<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> The bill amends the law concerning public freshwater lakes to provide that a person who intends to construct a boathouse or any other permanent structure that has both walls and a roof over, along, or lakeward of the shoreline or water line of a public freshwater lake must obtain a construction permit from the local building department of the county or municipality in which the construction would take place and need not obtain a permit from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

The bill amends the law concerning construction in floodways to provide that a person who intends to construct a boathouse or any other permanent structure that has both walls and a roof at the edge of a body of water in a floodway must obtain a construction permit from the local building department of the county or municipality in which the construction would take place and need not obtain a permit from the DNR.

Effective Date: July 1, 2024.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill could minimally reduce workload for the DNR as certain permit applications previously reviewed by the DNR would now be filed only with local permitting authorities.

<u>Explanation of State Revenues:</u> The bill could minimally reduce revenue to the DNR's Land and Water Resources fund as certain permits would no longer be required. These permit applications have a one-time fee of \$200.

Explanation of Local Expenditures: Local permitting authorities would no longer need to obtain prior approval from the Natural Resources Commission to issue a permit for construction of a boathouse or

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permanent structure in a floodway or a public freshwater lake.

State Agencies Affected: Department of Natural Resources; Natural Resources Commission.
