ""Check" and insert ""Attention: E15.
45	Check".
46	Page 3, line 29, after "requirements."" insert "or a similar
