<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> The bill provides that the Behavioral Health and Human Services Licensing Board (Board) may not impose disciplinary sanctions against a practitioner if the basis of the licensing complaint is retaliatory against the practitioner for testifying in a child custody proceeding, a child in need of services proceeding, or a termination of parent-child relationship proceeding.

Effective Date: July 1, 2025.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** This bill may result in time savings in procedural administrative processes when a disciplinary hearing occurs, and would likely have a minimal impact on Board workload.

Explanation of State Revenues: In the case that a license would have been revoked or suspended, a minor decline in license fee and penalty revenue would be averted if fewer licenses are suspended or revoked as a result of the bill. There were no revocations and a total of 1,355 licenses suspended by the Board at the close of FY 2024. Board license fees and penalties are deposited in the state General Fund.
